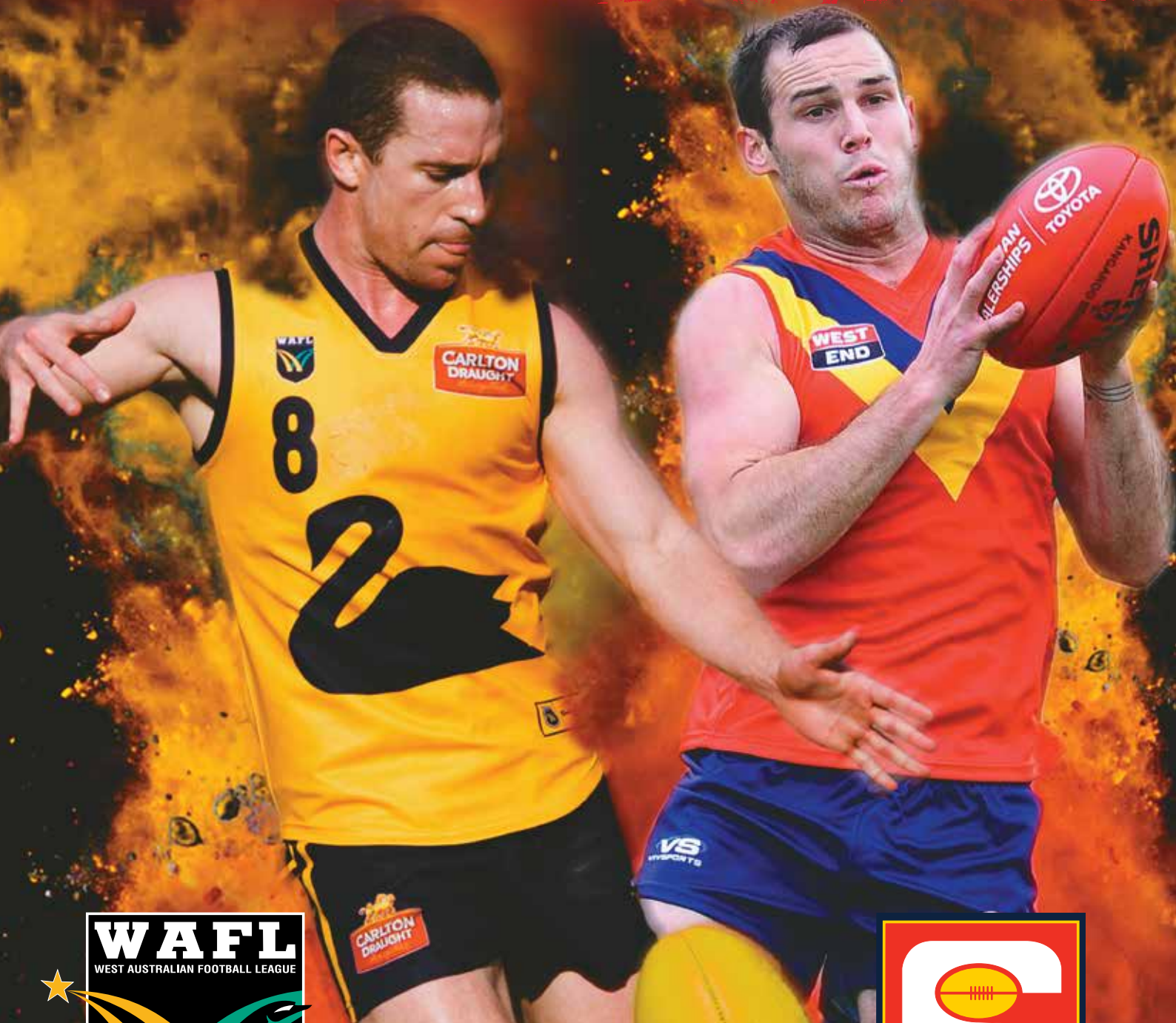

IN THE STATE JUNGLE

10 YEARS ON

DARREN Rumble is being flaunted as the Carlton Draught WAFL State team's lucky charm as he gets set to play his fifth game in a Black Swans jumper.

The five-time Subiaco premiership backman, who turned 30 a day before playing in his fifth premiership with Subiaco last September, made his State debut 10 years ago.

However, it is the circumstances surrounding his last game for WA that coach Darren Harris hopes are mirrored this week.

Just as was the case back in 2009, Rumble was only included last Monday into the 2015 WA team that will take on the West End SANFL team this Saturday at Lathlain Park.

Rumble has been in superb form and was an easy choice for Harris and his selectors to make when looking to replace injured defender Tallan Ames in the squad.

"When I spoke to Darren about playing in the State game he was really keen to put his hand up to play," Harris said.

"He then told me that he was brought in on the Monday leading up to the 2009 State game, which also happened to be against South Australia.

"WA won that game by a point so we're going to consider Darren as our lucky charm!"

Harris said Subiaco coach Jarrad Schofield, like the other WAFL coaches, had supported the State selectors fully and was right behind the decision to add Rumble to the squad.

"Darren has been in great form and from the outset we have maintained players in the squad who have been playing well," Harris said.

"In the end it was Darren's call as to whether he made himself available or not and we're glad he did. We've had great buy-in from every player who has been involved this year. They all want to be there and there's been a great sprit at training.

"All of our State coaches have commented that this group of players have left their egos at the door and they all want to give it everything to help the team get a State victory this weekend."

Of the four State games Rumble has played, one of them was alongside the man he replaced in this year's squad – Tallan Ames – and that game was nine years ago.

In 2006 Ames was making his State debut, while Rumble was playing his second representative game. They were part of a WA side that lost to South Australia by 17 points. Rumble started at full back and Ames in the ruck.

Of that side, Ames and Rumble are the only two still playing in the WAFL.

It was the seventh straight win by South Australia in clashes with Western Australia who last claimed bragging rights back in 1994. WA turned the tables in 2009, when Rumble was part of a team that included Peter Bell, Jeff Farmer and Simpson medallist Brent LeCras to come from behind at three quarter time and claim a narrow victory.

COLLECTABLES

During 2015, the Football Budget will again feature a section on WAFL memorabilia and invites you to write or email if you want more information about the football collectables you have tucked away at home.

Given this Saturday's game is a traditional State game between Western Australia and South Australia, it would be appropriate to feature some items relating to State footy.

So, I'll start this week's WAFL Collectables with a newly discovered program that was brought to me by long-time collector Mark during the week.

Surprisingly, I had no knowledge of this program or even this game, but it was billed as a "Gaelic Football Spectacular" and was played between Western Australia and County Kerry on October 2, 1981.

On the face of it, a game of Gaelic football probably shouldn't interest collectors of WAFL memorabilia. Until, that is, one looks at the team that represented WA.

It was made up entirely of WAFL champions, with the exception of goalkeeper Willie McNally, who was apparently a star with local soccer club Perth Azzuri.

Among those representing WA were Stephen Michael, Wayne Blackwell, Stan Nowotny, Rod Lester-Smith, Peter Menaglio, Graham Melrose, Brian Taylor, Basil Campbell and Stephen Curtis.

The team was coached by Graham Campbell and easily defeated the All-Australian Gaelic football team in a trial match before taking on County Kerry at Subiaco Oval.

Given it's the first time I have seen this program, I can say it's certainly rare. Interestingly, it also details another match played in Perth by County Kerry in 1970.



The next items are more related to traditional State football.

This pair of State tour itineraries was bought separately but, coincidentally, are both for WA tours to SA on which the Sandgroppers achieved rare away victories.

The first example, from 1977, marked SA's centenary of football. We ruined the Croweaters' party by securing a 40-point victory thanks to the efforts of full-back Ross Glendinning and five goals from Chris Mitsopoulos.

The second, more austere, itinerary was for the 1984 match at Football Park. In that match, Rob Wiley appeared to kick the winning point after the siren. But the umpires allowed the score, handing WA victory.

Eagle-eyed WAFL supporters may have noticed the discovery during the week of an Anzac Day medallion that received some press attention.

The medal, which is now thought to have been the first one ever produced to commemorate the Gallipoli landings, was struck in June, 1915 by the Cumpston Engraving Works.

What makes it of interest to WAFL collectors is that the medal was the brainchild of the East Perth Football Club.

Research by the Perth Numismatic Society turned up an article in the Daily News of 1915, which quoted East Perth president Harry Mann.

Mann was talking about the war service given by five East Perth players and the death of one of their number.

But he said the club could do more and that the ladies' committee would sell commemorative medals at East Perth games for sixpence apiece. More than 1600 were sold in the first week.

The medals themselves, however, do not mention the Royals. On one side, which also

bears the year of 1915, the medal says: "God speed the Allies", while the other says: "Struck in honour of our boys at the Dardanelles".

If one of these turns up for sale, I have no doubt that some WAFL collectors would be interested bidders. But how many of them still exist after 100 years?

This Sunday WAFL and VFL champions Barry Cable and Ross Glendinning will attend the fair to sign some limited edition collectable cards that have been issued just for the show.

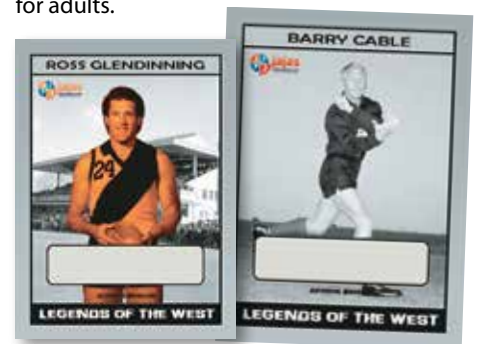
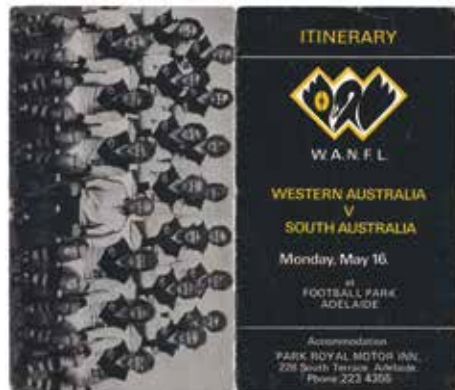
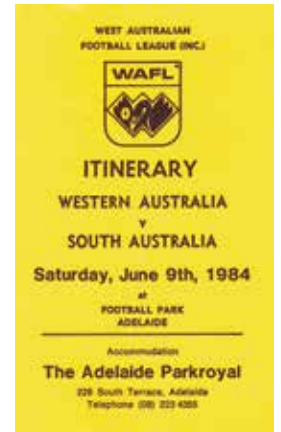
Just 30 of each card will be released at \$50 apiece. A bigger card featuring caricatures of both players will be available for \$95 and will also be signed by the players on Sunday.

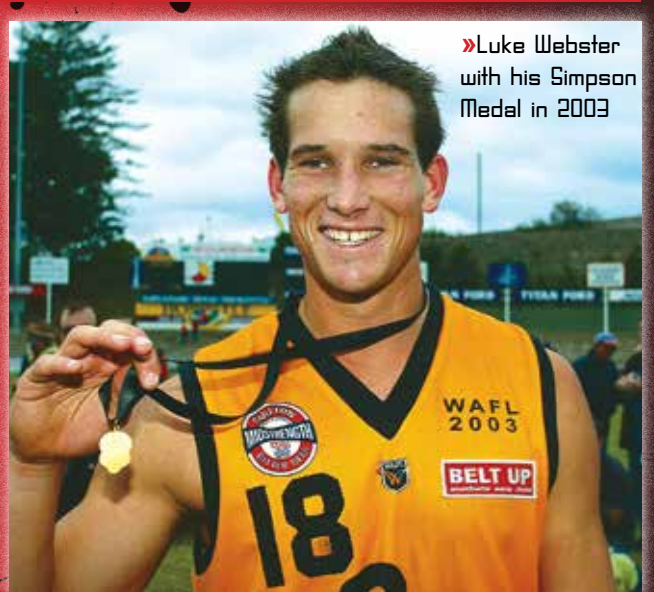

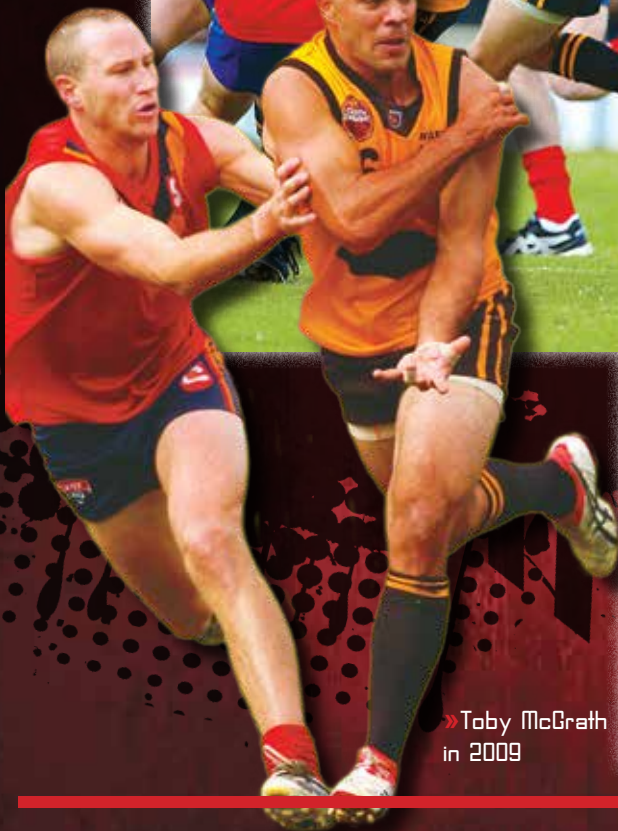

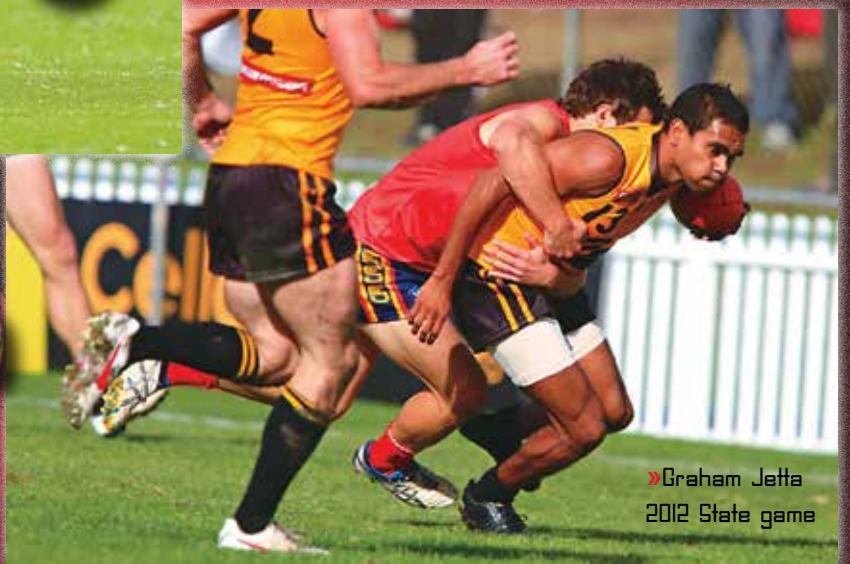

WA'S 35 METRE WEAPON

Thirty five metres.

That is about the distance of an average kick in football nowadays. And that length of Lathlain Park could become an important weapon in WA's quest for more interstate success.

After years of being the VFL and SANFL whipping boys, the Black Swans have in recent seasons closed the gap between itself and the other State football powers.

Even a 15-year drought against the Croweaters was broken in 2009.

But SA got the victory in the next clash three years later, using a tough, but fair, tactic.

Glenelg's Gliderol Stadium is just 155 metres long. Many WAFL players would be unaccustomed to such a cosy playing environment.

Not surprisingly, SA squeezed the WA flow and sealed a 14-point win.

Now it's the WAFL's turn to repay the favour. The Croweaters can expect to do plenty of galloping as Lathlain Park registers just over 180m on the tape measure. And it is wide, too.

Expect Black Swans coach Darren Harris to rely on WA's pace to be a significant factor in the clash.

Lewis Jetta, now at Sydney, Trevor Oliver, Jeff Farmer and Ian Richardson were key members of the breakthrough win in 2009 that heralded WA's rise back to an interstate football force.

Andrew Strijk and Darren Rumble were also part of the success and were also part of the final squad for this year's battle.

Ironically, Rumble was a late inclusion into the WA team six years ago. In 2015 he was only added to the Black Swans list on the Monday before the match.

Interestingly, then coach Scott Watters used the spirit of WA players from the 1990s,

such as John Worsfold, Chris Mainwaring and Glen Jakovich, to inspire the 2009 win.

However, it will be the sense of achievement that should motivate the Black Swans in the latest battle.

For Brock O'Brien, Steven Payne, Justin Simpson, Laine Rasmussen and Brendon Jones interstate football was likely to be the highest level of their careers.

While it is also a rise in standard for youngsters Marlon Pickett, Aidan Tropiano and Payne, Harris has also ensured his team has plenty of experience.

After all, SA were likely to field former AFL talent, Jason Porplyzia, Ian Callinan and Marlon Motlop.

Ruckman Paul Johnson is a big-game performer and will lead the ruck, Ryan Cook brings plenty of State league experience, Leroy Jetta can show the talents he displayed in the AFL while regular WA full back Tallan Ames is back in his customary role.

They know how to play in Lathlain Park conditions. It might be the difference between success and failure.

SOUTH AUSTRALIAN PRIDE

You can feel the passion when asking West End State coach Graham Cornes what it means to wear the cherished South Australian guernsey.

"I don't care what level it is at, when you pull that red State guernsey on there is something extra there," said Cornes, a member of the Australian Football Hall of Fame.

"It brings something extra out in a footballer. There is a surge of pride, a sense of history and there is also optimism of what is to come.

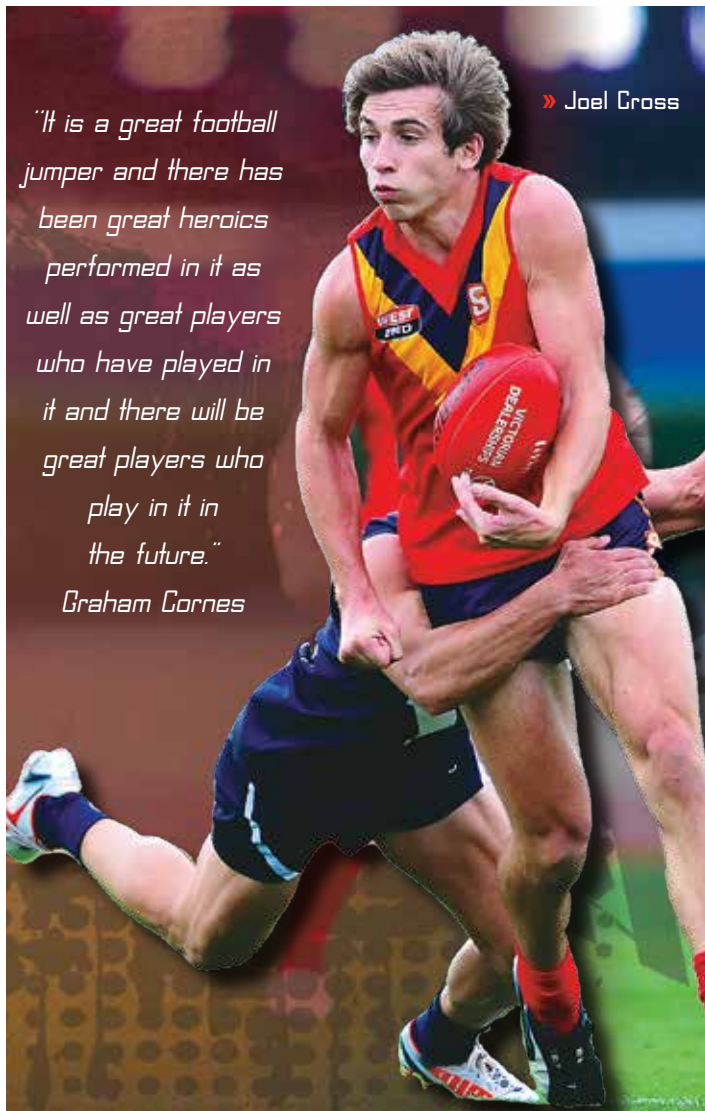
"It is a great football jumper and there has been great heroics performed in it as well as great players who have played in it and there will be great players who play in it in the future.

"So if you get the opportunity to wear it and you have done it, you will understand what that means."

Stepping back into the coaching box for the first time since being Adelaide's inaugural AFL coach from 1991 to 1994, Cornes has been quick to inspire his charges, who are searching for their first victory in Western Australia since 2003.

Training sessions have been regularly succeeded by motivational speeches from past and present greats including South Australian football legend Neil Kerley.

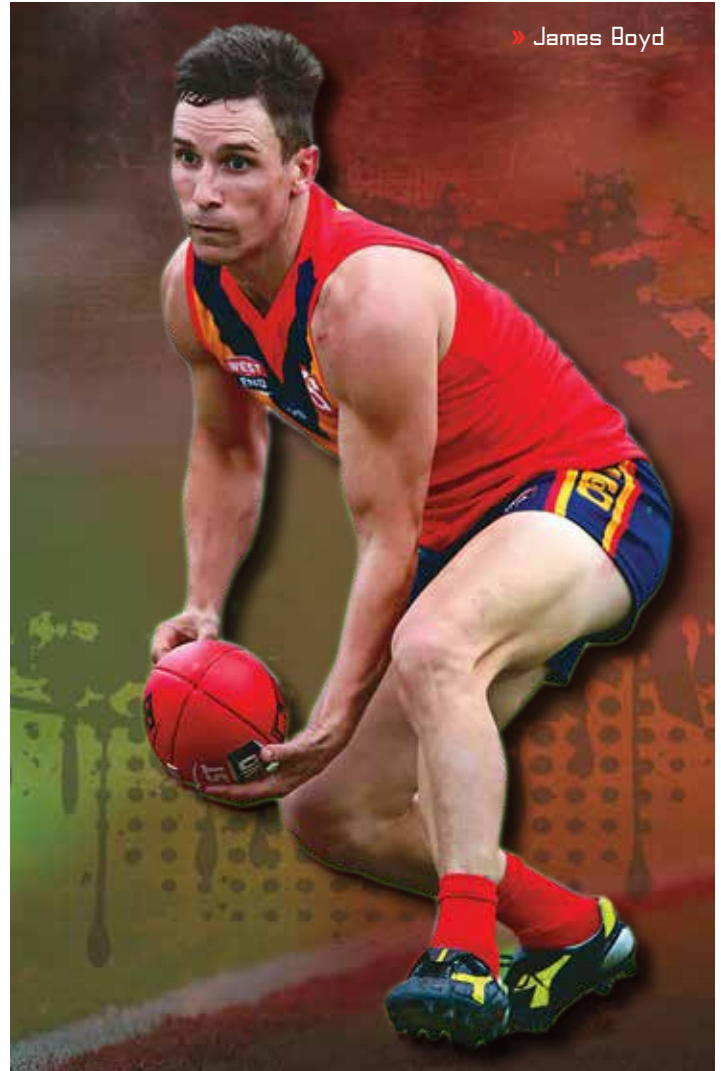
"The reasoning behind that is whilst all of these guys have played State footy before, I wanted these guys to feel special," said Cornes, who coached Glenelg to SANFL premierships in 1985 and 1986.

Despite losing two of last year's victorious West End State team to injury – Michael Coad and Jarrod Schiller – Cornes is confident he still has the talent to push the win-loss ledger in favour of the Croweaters, with it currently locked at 46 wins a piece.

With Sturt bigman Angus Kurtze to lead the ruck, the SANFL's midfield rotation runs particularly deep with last year's Fos Williams Medallist Zane Kirkwood joining the likes of Magarey Medallist Joel Cross, Jack Oatey Medallist Matt Panos and Eagles star James Boyd in the centre square.

On the outside, Port captain Steve Summerton, North's Marlon Motlop and Eagles veteran Luke Jarrad will provide plenty of run for SA on the expanses of Lathlain Park.

South Adelaide spearhead Brett Eddy will be the go-to man in attack, with the high-flying forward to be complemented nicely by star goalsneaks, and former Crows, Ian Callinan and Jason Porplyzia.

Expect the defence to be marshalled by Norwood captain Alex Georgiou, who will benefit from the experience of fellow Redleg Jace Bode and talented Double Blues backman Kory Beard inside the Croweaters' defensive 50m arc.

"It's very exciting," Cornes said of the clash with the Sandgropers.

"You know that whenever you go to Western Australia, it is going to be a hard game. It (Lathlain Park) is a big ground and you know that they (WAFL) will have quick, talented players you have to counter."



WA v SA State game history

Western Australia v South Australia (1904-2014) — Played 92 — WA 46 wins, SA 46 wins

WA and SA are locked at 46 wins a piece since their battles began over 110 years ago.

The Black Swans won the first encounter between the two States back in 1904, while the Croweaters had the most recent success – in 2012 at Gliderol Stadium in Glenelg.

Of their 92 clashes, 42 have been played in Western Australia and it is the home side who hold the advantage, having won 32 of those games.

From those 42 games, 31 were played at Subiaco Oval, six at Perth Oval, two at the WACA, two at Leederville Oval and one at Fremantle Oval.

This will be the first time WA and SA have met at Lathlain Park.

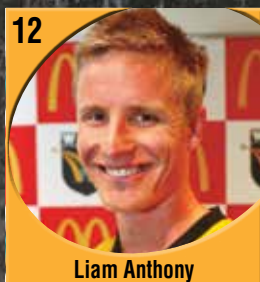

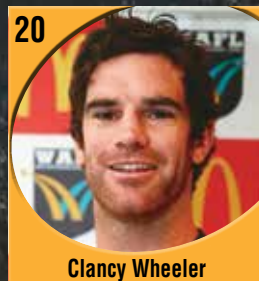

CARLTON DRAUGHT WAFL at a glance *By Chris Pike* ★



LIAM ANTHONY (East Fremantle) – Has returned after six years and 58 games with North Melbourne and been a prolific ball winner and potent with his precise and long-kicking skills. Averaging almost 25 touches a game and is among the most damaging players in the WAFL.

AARON BLACK (West Perth) – The reigning Sandover Medallist has again started 2015 strongly on the wing with 27 disposals a game as a hard running wingman. Played for WA in the win over Victoria in 2013 with 21 touches and two goals, and is a premiership player.

RYAN COOK (South Fremantle) – Following 80 VFL and 14 AFL games between Williamstown and Collingwood, joined South Fremantle in 2011 and has been a remarkably consistent midfielder winning two fairest and best awards, playing for WA three times and being captain of the Bulldogs since 2012.

RYAN DAVIS (Swan Districts) – Continues to be one of the most damaging players in the WAFL and generally when he plays well, Swan Districts win. Can win ball in midfield, tackles hard, runs and carries the ball and is a goalkicker. Experienced with 123 WAFL matches, 14 with West Coast and one for WA in 2014.

LACHLAN DELAHUNTY (Subiaco) – Injury has limited him to 20 matches in a season-and-a-half with Subiaco since joining from VFL club Frankston, but is a premiership player already and continues to be a hard-leading centre half-forward and pinch-hit ruckman with the Lions.

CORY DELL'OLIO (South Fremantle) – First season back with South Fremantle after three years with Essendon. Small forward has kicked 14 goals in six games, including four against East Perth. Has 123 goals in 64 WAFL games including a premiership and previous appearance for WA.

ASHTON HAMS (South Fremantle) – One of the more decorated current WAFL players having won a State game and grand final Simpson Medal, played in two premierships and nearing 150 games with South Fremantle. The 28-year-old is having another strong season averaging almost 27 touches a game.

PAUL JOHNSON (East Perth) – Continues to be the premier ruckman in the WAFL since arriving at East Perth in 2012 on the back of a 70-game AFL career with West Coast, Melbourne and Hawthorn. A true powerhouse, good tap ruckman and like another midfielder with a dynamite left-foot kick.

LEIGH KITCHIN (Subiaco) – The 24-year-old has made an immediate impact in the WAFL with Subiaco after crossing from VFL club Frankston and is showing the way in the league-leading Lions midfield averaging almost 24 disposals a match.

BRENDAN LEE (East Perth) – Captained WA to a win over the NEAFL in 2014. The East Perth co-captain is having another strong season as a terrific ball-winner in the midfield averaging over 23 touches despite injury limiting him to just the five matches.

RYAN NEATES (Claremont) – Former West Coast small man has become a leader in the Claremont midfield and has started the 2015 season strongly averaging over 23 disposals. Has turned himself from a small forward to prime on-baller and will represent WA for a second time.

SHANE NELSON (West Perth) – Continues to build a remarkable career resume thanks to dominant and consistent performances in and under winning the hard ball. Is a premiership player, played for WA last year and won West Perth's last two fairest and bests. Averaging 32 touches a game this year.

TONY NOTTE (Swan Districts) – Is a consistent and versatile big man capable of taking a mark and kicking goals up forward or being a competitive and athletic ruckman. Outstanding reader of the ball coming in as a defender. Has played 147 matches with Swan Districts, two with West Coast and one for WA.

BROCK O'BRIEN (East Fremantle) – Has settled back into his customary role as a damaging and long-kicking defender after a run in 2011 and 2012

as a forward where he kicked 51 and 43 goals respectively. Former Docker is an expert at setting up play off half-back when given space to use his left boot.

CHRIS PHELAN (Subiaco) – Started career as a defender but now is one of the best and most consistent midfielders in the competition. Has played more than 100 games, is a premiership player and is again averaging almost 25 possessions a game in 2015 for league-leading Subiaco.

MARLON PICKETT (South Fremantle) – Burst onto the scene late in 2013 with outstanding athleticism, pace and skill. Struggled to find best position and form in 2014 but has settled across half-back in 2015 where he can use all of his natural gifts to full effect and is proving to be a natural in his new role.

DARREN RUMBLE (Subiaco) – The most successful player in Subiaco's history having now played in five premierships during a 219-game career that began in 2003. Along the way has previously played for WA on four occasions and continues to perform rock solidly for the Lions at full back.

JUSTIN SIMPSON (Swan Districts) – Began 144-game career as a centre half-forward and kicked five goals in a preliminary final on way to premiership with Swan Districts, but now is one of the best defenders in the WAFL who reads the ball and chops it off well, is a strong mark and precision kick.

ANDREW STRIJK (West Perth) – Veteran of more than 150 matches with West Perth and the premiership player continues to be at his damaging best as an accurate and long kick equally effective off half-back, or going forward. Played three times for WA and 13 games with West Coast.

AIDAN TROPIANO (Perth) – Was a solid midfielder with East Fremantle before crossing to Perth midway through last season and ever since has been the team's best player. This year has turned into a clearance machine averaging 33 possessions a game.

WAYDE TWOMEY (Subiaco) – Now in his second season with Subiaco after winning a State game Simpson Medal and premiership with Swan Districts. Starred in the Lions' 2014 flag and continues to lead the way with precision ball use off half-back. Played with Carlton, Werribee and North Ballarat.

KIRK UGLE (Swan Districts) – In his third season back with Swan Districts after time on Collingwood's AFL list and has consolidated himself as one of the best small defenders in the WAFL equally capable of stopping dangerous forwards as setting up play on his trusty left boot.

CLANCY WHEELER (Subiaco) – Has become one of the most versatile WAFL players equally effective as a key forward target, pinch-hitting ruckman and key defender. Best suited to splitting time as a forward and ruckman. A premiership player who did well in only previous appearance for WA in 2013.

BLAYNE WILSON (South Fremantle) – First season back full-time in the WAFL following time on West Coast's list. Played in last two grand finals for East Perth but has been outstanding with South Fremantle in 2015 averaging 21 touches and seven marks controlling play across half-back.

SHANE YARRAN (Subiaco) – First played in the WAFL last year and was terrific kicking 39 goals helping Subiaco to win the premiership. The dangerous, versatile and elusive forward has gone to another level in 2015 having now kicked 30 goals in just seven matches to be the clear leading goalkicker.

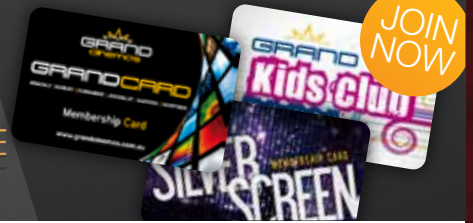

WEST END SANFL at a glance

KORY BEARD (Sturt) - Arguably the best utility in the competition, Beard is influential at either end of the ground. Stationed mainly in defence with the Double Blues but often gets thrown forward to change the course of a match with his exceptional marking power.

JONATHON BEECH (West Adelaide) - Beech trained with the Crows last summer but was unlucky to miss out on AFL selection after establishing himself as one of the SANFL's most consistent forwards. Strong overhead for his size, Beech is also an accurate kick for goal.

JACE BODE (Norwood) - The long-kicking left-footer will again provide valuable experience in defence for the West End State side. An extremely vocal leader, Bode can play on both tall and small forwards while also providing rebound from the backline.

JAMES BOYD (Woodville-West Torrens) - A regular in the West End State team, Boyd is a ball magnet who thrives at winning clearances for his side. The hard-running midfielder loves rolling up his sleeves on the inside while also carrying the footy on the outside.

IAN CALLINAN (Adelaide) - A classy small forward who is equally adept at kicking goals on either side of his body, Callinan doesn't need much of the ball to create serious damage. Helped swing momentum back in the SANFL's favour with an outstanding second term in last year's clash with the VFL.

JOEL CROSS (South Adelaide) - The Magarey Medallist has been in red-hot form this year with his ability to win the ball in close while also having an impact on the scoreboard. Set to be an important cog in the SANFL midfield, Cross boats an outstanding work ethic.

BRETT EDDY (South Adelaide) - Looked at closely by AFL clubs at the end of last season, Eddy uses his natural leap to take regular towering marks. Also a nice set-shot for goal, the key forward likes to work his way up the ground as well as being dangerous near the goalsquare.

ALEX GEORGIU (Norwood) - Returned from AFL club Melbourne to captain Norwood this year and hasn't missed a beat in the Redlegs' back six. Nicknamed 'Presti' due to his ability to spoil like former Collingwood defender Simon Prestigiacomo, Georgiou will likely stand the WAFL's best key forward.

BEN HANSEN (Sturt) - Made his debut in the West End SANFL team last year and certainly didn't look out of place. A clever small forward who also loves to chase down opposition defenders inside the Croweaters' attacking 50m arc.

LUKE JARRAD (Woodville-West Torrens) - A veteran of the SANFL State team, Jarrad can be used deep in defence or on the wing as he provides plenty of drive with his penetrating left-foot. Poised under pressure, Jarrad's experience will be invaluable when the game is on the line.

TOM KEOUGH (West Adelaide) - Set to make his debut in the West End SANFL team, Keough has emerged as one of the league's most reliable key defenders. Aged 23, Keough is 194cm and 91kg and has an ability to blanket his opponent while finding the ball for his team.

ZANE KIRKWOOD (Sturt) - Winner of the Fos Williams Medal last year as South Australia's best player, Kirkwood will be a key player in the Croweaters' midfield battery. Boasts an incredible engine which ensures he has a continual impact on the game from the centre square.

ANGUS KURTZE (Sturt) - The Double Blues bigman has waited a long time to make his State debut at age 29. Considered one of the best ruckmen in the competition, Kurtze not only gets his hands to the ball first at stoppages but has improved his game around the ground.



NICK LIDDLE (South Adelaide) - An industrious midfielder who loves finding the ball at the bottom of the packs. A neat-kicking left-footer, Liddle - a three-time best-and-fairest winner - also loves a goal when resting in attack.

LACHLAN MCGREGOR (Woodville-West Torrens) - A spring-heeled small forward who loves to take an eye-catching mark despite standing at just 174cm. Set to make his debut in the West End SANFL team, McGregor also uses his speed to apply valuable defensive pressure.

MARLON MOTLOP (North Adelaide) - The smooth-moving utility should relish his return to Perth after previously lining up with WAFL clubs Swan Districts and Peel. Loves to run and carry the football which should ensure Motlop is an extremely valuable player on the expanses of Lathlain Park.

JASON PORPLYZIA (West Adelaide) - The experienced campaigner has enjoyed an outstanding start to the season with the Bloods after retiring from the AFL having played 130 games and kicked 181 goals for Adelaide. Will present a danger and be a constructive influence in bursts through the centre.

LEIGH RYSWYK (North Adelaide) - Rywysk has averaged a goal a game across 178 matches with the Roosters. The 30-year-old could be used on a wing or as a lead-up forward, a role he performed well when kicking six majors for the West End SANFL team in 2013.

CHRIS SCHMIDT (West Adelaide) - West Adelaide's captain missed last year's State match against the VFL with injury. Regularly polls well in the Magarey Medal due to his ability to find the ball through the midfield while also marking strongly for his deceptive stature of 189cm and 87kg.

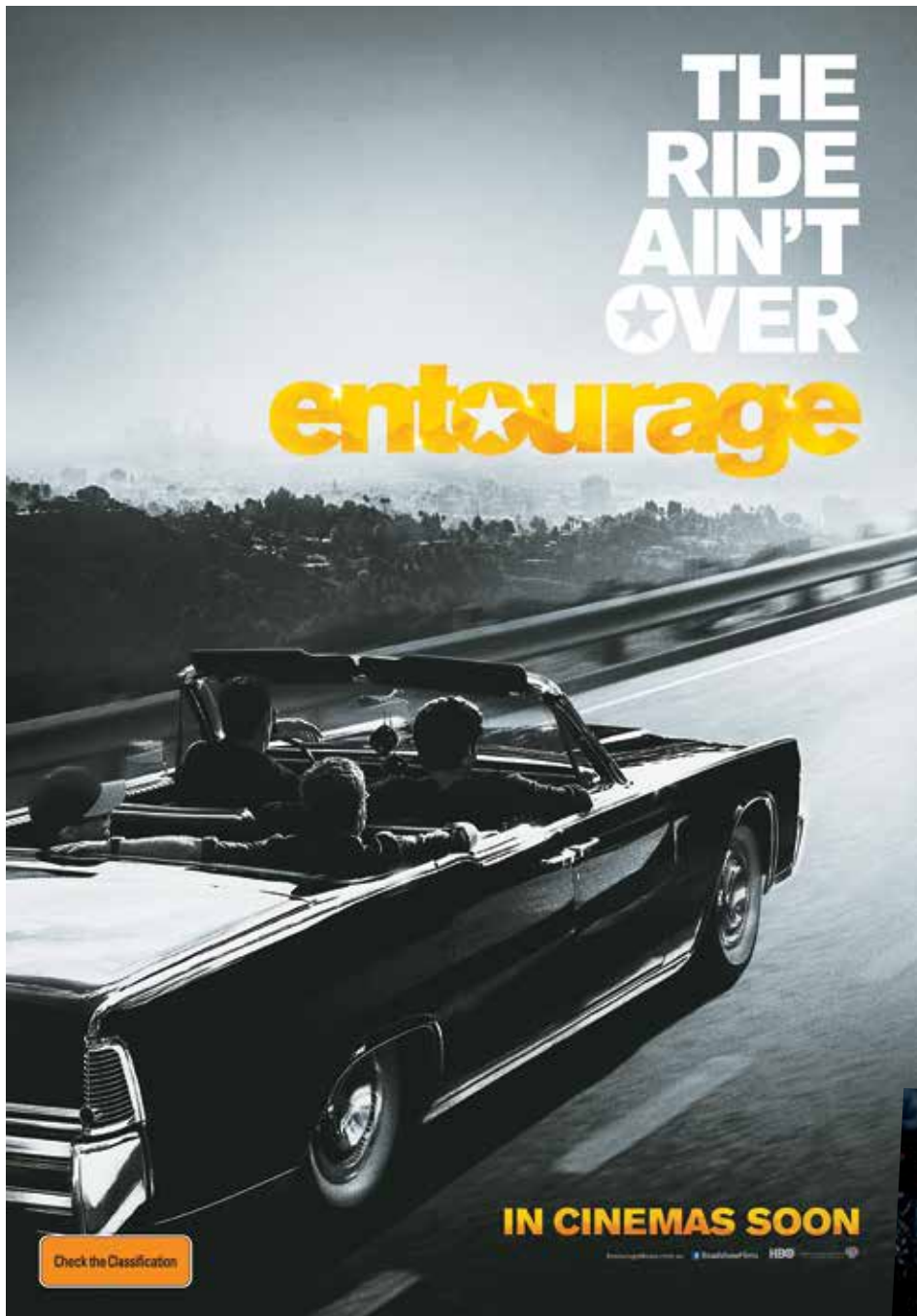
STEVEN SUMMERTON (Port Adelaide) - Summerton relishes the opportunity to represent his State and display his talent at a high level. The Magpies' loyal captain can play in the middle of the ground or on a wing such is his ability to find the ball with ease while also contributing on the scoreboard.

PAUL THOMAS (Central District) - Thomas has played more games, 254, than any other player in the SA team. Aged 32, the Bulldogs' co-captain has flagged this could be his last State match so expect the veteran to be his desperate self across half-back.

MICHAEL NEWTON (Norwood) - The high-flying key forward loves to take a strong mark whether it be on the lead or in a contested situation. The former Melbourne Demon, who is Norwood's focal point in attack, is itching to take his chance with the West End SANFL team.

RYAN WILLITS (West Adelaide) - A late addition to the West End SANFL squad, Willits is likely to relieve Angus Kurtze in the ruck while also spending time as a marking target in attack. The strongly-built 28-year-old can also play as a key defender such is his versatility.

MATTHEW PANOS (Norwood) - Winner of the Jack Oatey Medal as best afield in last year's SANFL Grand Final, Panos has forged a reputation as one of the best clearance players in the competition. Standing at 192cm and 90kg, Panos loves throwing his weight around at the stoppages while also hitting the scoreboard with his neat finishing skills.

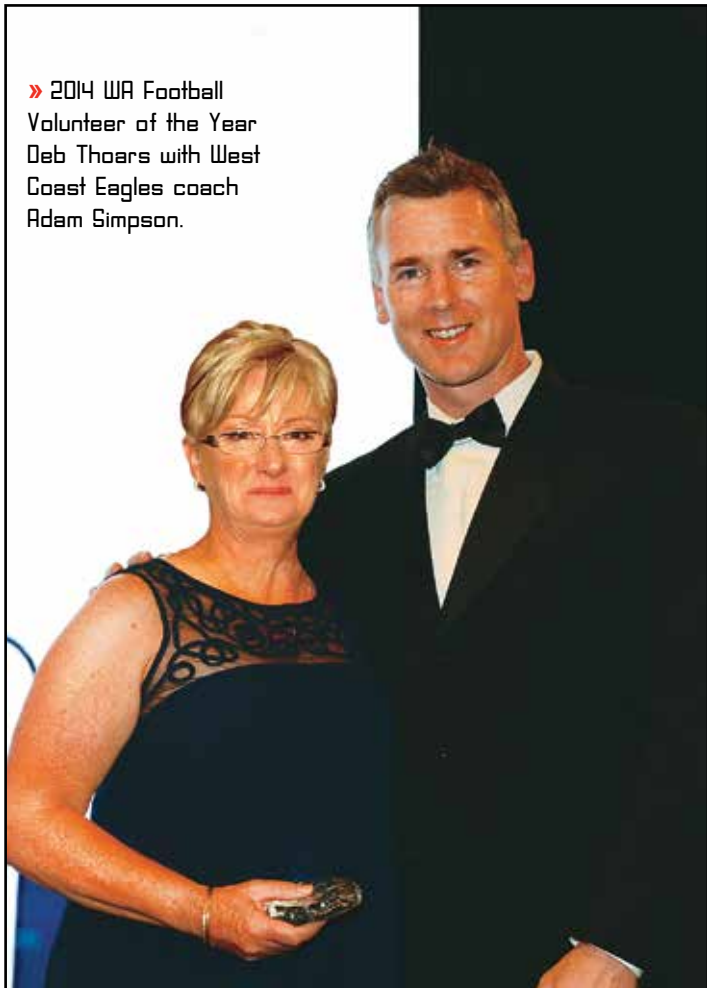

The best 50 female players, including number one draft pick Emma King from Western Australia, will be playing in the match which is a highlight of the 100 Years of Female Football.

South Fremantle assistant coach and 2013 Football Woman of the Year Michelle Cowan returns to coach the Demons while AFLQ Female Football High Performance Manager and Collingwood premiership player Craig Starcevich will coach the Bulldogs for the first time.

King was selected by the Western Bulldogs with the first pick at the 2015 AFL Women's Draft as one of three WA players chosen in the top five and a total of 15 selected to compete in this year's AFL Women's Matches.

King became WA's second consecutive top draft pick and also the second from WAWFL club Coastal Titans after teammate Tiah Haynes was selected with the top pick at last year's draft.

North Fremantle award their best on ground player the Drew Herrington medallion, while Fremantle CBC has the sought-after Tetley-Naylor medal.

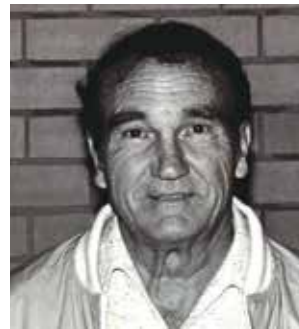
North Fremantle President Tony Misich said the games were played hard and were always great contests.

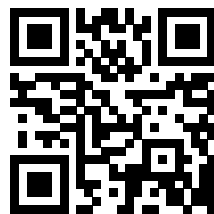

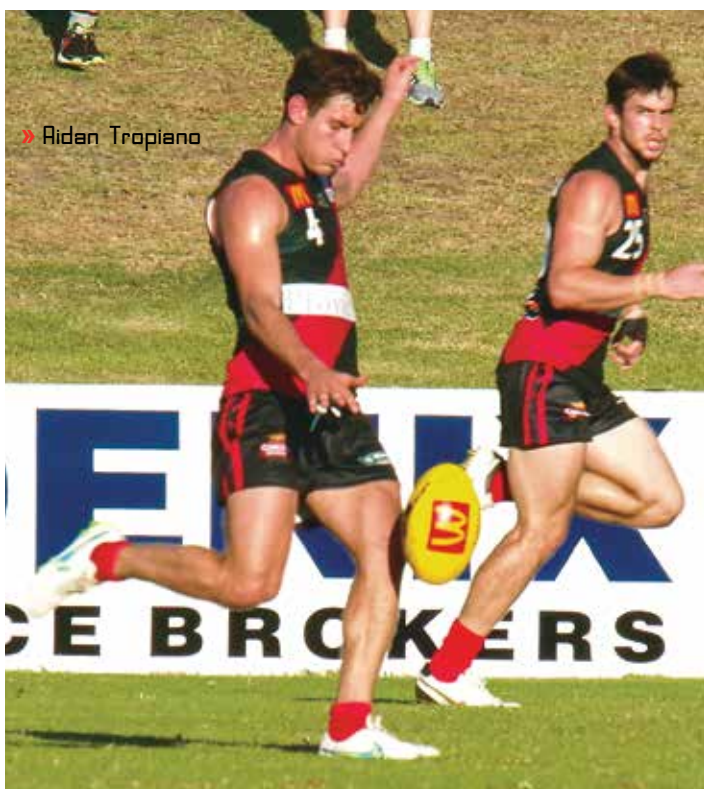
