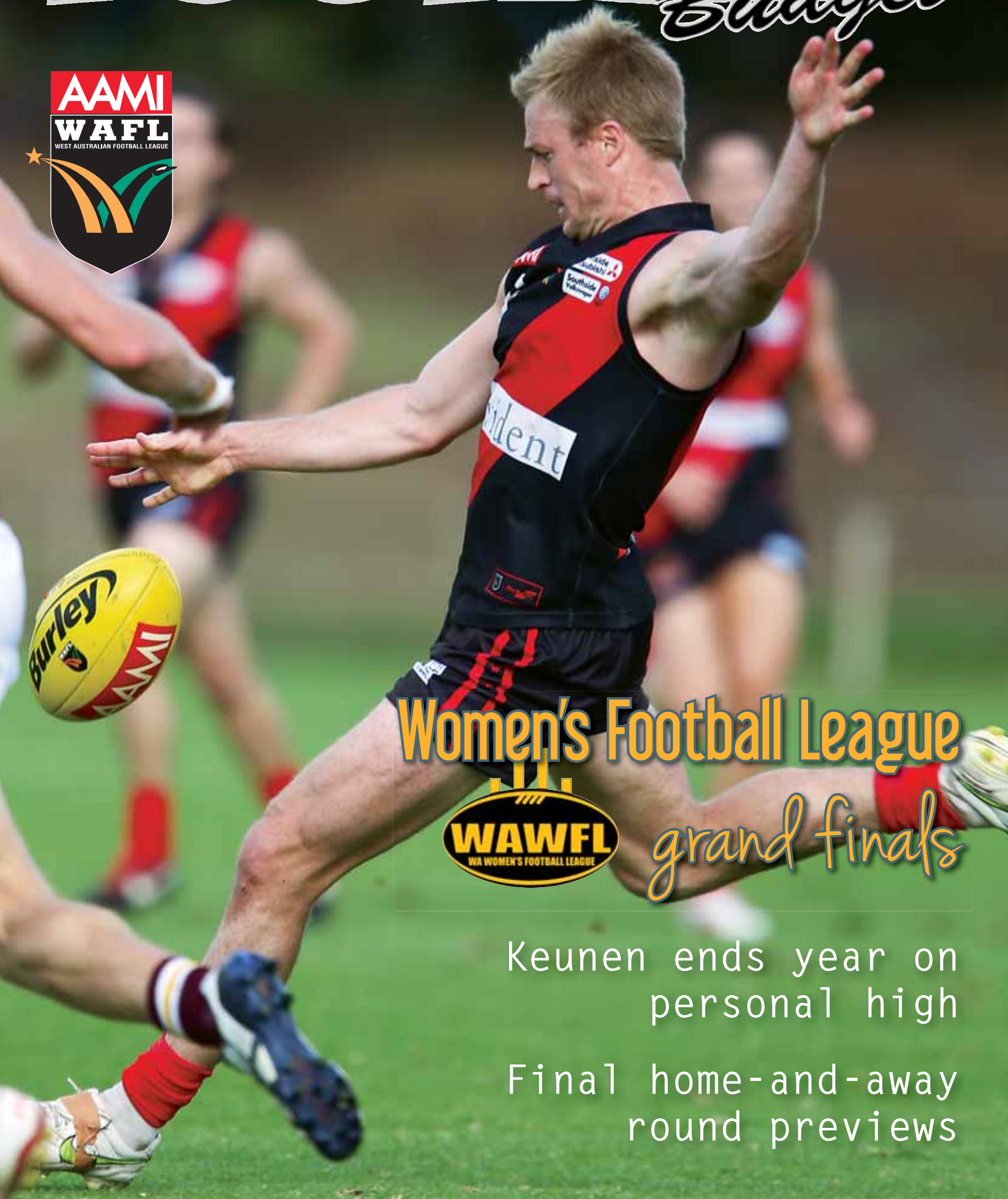

KEUNEN

ends year

on a personal high

FOR the second consecutive year West Perth ruckman Chris Keunen's season is ending on a high.

But this year it's all personal.

Keunen finished last season on a team high as he held the WAFL premiership cup aloft with his teammates.

But with the Falcons out of the race for this year's finals, season 2014 is ending on a personal, yet highly regarded note, as the 30-year-old from St Bernard's plays his 150th WAFL game and earns life membership at West Perth.

In 2013 the Victorian helped the Falcons beat arch-rivals East Perth to win their first premiership since 2003 - but this weekend ends the Falcons' season as they prepare to sit back and watch the Royals, Subiaco, East Fremantle and Swan Districts battle it out in this year's finals series.

"To play 150 games is something I rate right up there with playing in a premiership, but it would be nice to be playing finals," said Keunen who made his debut with the Falcons in Round 1, 2006 after being recruited by former Falcons coach Darren Harris.

"But that's football, there's always ups and downs. Apart from winning a best and fairest I think earning Life Membership is one of the greatest honours you can have at a club and it means I will always be a part of the Falcons.

"It wasn't something I thought I would achieve when we first moved over here, my aim was just to make my debut. But it is certainly something special."

Keunen has showed a great depth of loyalty to the Falcons as he waited in the wings behind the likes of Rob Warnock, Darren Atkinson, Mark Seaby and Mitch Andrews to become the team's No.1 ruckman.

Not only has he claimed that mantle, but he has also cemented his place as one of the premier ruckmen in the WAFL.

Heading into the final round of the home-and-away season he sits third in the hit out tally behind Seaby (who is now at Claremont and has 509 hit outs) and Peel's Jonathon Griffin (496). Keunen has 457, including a season-high of 41 in Round 9 when the Falcons beat the Lions.

He also made his State debut for WA, leading the ruck as they met the NEAFL for the first time and accounted for them by 85 points.

"Since winning the premiership last year I've certainly ticked a lot of boxes when it comes to footy achievements," said the father of one-year-old Xavier.

"Playing for WA is something I had been working towards for a few years and then getting a chance to play at Simmonds Stadium in the Foxtel Cup grand final was pretty special too.

"While we didn't play a great game I am a Geelong supporter so I loved getting an opportunity to play on their home ground."

Keunen has missed just two games this season, forced to sit out after an accidental poke in the eye from Royals ruckman Callum Sinclair in Round 10 which resulted in a bruised retina.

For two weeks he was unable to do any physical activity. He came back with a vengeance in the Foxtel Cup semi-final when West Perth thrashed Western Storm by 74 points and backed that up in Round 14 when he had 29 hit outs to help lead the Falcons to victory over South Fremantle.

He put the Falcons inability to play finals this year down to inconsistency.

"Not just from game to game, but sometimes from quarter to quarter," he said.

"But we've got a great depth of talent and guys like Aaron Black and Shane Nelson who are still young but now have a lot more experience and will be the kind of players who step up and lead this club for years to come."

WAFL finals eligibility

AFL players need to play five games or have a game as a travelling emergency added to their tally to make up that five - to qualify for WAFL finals.

However, as long as West Coast are alive in the AFL finals, Eagles players still qualify for WAFL finals.

Heading into the final round of the home-and-away season, here is a list of games all West Coast players have recorded for East Perth in 2014. Players who have played five or more reserves qualify for reserves and league finals, however players cannot drop back to play reserves finals if they have not played five or more games in the reserves.

 **BRIKMAKERS**
INSPIRING INNOVATION

During 2014, the Football Budget will again feature a section on WAFL memorabilia and invites you to write or email if you want more information about the football collectables you have tucked away at home.

It's not often the featured item in this column is quite so rare as it is this week.

Regular readers might recall that my favourite type of WAFL collectable – and the one that got me into collecting in the first place – is actually the Football Budget itself.

It started in 1921 as McMahon's WA Footballer, before being revamped in 1936 and re-named the Football Budget.

But details of any programs that existed before 1921 are scarce.

We know that a program called "The Goal Post" was printed at the Fremantle Printery for each round of the 1913 season. And I have also seen a score card for a game between Subiaco and West Perth in either 1914 or 1915. But that's about it.

So I was particularly excited when I recently discovered a program covering the 1919 WAFL grand final between East Perth and East Fremantle.

The eight-page program had clearly seen better days, having split along the spine. But I have never seen another one like it.

The amount of advertising for the Perth version of newspaper The Truth, which was published from 1903 to 1931, suggests that it was published by that newspaper.

The other hint is that the whole thing was written by a journalist known as "Kickero". The Truth in Melbourne had a journalist named Tom Kelynack, who wrote under that name.

The program itself carries a scorecard on the front, while the East Perth and East Fremantle team lists and leading goalkickers for WA, the VFL and VFA are on page two.

The various league ladders are on page four and there is a big wrap-up of football news from WA and Victoria on pages six and seven.

If anyone hears of any programs cover earlier games, I would like to know about

it. I would particularly like to see a program from the 1908 game between WA's carnival team and a "next best" side. Contemporary newspaper reports reveal one was printed.

While the 1919 grand final program was an item particularly close to my own heart, the next item is one that might appeal to those with an interest in old cars.

Some time ago, I was shown this Subiaco emblem that was apparently designed to be attached to the bumper bar of your car.

While I have seen a few WAFL collectables for the car – like the 1960s bobblehead figurines and 1980s number plate holders – I have never seen another one of these.

So, has anyone seen one for another club? And can anyone tell me anything about this Subiaco version? Where was it sold? And when?

Meanwhile, WAFL club membership badges have dominated the sales in the past week.

There were a few other items on offer, however. For instance, a 1985 WAFL centenary glass sold for just \$5 and an unusual Perth jumper sold for \$36.

A fantastic original cartoon drawn by Paul Rigby to celebrate Claremont's victory in the 1964 grand final failed to attract any bids at \$350, but later sold for an undisclosed price on the private market.

But the highlight was undoubtedly a couple of very rare early Claremont-Cottesloe badges. Claremont-Cottesloe was the original name of the Claremont Football Club and a badge from 1926 – which was the Tigers' first in the league – sold for the huge price of \$510.

Two bidders pushed the price up to that mark, but a third bidder left the action at \$350, indicating the price the next seller of a 1926 Claremont-Cottesloe badge might expect to receive.

A very attractive 1933 Claremont-Cottesloe badge sold for the still high, but more realistic, price of \$220, while a 1935 South Fremantle badge sold for \$110.

Meanwhile, some later badges were also on offer. A 1965 South Fremantle badge sold for \$60, a 1965 Subiaco



badge for \$30, a 1967 Subiaco badge for \$30, a 1980 East Perth badge for \$22.50, a 1987 and a 1988 South Fremantle badge for \$20 each, and a 2006 West Perth badge for \$20.

Finally, my thanks to the anonymous person who mailed some old posters to me at the Football Budget office. Most have now found a new home.

Titans looking for redemption

THE stage is set for the 2014 WA Women's Football League grand final this weekend at HBF Arena with Coastal Titans earning a shot at redemption against Swan Districts.

After finishing the season first on the ladder, the Titans lost the second semi-final to Swan Districts two weeks ago, forcing them into a preliminary final against a young Peel side.

The Titans were able to dispatch of the Thunderbirds, setting up a rematch of the 2013 grand final and a chance to win their seventh premiership flag.

To win that flag they are faced with the toughest test in the competition however, a Swan Districts team at the peak of its powers that easily accounted for the Titans just a fortnight ago.

The final was the fourth time the teams had met this year, with the ledger now split at two apiece.

The Titans won bragging rights at the start of the year when they defeated Swan Districts by one goal, but roles were reversed when the teams met again in Round 7 as Swan Districts came from five points down at half-time to steal a 3-point victory.

In their final encounter of the home-and-away season in Round 12 it was the Titans turn to come from behind, keeping Swan Districts goalless in the second half to overturn a 29-point half-time deficit to win by two points.

Remarkably, the 69-point win for Swan Districts in the first final was the largest margin between the two for the past two years and the first time the result has been greater than one goal since the Titans defeated the Swans in the 2013 second semi-final.

Now, the two teams are set for a decider of the highest order, with the Titans aiming to record a record seventh flag and Swan Districts looking to go back-to-back for the first time in the club's history.

Highlighting the dominance of the two clubs this season, Coastal Titans will again face Swan Districts in the 2014 Reserves grand final.

Like their League counterparts, the Titans and Swans finished first and second on the ladder at the end of the home-and-away season

having easily accounted for the majority of their opponents.

The grand final will be the fourth time the two sides have met this year with Titans taking the points in Round 1, as well as earning their place in the grand final with a victory in the second semi-final.

Swan Districts will be confident they can cause an upset and claim their second League-Reserves double in as many years though, having come from behind to beat the Titans by five points when the two teams met at Grenville Reserve back in July.

Both matches will be played this Sunday at HBF Arena, with bouncdown for the Reserves grand Final at 12pm followed by the League grand final at 2.30pm.

These games will follow the WAFC 'Rogers Cup' Youth Girls grand final between Peel and Claremont being played at 10am.

SOUTH FREMANTLE v PEEL

Teenager Mitchell Browne has made the most of his opportunity late in the season while Callum Collard showed how dangerous he can be with four goals against the league-leading East Perth in their previous match.

West Perth will be keen to give retiring veterans Dan Hunt and Anthony Tsalikis a good farewell.

This clash means little for the moment. But it could be a clue to the results of the WAFL finals.

While second meets third at Medibank Stadium, the outcome of the match can't alter the fixtures for the finals (although a big loss could push East Fremantle to fourth).

So Subiaco is in preparation for the second semi-final against East Perth while the Sharks have an eye towards their first semi-final with Swan Districts.

However, the Sharks and Lions could meet again next month so a few mind games will be played in this round 23 battle in case there is another clash.

Subiaco has to rebound from the shock loss to South Fremantle and will need Jason Bristow, Frank Stockley and Daniel Leishman to help Matthew Boland get more of the ball near the goals.

East Fremantle's defence was strong against Swans last week. Andrew Stephen and Stephen Dodd marshal the backline while Brock O'Brien has been a highly efficient avenue through the middle of the ground.

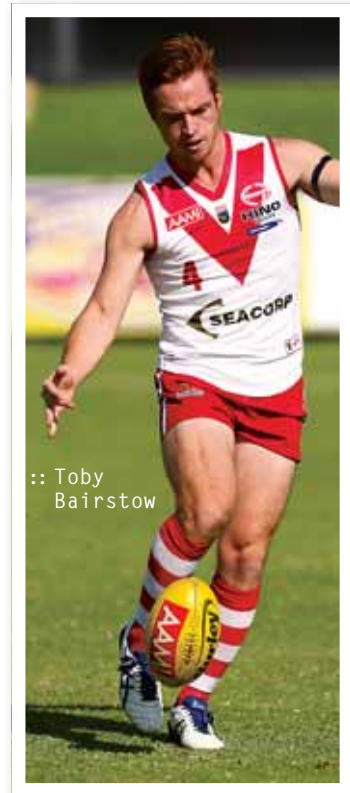
The Colts Coaches Award has gone in camera.

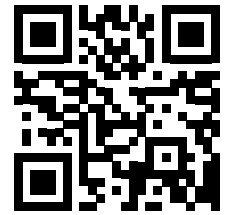
