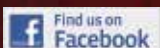

SANDOVER

contenders in finals

Some of the favourites for this year's Sandover Medal will be in action this semi-final weekend as two teams fight for survival and the other two fight for direct entry into this year's grand final.

Subiaco's Chris Phelan, West Perth's Shane Nelson, East Perth's Paul Johnson and Peel's Jacob Ballard and are all considered good chances to take home the most prestigious individual honour in the WAFL when the count is conducted on Monday, September 21 ahead of the WAFL grand final on Sunday, September 27.

Phelan played every game of the home-and-away season and finished among the top 10 disposal getters with an average of 24 touches.

Nelson, who finished equal second in last year's count with 46 votes, one behind Sandover Medal winner and teammate Aaron Black, averaged 29 possessions this year. While Black also had a remarkable season a reprimand in Round 4 makes him ineligible.

Johnson is a sheer workhorse. The ruckman was second in the league for hit outs and his work rate in the ruck and around the ground makes him one of the most valuable big men in the competition. Ryan Turnbull was the last Royals player, and also the last ruckman, to win the Medal.

Ballard helped the Thunder roll into their first ever finals series on the back of a stellar season. The Fremantle rookie list player averaged 27 disposals and could become the first player since Matt Priddis in 2006 to win a Sandover Medal while on an AFL list.

Two of the other leading contenders, according to the Football Budget's panel of tipsters, hail from teams outside of this year's final five – Perth's Aidan Tropiano and South Fremantle's Ashton Hams.

Tropiano and Hams finished first and second respectively when it came to amassing disposals during season 2015. Topiano averaged 32 touches and played every game this year, while Hams averaged 30 from his 19 outings.

Despite their magnetism for the ball, the pair also attracted the umpires' attention when it came to receiving free kicks. They ranked in the top two for free kicks given, with Hams being awarded 66 free kicks and Tropiano 54.

Hindering their success will be the number of wins they played in. Perth only won two games this season and South Fremantle eight.

However, last year West Perth had won just nine games and still produced the Sandover Medal winner in Black.

West Perth's Andrew Strijk and Marcus Adams, Subiaco's Sam Menegola, East Perth's Brendan Lee, Claremont's Ryan Neates, Swan Districts' Ryan Davis and Matt Riggio, Perth's Liam McKenna, Peel's Tendai Mzungu, East Fremantle's Rory O'Brien and South Fremantle's Haiden Schloithe are also predicted to finish high up in the count.

COLLECTABLES

During 2015, the Football Budget will again feature a section on WAFL memorabilia and invites you to write or email if you want more information about the football collectables you have tucked away at home.

Though storage space at my house is at a premium because of my years of collecting, I just can't resist a nice poster.

There's barely a square inch of uncovered wall for me to hang them anymore, but long-time collector Rick recently put his posters up for sale and I simply couldn't say "no".

Among the lot he was offering were some great 1980s posters that have previously appeared in this column, like a Kentuck caricature poster featuring an early 1980s Claremont team.

But there are a couple that really caught my eye.

The first was a beauty, featuring Michael Mitchell's stepladder mark against Subiaco at Subiaco Oval in 1985. How this mark isn't talked about more often is beyond me. That aside, the poster is really attractive and was actually an advertisement for an international student card that could get you cheap entry to the footy at the time.

The other posters that interested me were issued by Nabisco in 1970.

The American food giant was the maker of Weeties and offered eight different WAFL posters that season. But you had to fill in a coupon and send away for each of them.

Previously, I've seen two full collections of the Nabisco posters – one belonging to Pat, of Shelley, and another belonging to East Perth supporter Steve.

Those I bought from Rick were, unfortunately, badly faded by the sunlight and were also block-mounted on chipboard that was starting to disintegrate, stripping much of the value from them. But several hours of restoration work has seen them brought back to a fit state for the wall.

Where I'm going to find the space is another thing entirely!

I have often written in this column about the collectability of items that are connected



to high-profile events in the WAFL's history.

One of my favourite items, for instance, is the humble menu. You'll find them at club award nights, the Sandover Medal count, the Hall of Fame induction nights, the 200 Club annual functions and at countless other football events.

Over the past few years, I reckon I've featured most of these in Collectables at one time or another.

But what I haven't written about is the other items that have been given out at such functions.

In the past few years, most of them have been connected to the iconic Burley Sekem company.

For instance, at the WA Football Hall of Fame function a few months back, one lucky person at each table was given a full-size Burley football with the names of this year's eight inductees printed on it.

Perhaps of more interest to most collectors (largely because of their size) are the football keyrings that have been given to all guests at the Sandover Medal function each year.

In my collection, I have the 2009, 2010, 2013 and 2014 keyrings.

I also have one for the 2008 grand final, so I'm now wondering whether anyone is able to tell me whether these have been issued at subsequent grand finals?

And when did Burley start doing them for the Sandover Medal night?

Unfortunately, it's been a long time since the Demons were particularly mighty.

But this banner, re-discovered recently in a West Perth supporter's shed, almost certainly dates to an era when Perth really was at the top of the heap – the 1970s.

It featured this week on the "Lost WAFL" Facebook page, which was started by a passionate Swan Districts supporter and includes snippets of interest from the bygone days of the WAFL.

As for the banner, I reckon it's a beauty and the demon caricature reminds me of the one that featured recently in this column on the front of a book called Perth Players 1970.

The question, though, is where did it come from?

It measures about 3m x 1m and the owner seemed to think it might have come out of a pub.

Other Lost WAFL users thought the pub most likely to have displayed a Demons banner was the old Hurlingham Hotel, which opened on Canning Highway in South Perth in 1930 and was redeveloped as Rosie O'Grady's in 1997.

Finally, my thanks to Mark for coming through with a couple of annual reports I had been seeking.

Mark had in his collection a Swan Districts 2012 report and the Claremont reports for 1976 and 1978 that he was prepared to let go.

To complete my collection back to 1970, I'm still looking for South Fremantle 1971-1978, 1981, 1984 and 1991. I'm also after East Perth 1975 and 1981, Claremont 1972, 1974, 1975 and 1977 and Swan Districts 1970-1979.

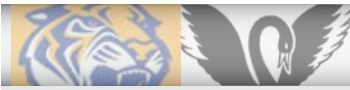

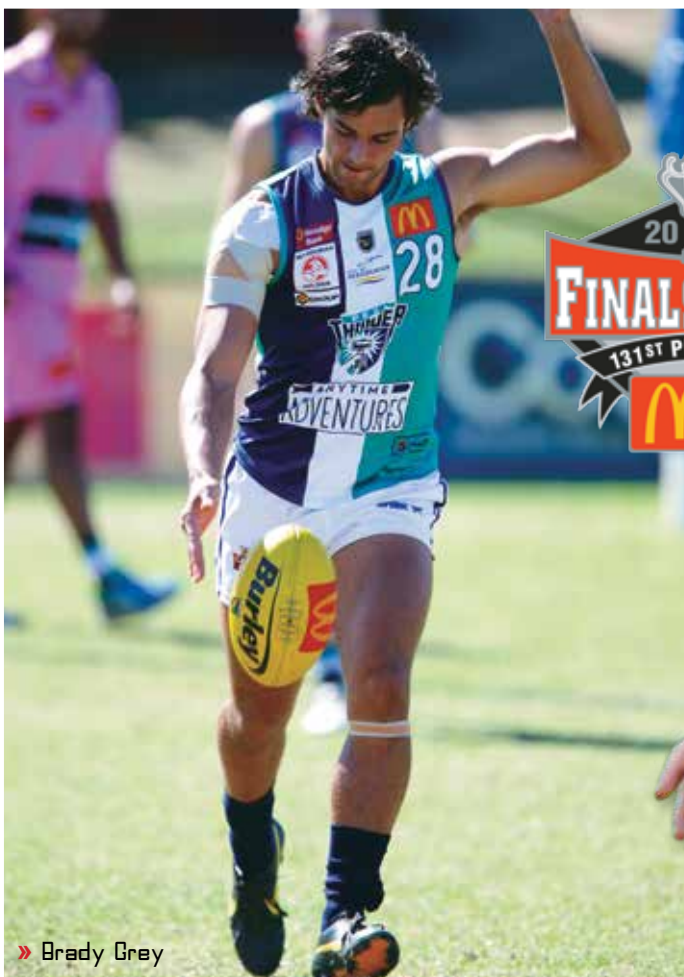
Shane Yarran, this year's Bernie Naylor medallist, is tough to subdue for the entire 120 minutes and can bob up as a damaging forward target at any time.

Chris Phelan, Sam Menegola, Leigh Kitchin and captain Kyal Horsley are troublesome through midfield – as a group or on their own.

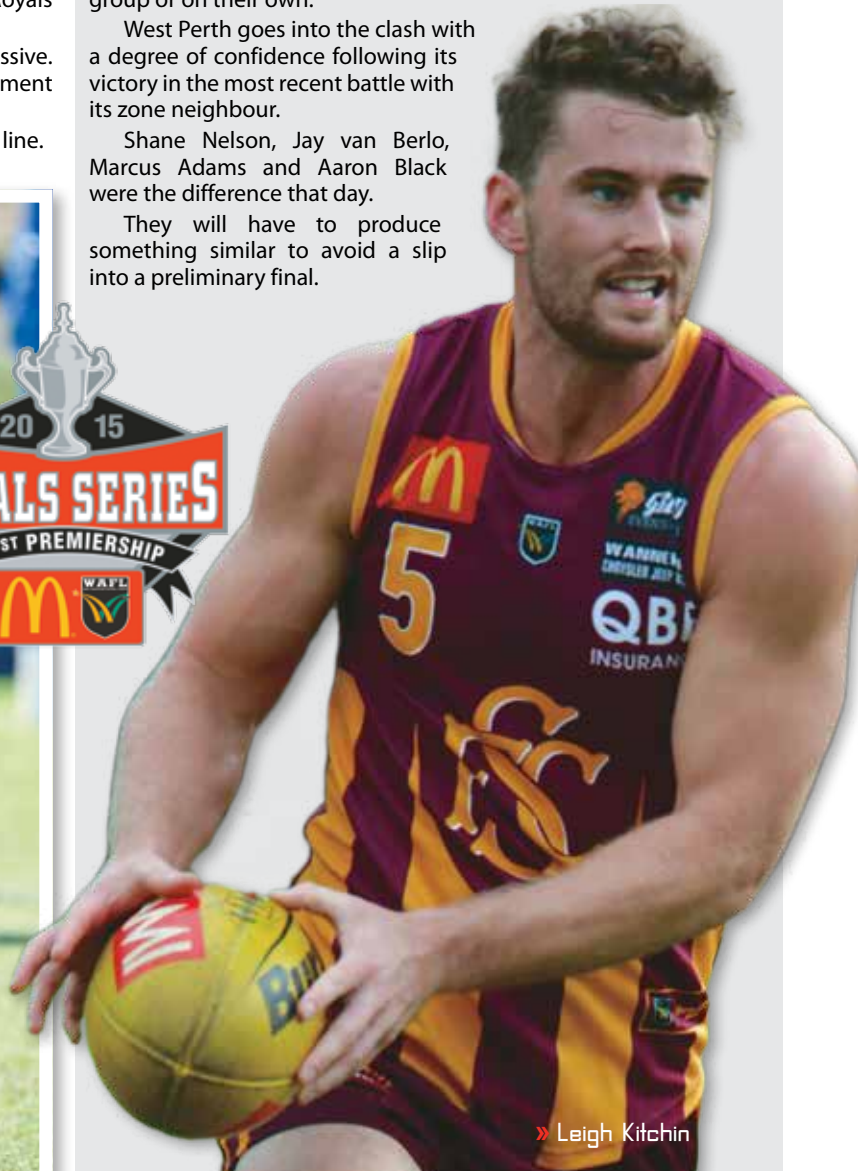
West Perth goes into the clash with a degree of confidence following its victory in the most recent battle with its zone neighbour.

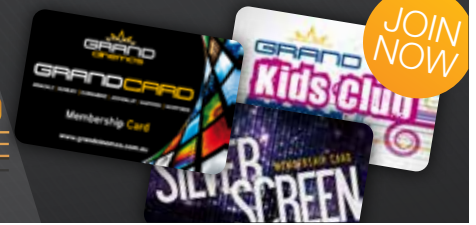
