# HISTORY BECKONS *for rumbling defender*

**DARREN Rumble is reminded every day of his incredible premiership success.**

After he won his first flag in 2004 he and teammate Caine Hayes found a tattoo shop and he had the Subiaco Football Club lion inked on his upper right arm and after each treasured premiership success he has added another year on.

The first four were inked locally, while last year's was memorably done at New York Ink while Rumble and his wife were on holidays

Come next Monday morning, he might be making yet another appointment to add the numbers 2015 to the artwork.

"I nearly fainted when I first had it done. The maroon looked like blood and I'm not really good with things like that," Rumble said.

"I've been really lucky to be at Subiaco in an era where finals and success are a standard expectation. In hindsight I wish I'd planned the tattoo better but I would never have thought I would be adding to it that many times.

This weekend will mark Rumble's 229th game. Among those he has played in six grand finals and won five – 2004, 2006, 2007, 2008 and 2014.

By playing in this week's grand final Rumble will equal the record of seven Lions grand finals set by dual Sandover medallist Allistair Pickett.

If the 31-year-old plays in yet another premiership he will become the first player in Subiaco club history to win six flags.

Since 1931 when the WAFL adopted the current Page-McIntyre finals format, Steve Marsh has played in the most premierships (seven with South Fremantle and East Fremantle). Bernie Naylor and Frank Treasure each played in six and Rumble

along with Jack Murray, Eric Eriksson, Charlie Tyson, Graham Farmer, Mal Atwell and Gerard Neesham have all played in five.

Lions vice captain Rumble has won more finals for Subiaco than any other Lion (13 wins and five losses). Opposing grand final coaches Jarrad Schofield played in 15 finals for the Lions and won 10, while Bill Monaghan played in 13 finals and won five.

"It's a pretty cool achievement so far, but I haven't thought about it too much because it's just been an amazing result from the environment I've been in at Subiaco," he humbly said.

Rumble's current coach, Jarrad Schofield, also played in those 2006, 2007 and 2008 premiership teams and will be looking for his second flag as a coach after leading the Lions to victory last year against East Perth.

Schofield played in one other WAFL grand final and given the tangled web that is football, another player in that losing 1995 grand final side was Bill Monaghan, his coaching rival this weekend.

Ironically, the team that beat Schofield and Monaghan's Lions in 1995 was West Perth. Monaghan played in two losing grand finals with the Lions but is also hoping to make it premiership number two as a coach having been at the helm when the Falcons beat East Perth in 2013.

Monaghan also played in a losing grand final in 1991 but his link to Subiaco remains strong having coached the reserves to premierships in 2003 and 2005 and he was an assistant to coach Peter German during the Lions' 2004 and 2006 premierships.

Subiaco has gone about their season with military precision and minimal fuss and Rumble said they were roaring to go after having the luxury of having two weekends to rest over the finals series by virtue of finishing on top of the ladder and winning their second semi-final.

"With the new finals system it's been very different this year getting a chance to have two weekends off over the course of the finals," he said.

"However our reserves were still involved up until last week so some of the guys have had a chance to keep playing.

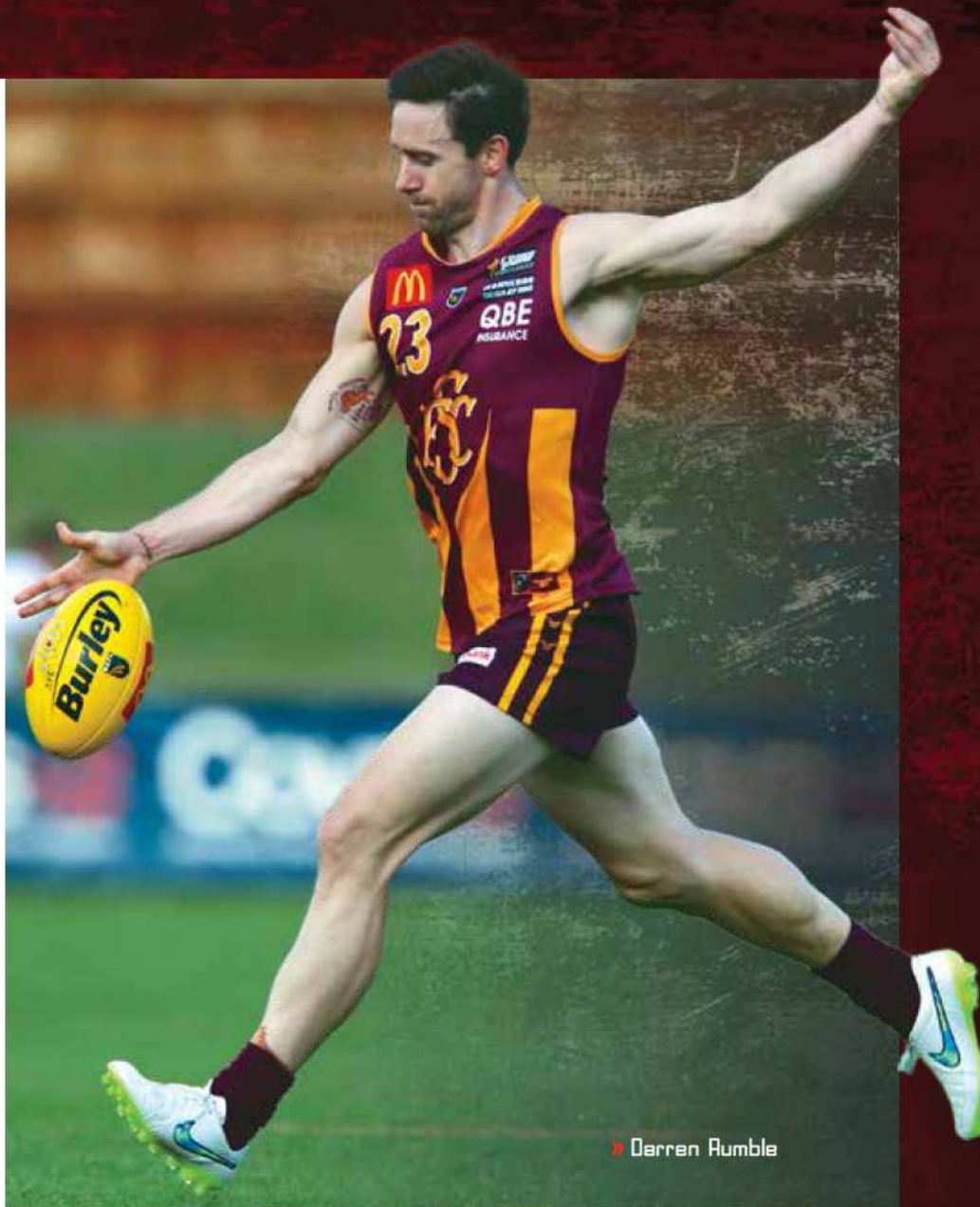
"We haven't been distracted by the path we've had to take and to be honest, you're up and about once you make a grand final.

"We've had a great season but we know anything can happen on grand final day, last year is a good example of that. It's a flow on from last year where we have a team where everyone knows how to play their role. It's made us pretty even across the ground and means any player coming in knows the systems and how to get their job done.

"That message has been clear all year and while we were rewarded with last year's premiership and a grand final berth this year we won't be taking anything for granted."

Ahead of their second semi-final encounter, Rumble's likely opponent Michael Lourey was asked about the Lions defender and said "He is tough. He is strong and experienced, and it will be a good match up again for me. He's a good player so I look forward to the challenge of going up against someone with so much finals experience."

The Lions came out on top that day two weeks ago, but Lourey and his teammates fired up in their preliminary final win over East Perth last weekend and will work to take down the premiership favourites starting at 2.30pm this Sunday.

# COLLECTABLES 9

**During 2015, the Football Budget will again feature a section on WAFL memorabilia and invites you to write or email if you want more information about the football collectables you have tucked away at home.**

You might think it inappropriate to start this weekend's final WAFL Collectables for 2015 – the grand final edition – with a piece of Peel Thunder memorabilia.

After all, the boys from Mandurah haven't played in a grand final. Unless, of course, you are talking about the colts side.

Anyway, it's just so rare that a piece of interesting Peel memorabilia pops up. So I decided I had to write about the coin that long-time WAFL collector Ron recently showed me.

The coin was produced by the Perth Mint and came in a special jarrah holder that was marked with the Peel Thunder logo and carried the words 'Inaugural Match'.

On the reverse of the coin was the score from the Thunder's first game in the WAFL, which was played back in 1997 – Peel 8.8 (56) to South Fremantle 25.10 (160).

Ron even had the small certificate that came with the coin, which said it was one of a specially minted limited edition. There was no information about just how many were made, though.

Something else that Ron had in his collection may be a little more appropriate for today – an old vinyl record of the West Perth club song, It's a Grand Old Flag.

His copy probably dated to the 1970s and got me thinking about the other club songs I have seen on vinyl over the years.

In my collection, I have the East Perth song, East Perth Forever, sung by Clem Grogan and the Blue Brass on a blue plastic record.

That one certainly won't be heard today, but 'Tigerland' might be heard after the colts grand final. My version of the ever-popular Claremont theme song, on vinyl, was especially recorded for the club by the Will Upson Band in 1981.



Finally, I have a vinyl version of the Swans theme song, which was released by Midland Gate Shopping Centre and has some poetry by the late Stan Moses on the 'B' side.

The song (probably not the poetry) might be on high rotation if the black-and-whites take out both the colts and reserves flags today.

All that said, I have never been able to turn up a copy of Glory, Glory, Subiaco on vinyl. Has anyone seen one? Or a record featuring the theme song of any other WAFL club?

The other item Ron had in his collection that rang a bell was a 1980s plastic keyring featuring the cartoon-style Tigers logo that was used from about 1982.

Some years ago, I picked up a Swans version of this keyring and the discovery of the Claremont version made me fairly certain they were made for all clubs.

I've now also seen a Perth version and am hoping to see the other five over the course of my collecting over the summer.

So, if you can help with a photograph, please get in touch.

Of course, the same goes for WAFL memorabilia you might turn up during your spring cleaning.

Over the break, I'll be putting some work into my website at [www.waflcollectables.webs.com](http://www.waflcollectables.webs.com) and would welcome any input from readers about items that appear on the site.

Even more interesting, of course, are items that don't appear on the site, which covers almost every type of WAFL collectable you can imagine.

It's the information that comes from readers that helps to make WAFL Collectables and the website such a great source of information for all collectors.

Of course, I'm always happy to provide advice about anything you may have in your own collection.

Here's one final mystery for season 2015 that readers may be able to help me solve.

One of the most sought-after types of WAFL drinking glasses is a glass beer mug

made by Malaysia's Kedaung Group in the 1980s. Each glass features a circular logo of a WAFL club.

There were also small tumblers with the same logo, but we'll just deal with the mug for now.

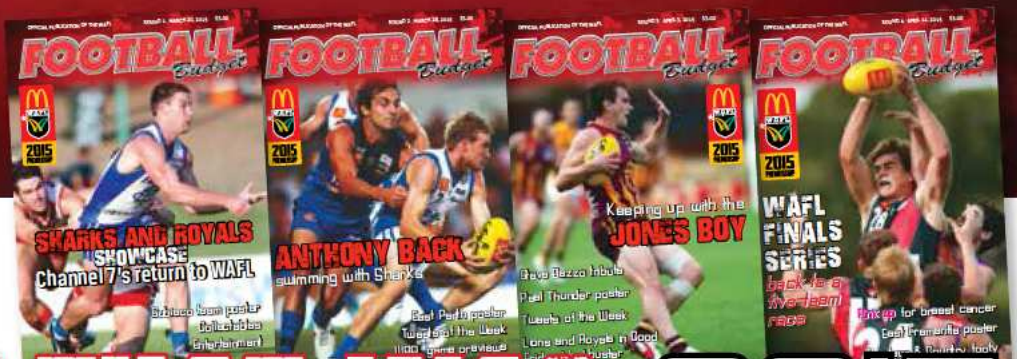
Recently, I was shown the same mug for a non-WAFL team. Unusually, though, it wasn't a VFL or SANFL team it was a team from the Great Northern Football League, based around Geraldton.

# The SEASON THAT WAS 2015

## ROUND 1

**South Fremantle opened the season with a 35-point win over West Perth but it was old hands of Ashton Hams, Ryan Cook and Craig White who taught WAFL newcomers some valuable lessons.**

Ricky Cary and Matt Riggio led Swan Districts' scoring spree in a 96-point welcoming for new Perth coach Earl Spalding at Steel Blue Oval.

Five goals apiece by Subiaco's Clancy Wheeler and Shane Yarran proved too much for Claremont.

And East Fremantle was rewarded for moving its round one match to Domain Stadium for TV purposes with a 55-point victory over East Perth.

## ROUND 2

**Shane Yarran staked an early claim to the Bernie Naylor Medal with a second consecutive five-goal haul in Subiaco's triumph over East Fremantle.**

West Coast draftee Liam Duggan gave a glimpse of his potential by guiding East Perth to a 13-point win over Swan Districts at Medibank Stadium.

South Fremantle felt vindicated by the decision to appoint Todd Curley coach as the Bulldogs settled into second spot with two wins, the latter a 10-point triumph over Perth.

With Connor Blakely in peak form Peel gave West Perth a big fright at HBF Arena when they lead by 11 points at half-time. But Michael Lourey's four goals helped the Falcons storm home.

## ROUND 3

**The run is over. Premature questions about Subiaco's ability to defend its premiership arouse after East Perth's 10-goal win on Good Friday.**

The Royals had 157 more possessions than the Lions with Brant Colledge outstanding, posting 36 disposals, nine marks, eight tackles and three goals.

South Fremantle continued its winning run, also on the holiday, as Marlon Pickett and Haiden Schloithe set up a 38-point win over Claremont.

Lachie Weller and Tendai Mzungu pushed for Fremantle selection in Peel's 55-point demolition of East Fremantle in Mandurah.

Michael Lourey's six goals enabled West Perth to build a healthy percentage on the back of a 79-point victory over Perth.

## ROUND 4

**A 34-possession performance by Sandover medallist Rory O'Brien was the difference between success and failure for East Fremantle in its three-point triumph over Claremont at ATOM Stadium.**

The defensive qualities of Josh Bootsma were again on show as Peel held off a spirited challenge from Perth. Bootsma took nine marks in the back half.

Subiaco proved suggestions of its demise were unwarranted as Chris Phelan, Lachlan Delahunty and Jordan Lockyer were behind a second half surge that sealed a 17-point win over West Perth.

Swan Districts continued to silence the doubters by inflicting South Fremantle's first loss of 2015. Tony Notte was again prominent in the black and whites' performance.

## ROUND 5

***There was champagne in the Lathlain Park can bar after Perth broke through for its first win of the season.***

Liam McKenna and Aidan Tropiano were the drivers as the Demons consigned Claremont to last place without a win.

Perennial cellar dweller Peel leapt to lofty heights as its third win from four matches put the Mandurah club into second spot. East Perth was the Thunder's latest victim.

But Subiaco declared it was the team to beat again in 2015 with an 89-point belting of South Fremantle at the port. Shane Yarran added another six goals to his tally.

East Fremantle belied the turmoil that would later engulf the club with a 31-point success against Swan Districts at Steel Blue Oval. George Hampson's five goals as a midfielder was the lift the Sharks needed.

## ROUND 6

***Perth's WAFL joy was shortlived. A week after enjoying their season breakthrough the Demons ran into an unusual East Perth team.***

Regular full back Kyle Anderson went forward and kicked seven goals in the 103-point demolition.

Peel liked the view from the second branch of the WAFL tree so Hayden Crozier, Jacob Ballard and Brendon Jones combined to keep Cam Shepherd's combination near the top. The Thunder defeated Claremont by 27-points.

East Fremantle continued the trend of visiting teams winning key derbies as it relied on Brock O'Brien, Jack Perham and Rob Young to seal a 17-point win over South Fremantle at Fremantle Oval.

West Perth began its run of comeback victories at HBF Arena. The Falcons were 17 points down at three-quarter time against Swan Districts. But the hosts, led by Shane Nelson, flashed to the finish to snatch a seven-point win.

## ROUND 7

***Coach Michael Broadbridge breathed a sigh of relief as Claremont broke its season duck with a 20-point triumph over West Perth at the Tigers' temporary home, the Claremont Showground.***

South Fremantle raised concerns about East Perth's flag credentials with a 13-point success set up by Cory Dell'Olio's four goals and James Sellar's best performance of the season.

Perth's defence worked impressively to keep Subiaco to 8.15 (63) but it wasn't enough to stop the Lions notching a 36-point win at Lathlain Park.

Swan Districts moved back into the top five with a 47-point demolition of Peel at home. Ryan Davis had 25 possessions and 11 tackles.

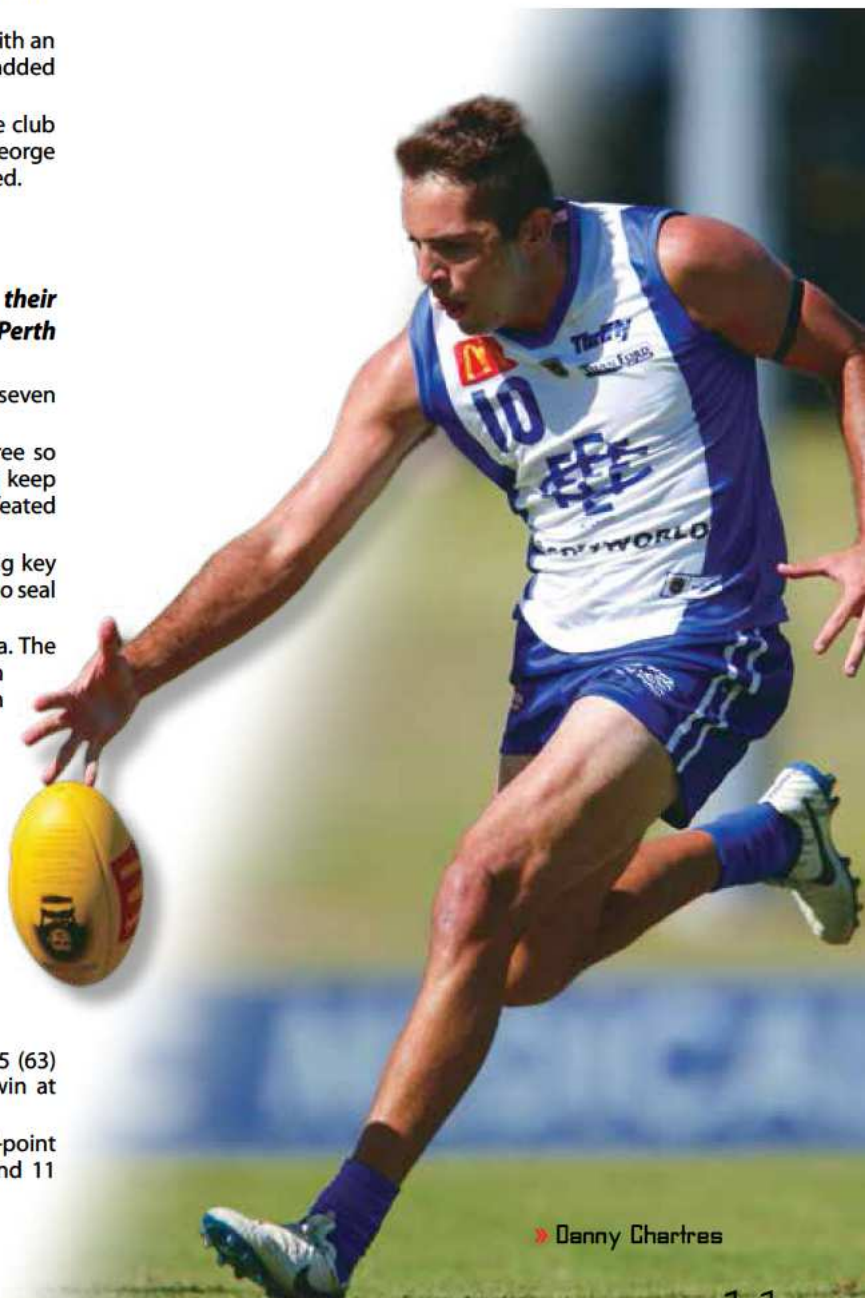
## ROUND 8

***Claremont took the WAFL to the country and got the dividend of an 11-point victory over Swan Districts at Souness Park in Mt Barker.***

Brett Robinson's work through midfield was the highlight of Subiaco's 10-goal success over Peel. Shane Yarran booted another six goals.

West Perth kept East Perth to one behind in the last quarter as it stormed home with 10 goals to claim a remarkable 38-point result in its favour.

Mark McGough and defender Danny Chartres were the keys to East Fremantle's win over Perth. The Sharks sat second after the round with a 5-2 record.

## STATE GAME

**Western Australia holds a one-win advantage over South Australia after a 45-point victory at Lathlain Park.**

Going into the battle for the Haydn Bunton Cup, the States had each won 46 times in their encounters since 1904, but under the guidance of debutant State coach Darren Harris, WA broke the deadlock with a 18.13 (121) to 11.10 (76) victory.

The WA team was selected to take advantage of the wide open spaces of Lathlain Park and they did just that, with half forward Ryan Davis' five goals earning him the Simpson Medal as WA's best player.

Forward Jarryd Morton kicked seven of Perth's 13 goals but it wasn't enough to stop Claremont from sealing another triumph.

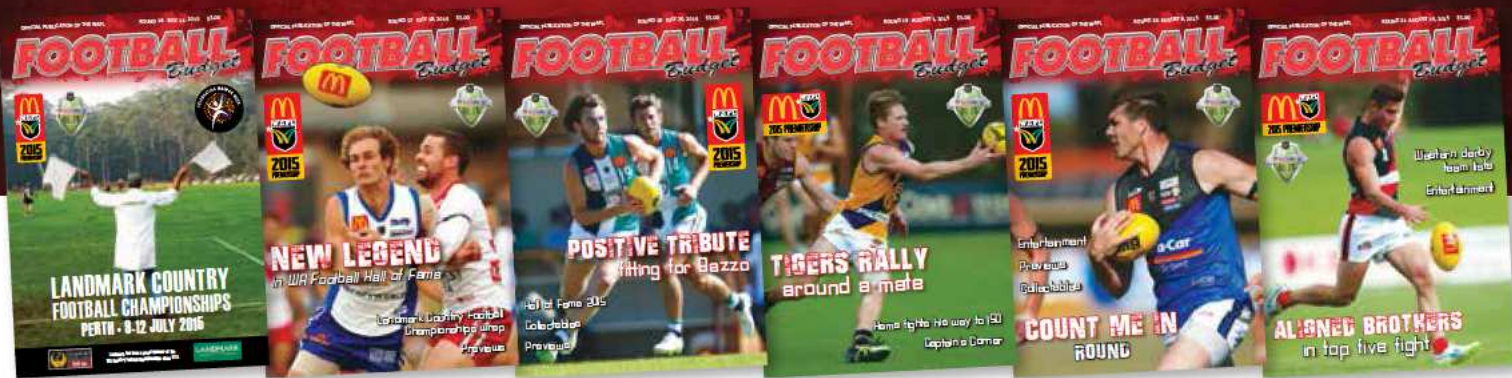
## ROUND 13

Swan Districts has bucked the trend by reaching the reserves grand final from third, meaning it hasn't bumped into South Fremantle during the minor finals.

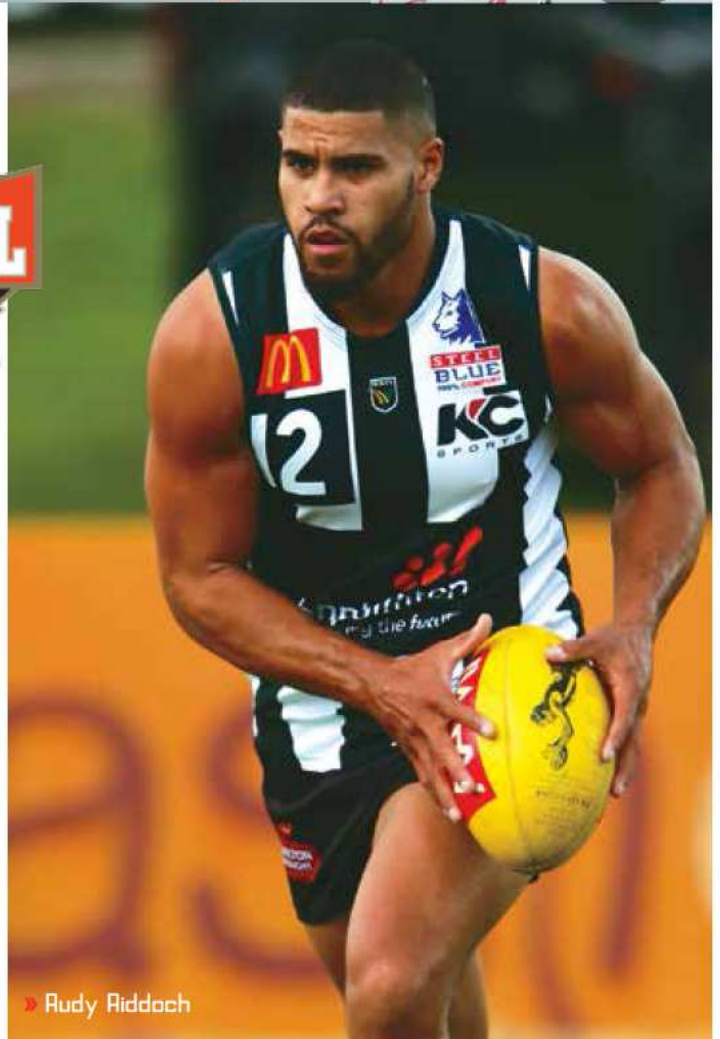
Little separated the teams in June. The black and whites again went against convention by claiming an eight-point win at Fremantle Oval.

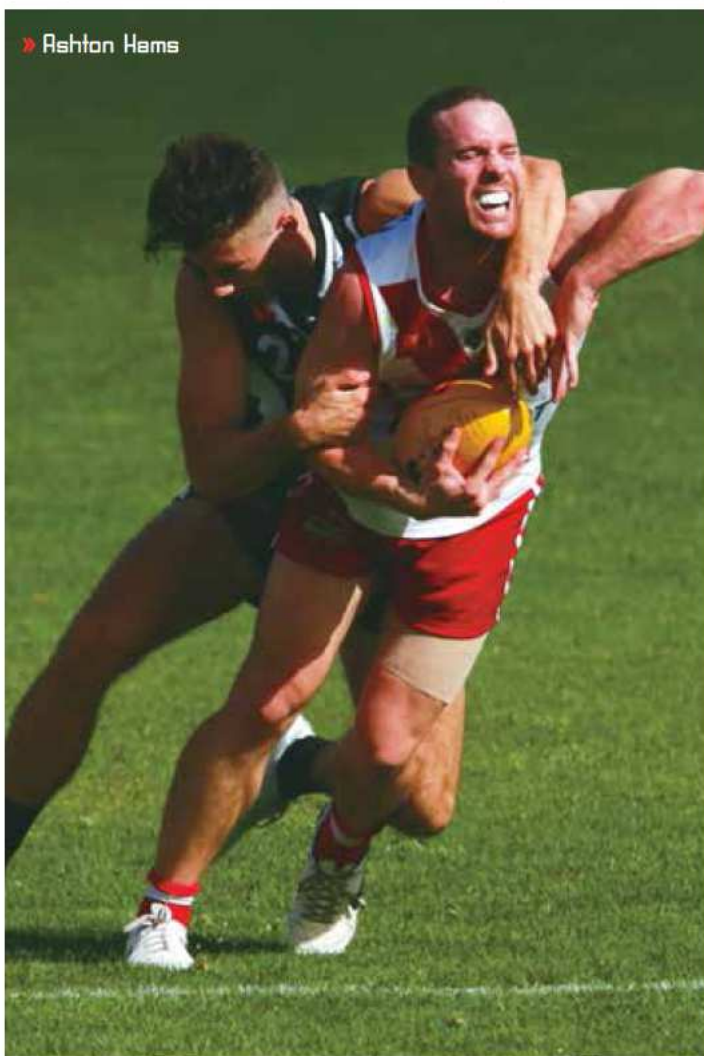

# Even workload makes Lions a force

**Men of influence:** Subiaco spread the workload beautifully this year and it made them a formidable force to be reckoned with. WAFL leading goalkicker Shane Yarran kicked five goals in the opening round to set the tone for the season, while Kyle Halligan and Michael Wood also helped make the Lions the most prolific scoring team over 20 home-and-away rounds.

Yarran twice kicked bags of five goals and on another two occasions nailed six goals.

Recruits Sam Menegola and Leigh Kitchin along with Chris Phelan were also damaging.

Menegola, who came to the Lions via East Fremantle and Peel, had a delayed start to the year because of injury but once he got started his red-hot form added even more spark to a potent Lions side.

Kitchin impressed from his first outing when he picked up 29 disposals, while Phelan finished in the top 10 possession-getters in the league.

In his second season of league football (he played five games in 2013 and all 14 games last year in the reserves), ruckman David Madut has become a crowd favourite and his development has continued at a rapid pace.

**First half of the year:** The reigning premiers brought in some new faces in Round 1 with the likes of defender Jordan Lockyer, Scott Hancock, Braden Fimmano, Christopher Bryan and Kitchin making their debuts in the win over Claremont.

Subiaco lost just one game after the first 11 rounds of the season and also had two byes in that first half. Their only blemish came at the hands of East Perth, the team they beat in last year's grand final, in Round 3.

By the end of Round 5, after a thumping 89-point win over South Fremantle, the Lions became the hunted when they moved to the top of the ladder and never relinquished that position for the rest of the season.

**Second half of the year:** Subiaco's eight-game winning streak came to an end against West Perth in Round 14 and they lost their only other encounter for the year against Swan Districts in Round 20 – and they only lost by a total of 11 points (by 10 to the Falcons and by one to Swans).

By the end of Round 19 they had opened up a four-game buffer ahead of closest challengers the Falcons and Peel.

**Young guns:** Midfielder Greg Clark, who made his league debut in Round 18 at the age of 18 and also played in Round 19, was the only Subiaco player invited to the NAB AFL National Draft Combine in Melbourne in October. However, Menegola and Yarran who are five and eight years older than Clarke respectively, were invited to the State Combine in Perth also in October.

Bryan is a 19-year-old from North Beach who is a dashing half-back who was a star in the colts in 2014 before finishing the season strongly with the reserves.

**Last year:** Won 14, lost 6 – Finished 2nd. Premiers

**This year:** Won 17, lost 3 – Finished 1st

**The coach:** From seventh in his first year in charge of the Lions in 2013 to premiers last year,

minor premiers and grand finalists this year, Jarrad Schofield has become a master coach in a short period. The former West Coast, Port Adelaide (including the 2004 premiership) and Fremantle midfielder has garnered plenty of respect in the coaching ranks and has moulded a cohesive Lions outfit that set the standard from the first bounce of the season.

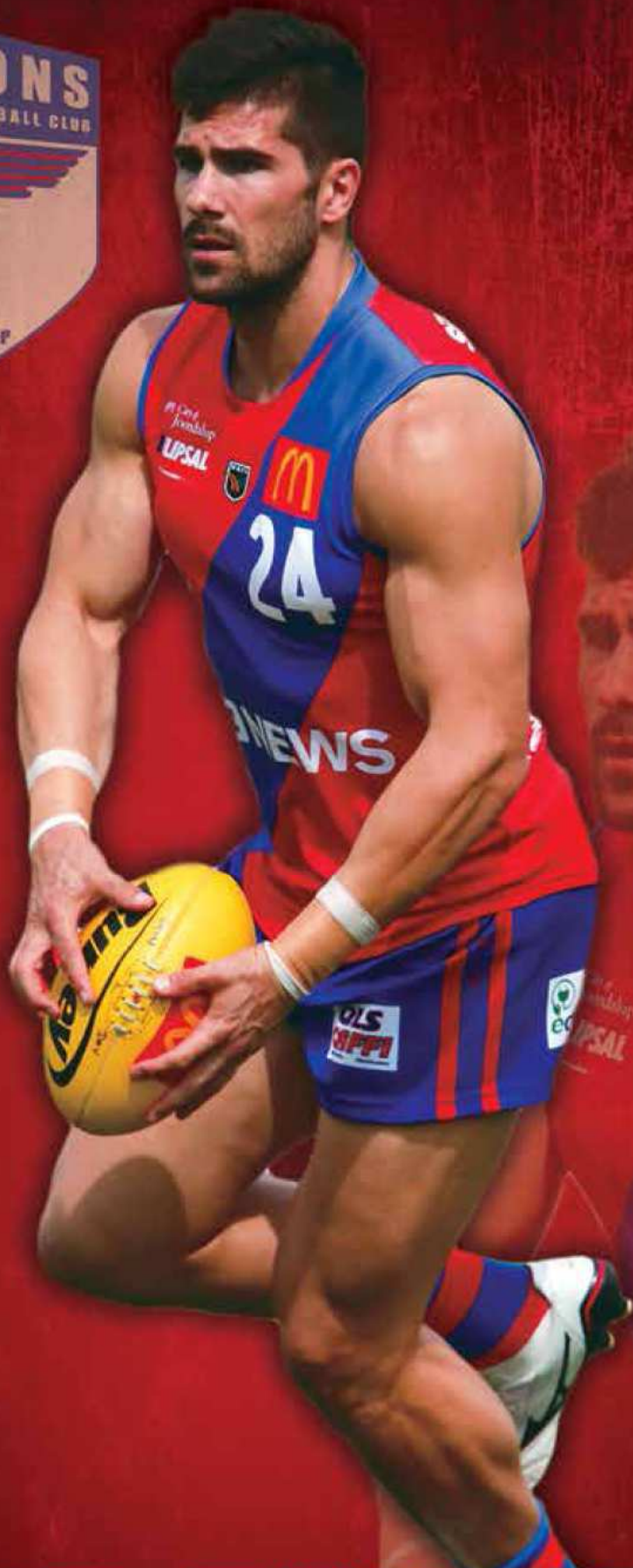

# Falcons depth earns grand final berth

**Men of influence:** Best of mates off the field and a dynamic duo on it, 2014 Sandover medallist Aaron Black and Shane Nelson were among a plethora of players who influenced West Perth in 2015 as it earned a second grand final berth in three seasons.

Marcus Adams, Michael Lourey, Andrew Strijk, Jay van Berlo and Chris Keunen also helped the Falcons cement second position after a disappointing sixth finish the year before.

The Falcons midfield was brimming with talent and benefited from the work of Keunen, while the Falcons backline was largely led by big bodied 22-year-old Adams who has been invited to the NAB AFL Draft State Combine next month and is touted as a high draft pick later this year.

Lourey was recruited by the Falcons as a key forward target and he more than showed his worth, particularly in the preliminary final win over East Perth when he kicked six goals.

**First half of the year:** A first-up loss to South Fremantle was followed by a win over Peel in which Strijk set a season-high record of 29 kicks in a game.

The Falcons won six of their 10 games in the first half of the season and after their Round 9 win over East Fremantle they flew into second position on the ladder and that's where they remained for the rest of the home-and-away season.

In light of injuries, the Falcons gave more league experience to players such as Drew Rohde, Sam Rotham and Aidan Lynch and they rewarded the faith with some strong showings.

**Second half of the year:** A well-drilled and determined Falcons side won seven and lost just three games in the second half of the season to sure up second position and a double chance in the finals.

The Falcons guaranteed second spot, and a home qualifying final, after their Round 22 win over the Bulldogs. Starring in the victory was Matt Fowler with a career-best six goals from 17 possessions and eight marks.

Round 22 also featured debutant Tim Sutherland who had 20 hit outs and worked hard in the absence of Keunen.

In the qualifying final the Falcons thumped Peel by 109 points before going down to grand final opponents Subiaco by 55 points in the second semi-final.

They rebounded to outlast East Perth in the preliminary final in front of 8,500 people at HBF Arena.

**Young guns:** Corey Chalmers added to his one league game last season and was given some room to run in the midfield where he collected 29 possessions in the Falcons Round 20 win over the Sharks. He also kicked two bags of three goals in his 11 games.

Blake Wilhelm debuted in Round 10 and while he is a little older, has come from a basketball background and impressed coach Bill Monaghan with his speed and vertical leap.

**Last year:** Won 9, lost 11 – Finished 6th

**This year:** Won 13, lost 7 – Finished 2nd

**The coach:** Monaghan will take his team into a second grand final in his seventh year as coach. It's a rewarding return to finals action for Monaghan this year as he brought in the likes of Lourey into a side that in the end was spoilt for riches as he developed a cohesive team that covered the losses of players like Matt Guadagnin (knee) and Jordan Jones (hamstring).

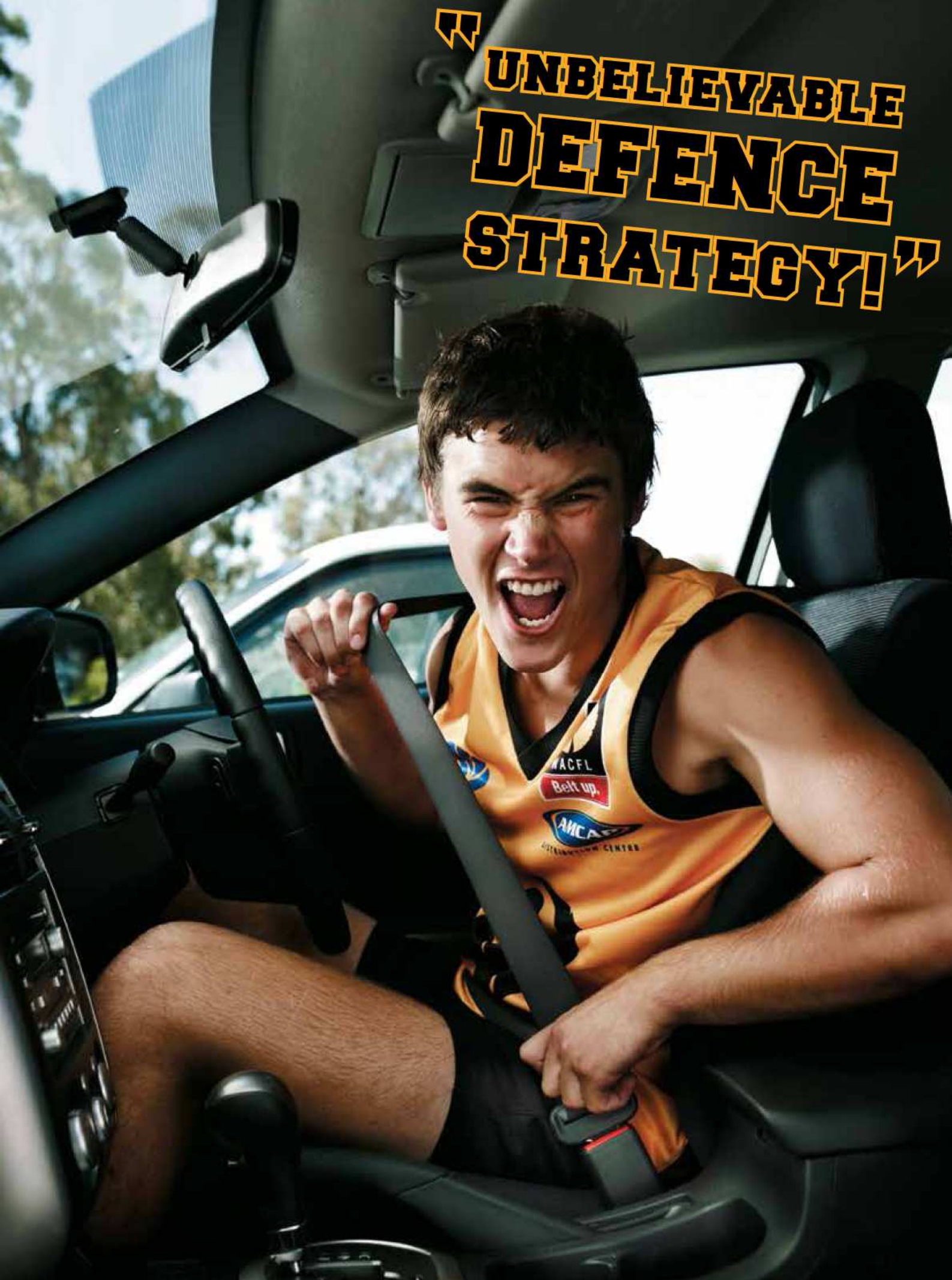

The Lions are refreshed after playing one match in almost a month while the Falcons have a sore wing or two after a heavy finals campaign.

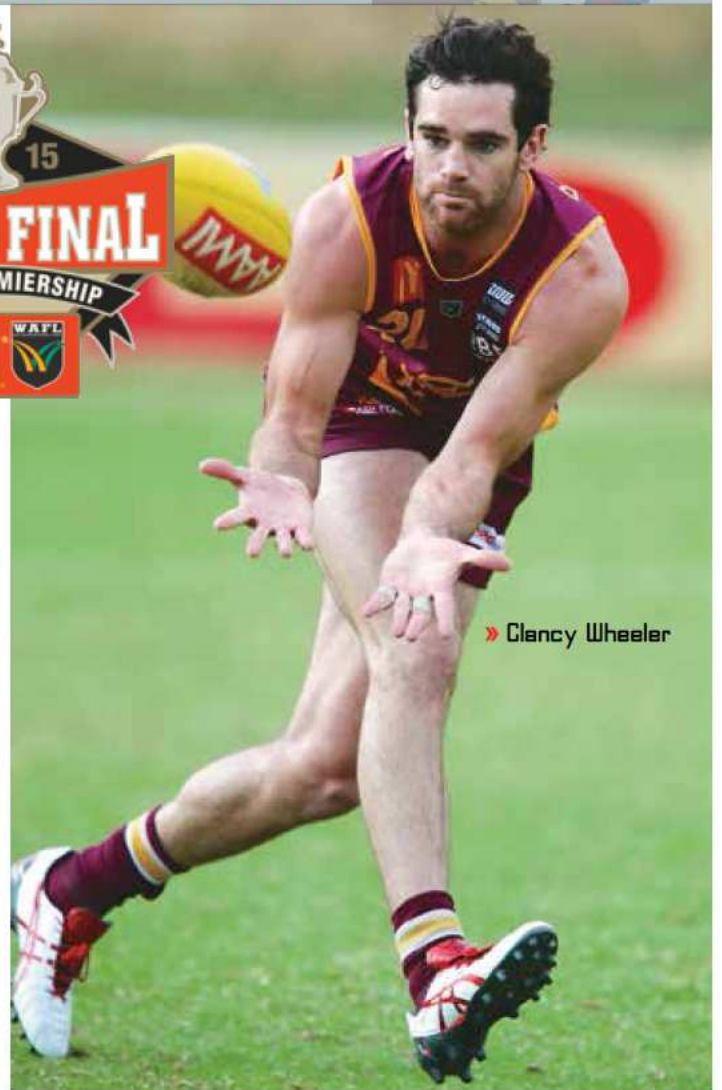

Unfortunately for West Perth this year's Subiaco unit might well be superior on paper to that which took the trophy 12 months ago.

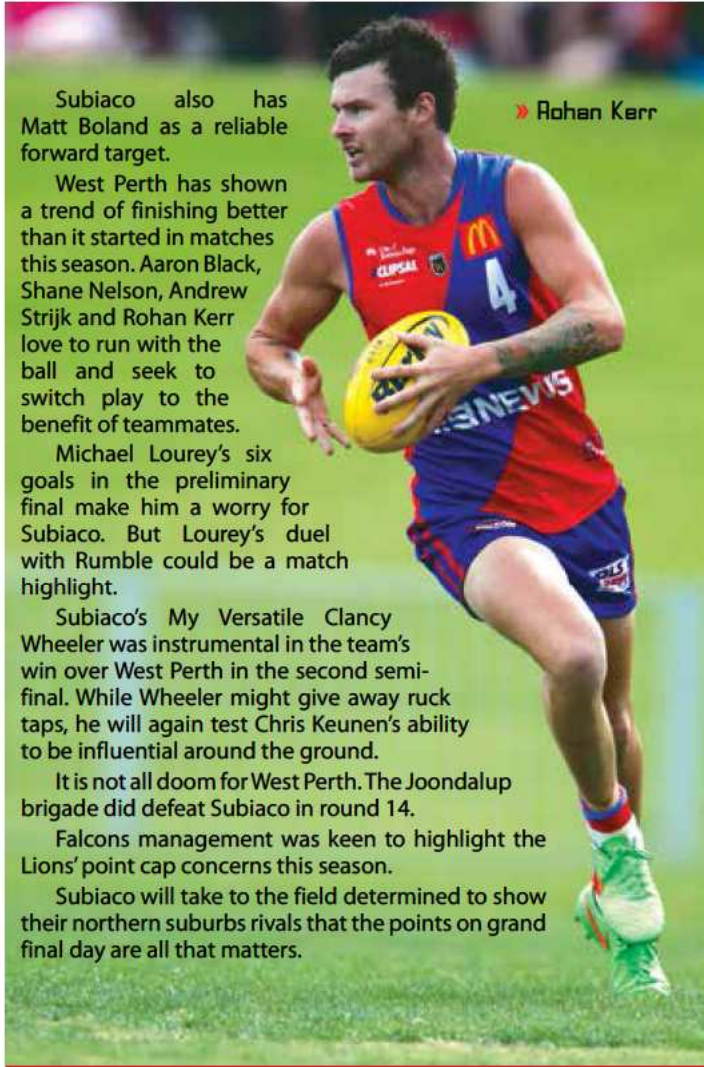
