# No place like home for Falcons

***For almost 20 years West Perth has been living in someone else's house.***

Arena Joondalup might have been the club's base since late 1993 but for Falcons fans a controversial long-term commercial arrangement with the facility's manager has meant the northern suburbs ground has lacked a homely feel.

The stadium has also been without some of the mod-cons treated as the norm at rival WAFL clubs.

Compounding the problem was the angst of seeing West Perth's spiritual ground, Medibank Stadium, turned into a centre of excellence for enemies East Perth and Subiaco.

Soon the Falcons will have an elite 2000sqm complex to call their own. With the financial assistance of the State Government and City of Joondalup, they have won the right to have a plot of land on which to build a new \$8 million nest. The club rooms, to be built near the main gate at the Arena, will again galvanise the West Perth community but also boost the potential of its playing products.

On the ground floor will be change and weights rooms, coaches' facilities and improved player recovery areas up to AFL standard, meaning Arena Joondalup could be used as a senior level training venue.

A flight of stairs up the Falcons will have a function room and members' bar – something sadly missing under the current arrangement – platforms for their 127 seasons of memorabilia and administrative areas.

No longer will the West Perth faithful believe they are borrowing space at Arena Joondalup. They will have place they can truly call home.

But club president Brett Raponi said the new complex was not just a victory for the WAFL outfit. As one of the nine clubs responsible for developing the game in zones throughout the State, the Falcons will also use the clubrooms to benefit the district.

"This is obviously big for the West Perth Football Club but I think it is big for the WAFL. It shows the WAFL is still very relevant in the community for a footy club to attract such strong government support," Raponi said.

"The City of Joondalup sees it not as just a great facility for the footy club but for the area. The region doesn't have sizable function rooms in the area. It is a bit like Peel. Mandurah needed the Thunder's new function areas as much as Peel did.

"Most of our junior clubs don't have big enough areas for their own quiz nights and fairest and best nights so they can make the most of this facility."

"We will no longer be at the beck and call of our landlord.

"It will give West Perth a soul and a thumping heartbeat. It gives us somewhere where we can believe. It will be a football facility on match-day and a community facility during the week.

And it will help our players."

There can be no denying the Falcons' right to have a patch in the northern suburbs. Since moving to the multi-purpose Arena Joondalup the club has fostered a raft of talent from the region.

Captain Jason Salecic and senior midfielder Ray Bartholomew are from Quinns Districts, Jay van Berlo came up through Whitfords, defender Luke Tedesco advanced from Wanneroo, Shane Nelson is a graduate of Edgewater/Woodvale and Ocean Ridge is Anthony Tsalikis' junior club.

Only Claremont used more locally-produced players in league teams last season.

The Falcons players will benefit from a new lounge area and audio visual/computer room to enhance their pre and post-match analyses.

"It will help the squad build camaraderie and a team spirit. The guys believe they have lacked that space," Raponi said.

"But in the end this is a facility that will benefit all 4500 juniors in our district. And we'll feel as though we have a real sporting club."

**During 2013, the Football Budget will again feature a section on WAFL memorabilia and invites you to write or email if you want more information about the football collectables you have tucked away at home.**



### Welcome to season 2013 and another year of WAFL Collectables.

As in each of the past two years, this column will run every week in the Football Budget and will feature a huge cross-section of collectables related to the WAFL.

This week, I'm going to start by highlighting some of the interesting items which popped up for sale over summer, along with the prices paid.

One of the first items to sell – three days after the Grand Final – was a rare South Fremantle urchin, modelled on the cartoon character by the late Paul Rigby.

The Darbyshire urchin, though damaged, sold for \$1000 at auction. Another urchin, in Perth colours, sold at auction recently and I will report the price in an upcoming column.

And, yet another South Fremantle urchin, this one in great condition, is currently being offered for sale for \$1800. There have been no bites at that price.

One of my favourite WAFL collectables is the set of ice cream tins that Peters made back in the 1960s. Featuring football scenes on the body of the tin, the lid was issued in eight different colour schemes – one for each of the traditional clubs.

A total of six tins appeared for sale over summer; a surprise given I hadn't seen any for some time.

Each sold for between \$110 and \$160, which is much more than they had previously fetched.

One of the more unusual items to be offered for sale was a West Perth players' bag from the mid-1970s, which was sold privately.

The bag belonged to a league player and featured an old West Perth Cardinals logo on the side. It sold for \$250, which included a woollen West Perth sweater.



And, of course, there were plenty of programs which were dug out of sheds and cupboards during spring cleaning.

One of the more interesting programs was from the game between South Fremantle and Collingwood in 1978, which sold for \$134. A 1977 Ardath Cup program from the match between South Fremantle and Sturt fetched \$145.

I'll feature some more highlights of the summer sales in next week's column.



Regular readers of this column might remember that last year a rare nine-carat gold medal from 1912/13 appeared at auction and sold for \$420.

The medal was awarded to WAFL president John Orr (the brother of long-standing WAFL secretary Billy) when he was made an honorary life member of the league.

Just how this single medal came to end up being sold by a Perth dealer is unknown. Certainly, Orr's family did not know when they made contact with me late last year.

But they have since sold off some of his other medals and memorabilia, including a 15-carat gold Perth Football Club badge, dated 1909, and a 1921 Perth membership badge.

Other items sold included a book called "Football, which was written by the renowned long-kicking St Kilda forward Dave McNamara in 1914, and an "RFC" medal, which was presented to Mr Orr for "all round play" in 1888. My research suggests RFC was probably the Rainbow Football Club from the Carlton area of Melbourne.



But the highlight of the collection, though not strictly a WAFL collectable, was a gold pocket watch from 1890. It was inscribed: "Presented to John Orr by the South Melbourne Football Club. Season 1890. To commemorate his connection with the Premier team of Victoria." Football memorabilia from the 19th century is rare, to say the least.

Orr, who died in 1938, aged 69, played for South Melbourne before venturing west in the mid-1890s. Here, he played for Rovers (the forerunner to Perth Football Club) and was also a well-known umpire.

The above memorabilia was sold privately and the prices were confidential. But I believe the pieces were sold to local collectors.



Again, regular readers of this column might recall I wrote last year about an Old Easts cushion which went to auction in August and sold for \$100.

Made by the Shell oil company, most likely in the 1970s, I had never seen the cushion design before and wondered whether they also came in the colours of the other seven clubs.

Long-time West Perth supporter Kathleen answered that question in the affirmative when she contacted me over summer to tell me about her West Perth cushion.

It was in pretty good nick, though it had split in a few places. And Kathleen said she wouldn't part with it, regardless of the \$100 price tag.

Now that we know there were East Fremantle and West Perth versions, we can be almost certain there were six others. Can anyone help with photographs?

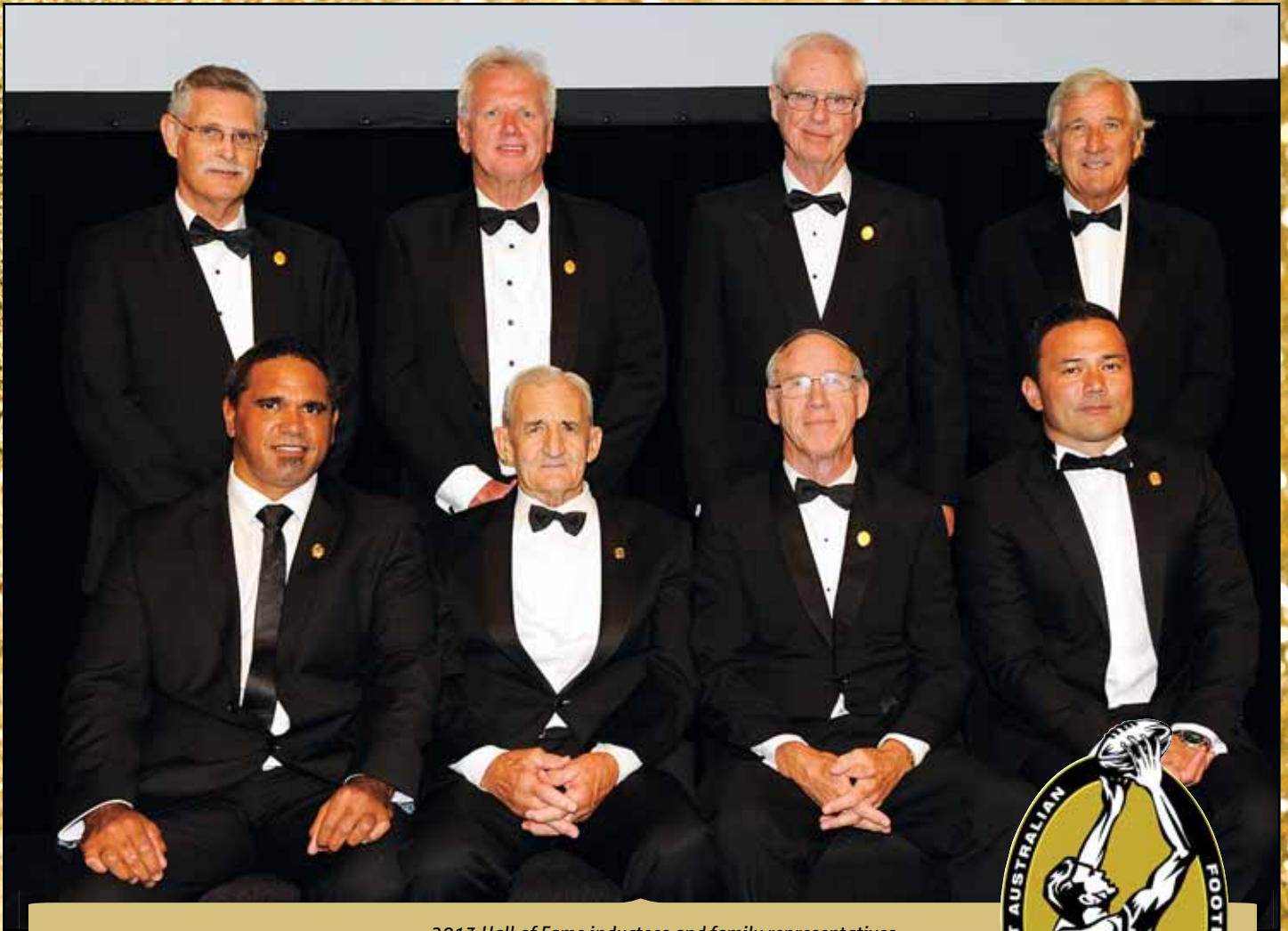
Mt Zion is a family-oriented story starring Walker in his acting debut alongside Temuera Morrison (Once Were Warriors, River Queen).

Denis Marshall was also elevated to the status of Legend where he joined Barry Cable, George Doig, Graham "Polly" Farmer, Merv

McIntosh, Steve Marsh, George Moloney, Graham Moss, Jack Sheedy, John Todd, WJ "Nipper" Truscott, Bill Walker, Stan "Pops" Heal, Haydn Bunton Jnr and Phil Matson as one of the most admired men to have played our great game.

## The 2013 inductees:

### *Peter Bell*

**Games: 338 (South Fremantle 49, Fremantle 163, North Melbourne 123, WA 3)**

Born on Cheju Island, South Korea, the son of a Korean mother and an American father and adopted when he was just three days old by

an Australian couple working at the local Catholic mission, Peter Bell grew up in Kojonup in South Fremantle's country zone.

He honed his football skills at Aquinas College before making his debut for South Fremantle at the age of 18 in 1994.

A member of the inaugural Fremantle squad, he was delisted after playing two games in his first AFL season but went on to become one of Western Australia's greatest football products with monumental achievements at two AFL clubs including his original in a redemptive return stint.





## Chris Lewis

**Player: 1986-2001**

**Games: 274 (Claremont 54, West Coast 215, WA 5)**

**Goals: 287 (Claremont 28, West Coast 259, WA 0)**

**Honours: Premiership player 1992, 1994 (West Coast), 1996 (Claremont), West Coast Club Champion 1990, All Australian 1990, West Coast Eagles Team 20 (2006) and Team 25 (2011), Indigenous Team of the Century 2005, West Coast Hall of Fame (Inaugural) 2011**

Sublime ball handling and disposal skills were evident early in Chris Lewis, an indigenous forward/ruck rover who earned the huge respect of his teammates for his team orientation, passion and commitment.

Lewis attended Christ Church Grammar School and his footballing ability was such that an exception was made to permit him to play in the First XVIII while in Year 10 (usually restricted to Year 11 and 12 boys). He made his debut with Claremont while still at Christ Church.

West Coast secured him as an inaugural squad member. As a 17 year old, Lewis was hot property. At 18 years and 12 days, he was the youngest West Coast debutant until Ben Cousins, 81 days younger, in 1996.

## George Young

**Player: 1969-1979**

**Games: 195 (Subiaco 77, St Kilda 108, WA 10)**

**Goals: 365 (Subiaco 72, St Kilda 284, WA 9)**

**Honours: All Australian 1972, St Kilda leading goalkicker 1975, 1976, 1977, 1978, Subiaco Team of the Century 2008, Subiaco Life Member 1992, Subiaco Diehard 2010**

George Young was a football product of the Wembley amateurs and it was his brother Robbie who persuaded him to bob up at Subiaco in 1969 looking for a game.

His performances in scratch matches indicated to the club that they had found a remarkable talent and he played every game bar one as a wingman with rare skill and poise.

He wrote to three clubs looking to further his career and it was St Kilda who answered in the affirmative and he went on to forge a remarkable career in Melbourne, starting in 1973. That year he confirmed his status as a player of rare class in the elimination final against Essendon when he gathered 25 kicks, took 14 marks and kicked six goals.

On returning to Perth Young was a selector and runner with West Perth (1983-84) and Claremont (1985). From 1986 to 1992 he was a vital member of Haydn Bunton's coaching panel at Subiaco as league runner and selector. He was made a Life Member at Subiaco in 1992 and then gave eight years of service at West Coast as a specialist coach and selector.

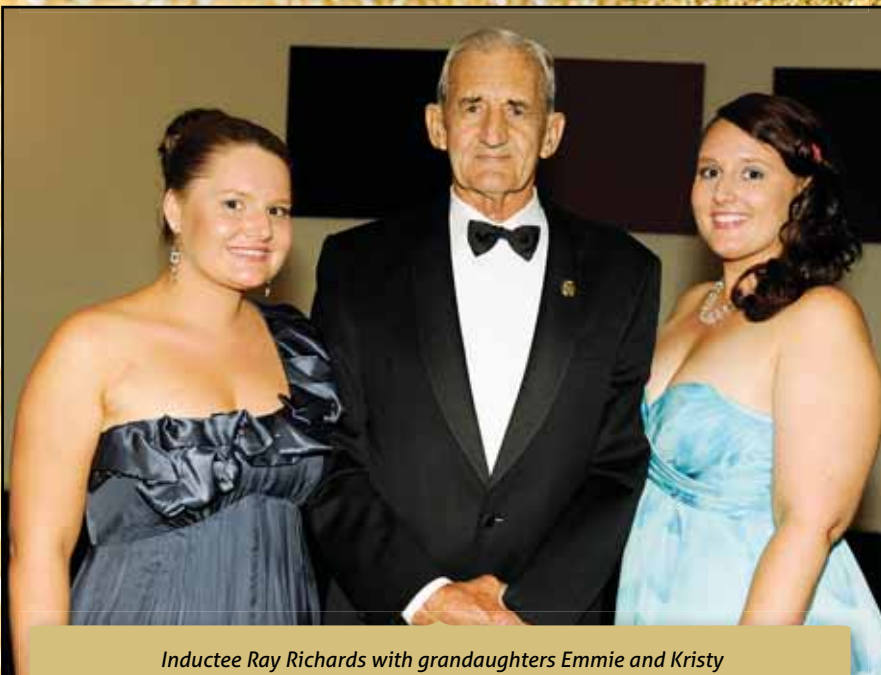

Full backs came no tougher or more uncompromising than Ray Richards, one of a cast of football royalty to emerge from the small south west timber town of Deanmill along with Sir Ross Hutchinson and John Todd.

Richards backed his toughness and courage with an enormous leap and brilliant high mark to become one of the outstanding players of his era.

He played 13 State games, several as vice captain, and was often named in the best players. He showed his versatility in a match against Victoria in 1957, when he was thrown into the ruck and kicked two goals in an impressive display.

WAFL football in the 1920's and 30's was graced with many spectacular aerialists but West Perth and later Claremont forward Frank Hopkins was regarded by many contemporaries as the best.

But he was much more than a freakish mark and in 15 seasons he established a brilliant record as a forward with nearly 600 goals at two clubs as well as a premiership player at both and represented Western Australia 12 times.

At East Fremantle, the club he co-founded, Wilson has been bestowed the rare honour of club Legend and his active involvement as either player or administrator for 32 consecutive years attests to his passion and commitment.

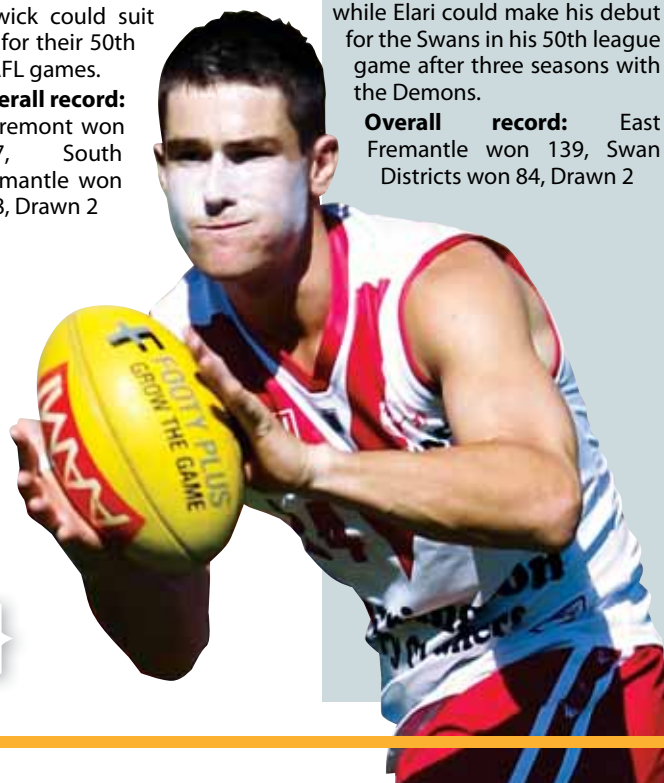

## Alignment forces movements

***There have been some forced movements in the WAFL this season with 2013 being the 'interim' year of the new WAFL Partnering Club model.***

Trading places between East Perth and Peel has been the first, important step in the model.

During the off-season, West Coast players based at the Thunder have been relocated to the Royals while Dockers players at Medibank Stadium have made the trek to the Mandurah-based team.

The Partnering Model will then come into play in 2014 for a minimum of five years and a major part of the agreement involves the Eagles and Dockers each paying an additional annual amount of \$450,000 to the West Australian Football Commission on top of their annual rent and royalties payments. For the past few years those rent and royalty payments combined have been in the vicinity of \$10million.

From 2014 all players on the Eagles list will be aligned to East Perth and all Dockers' listed players to Peel, allowing players not required at AFL level to train and play together in the same WAFL team.

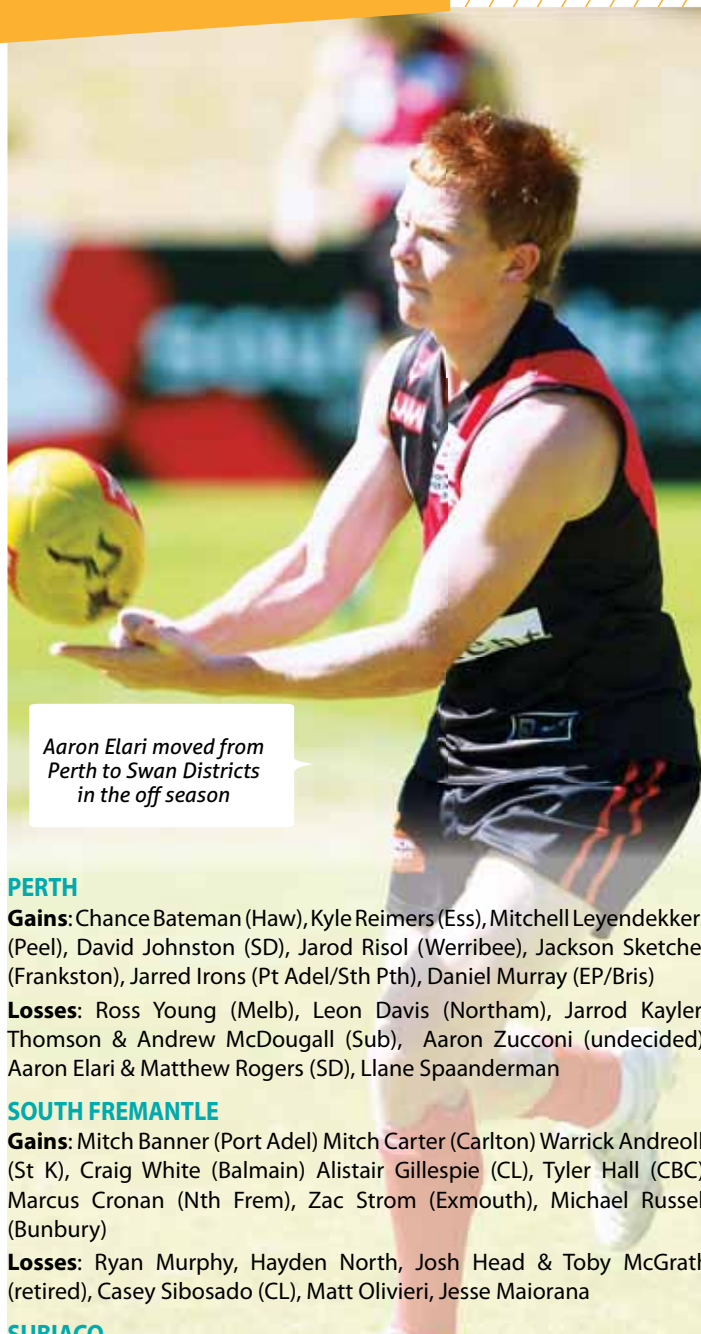

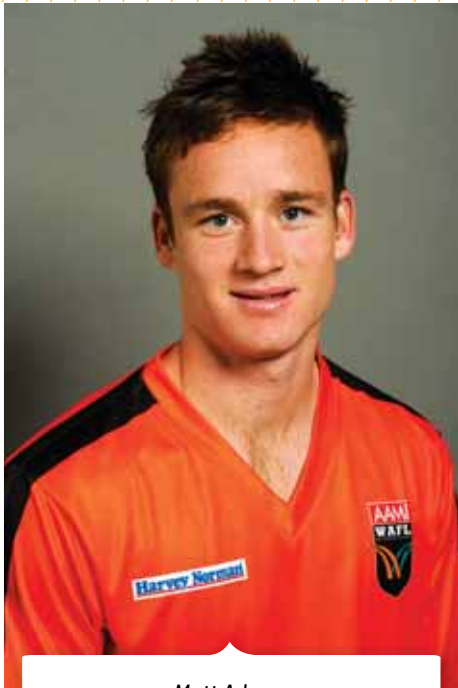

## Overhaul for amateur colts system

**After much deliberation, the WA Amateur Football League has increased the minimum age for colts from 19 to 20 years ahead of the 2013 season.**

The colts shall be a restricted age league and any person who attains the age of 21 years, is ineligible to play in any fixture of the competition.

WAAFL staff and board researched the matter over several months including conducting a "Colts Forum" and analysing data regarding junior trends, transfers and permits within colts, before making the final decision.

General Manager, David Armstrong supported the idea and said, "The age increase was introduced to prevent withdrawals, forfeits and the application of the 'even up' rule, to allow lower 17s/Year-12 teams to transition to colts, and allowed players the opportunity to play two seasons in colts."

"We acknowledge the transition of players from colts to senior grades is a club management matter, and clubs are expected to act in the best interests of their players."

The WAAFL maintains it is fundamental that players get to play 18 against 18 each weekend without byes and forfeit. The age increase is a practical and sustainable method of encouraging this.

The WAAFL will review the colts age, including the capping of teams, at the end of 2013 season.

More changes for the 2013 season include new additions to the WAAFL with Jon Carson, Cam Robbins, Luke Howard and Diana Versace joining the WAAFL Board.

The WAAFL Staff also has two new members, Sophie James and Georgina Gaff.

Sophie joined the WAAFL in early 2012 as Integrated Coordinator and in October 2012 moved into the Marketing and Media Officer

position dealing with WAAFL marketing and communications.

Georgina Gaff joined the WAAFL in early 2013, taking over as an Operations Assistant from Christina Dickie, providing assistance for football operations

The 2012 WA Amateur Football League season kicks off on April 13 for all grades and concludes with the B Grade and below grand finals on September 15 and the A Grade grand final on September 22.

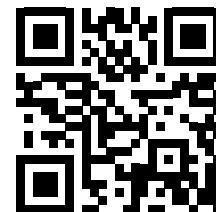

## Tigers and Sharks in revamped comp

**SEVERAL changes have been implemented for this, the third year of the national Foxtel Cup.**

The competition has been reduced from 16 teams to 10, will involve the top two teams from each of the WAFL, VFL and SANFL and all matches in Round 1, the semi-finals and the grand final will be played on Tuesday nights to maximise exposure for competing clubs and players.

The four leading teams from the Tasmanian Football League (TFL)/North East Australian Football League (NEAFL) will play qualifying matches to win the right to join the first round

of matches against the leading State league sides.

WAFL premier and reigning Foxtel Cup champions, Claremont, and grand final opponent East Fremantle will join 2012 SANFL grand finalists Norwood and West Adelaide and VFL grand finalists Werribee and Port Melbourne in the revamped format.

Queanbeyan, Southport, Burnie and the NT Thunder will play qualifying games to join the six leading sides in Round 1.

AFL General Manager National and International Development Andrew Dillon said the competition had been altered from



its 16-team format to a 10-team format, in recognition of the fact that the competition should complement the State League seasons and not compromise any team's pursuit of its State League premiership with too many extra matches.

An SANFL, VFL or WAFL side would now be required to win three knockout matches to claim the title, rather than four, while teams from the developing states will have the opportunity to play each other in qualifying matches, before progressing to play the more established sides.

"The Foxtel Cup will now have all the best state league teams on show, with the confirmation that SANFL premiers Norwood and runners-up West Adelaide will be part of the revised format," Mr Dillon said.

"The competition has its primary goals to provide opportunities for state league teams to increase their professionalism, while allowing further chances for state league players to push for opportunities with AFL clubs.

"In recognition of the altered format for the 2013 Foxtel Cup, the winning team will now claim a first prize of \$100,000.

All matches will again consist of four quarters each of eighteen (18) minutes set time, plus time-on from the last 3 minutes only (20 minutes approximately total per quarter), to lessen the load on players as well as to enable games to fit into a two-hour broadcast window.
