Serving two footy masters

The deal has been signed. For the next five WAFL seasons two teams in the local league will serve as alignment clubs for Fremantle and West Coast.

Easier said than done.

Just making the concept a reality prompted much blood-letting in WA football. The local league saw it is a case of the big boys in town encroaching on its turf. The Dockers and Eagles believed it was a win-win for the code throughout the State.

While the new arrangements between Fremantle-Peel and West Coast-East Perth can best be described as shotgun marriages, the clubs involved in the "host club" set-ups are determined to make the new system work – for all parties.

Season 2013 will be an interim year in the transition to the full alignment.

Fremantle players at East Perth have moved to Peel and West Coast squad members at the Thunder have shifted to the Royals. Scott Lycett, Blayne Wilson, Zac Clarke, Jayden Pitt and Hayden Crozier have been affected.

But from next season any Docker not required for AFL duty will be released to Peel and a similar policy will exist between the Eagles and Royals.

So how are the relationships going to work? While winning matches is the priority for both WAFL teams, fine-tuning their association with their respective AFL clubs is a key task in 2013.

It is significant, too, that Brian Dawson (East Perth) and Cam Shepherd (Peel) are in their first seasons at the helm. But each is following a different path in dealing with two masters.

Shepherd, the WAFL journeyman taking on the league's toughest coaching job by moving to a team that has finished last nine times in 17 years, has embraced the link to the Dockers.

When the Thunder came into the competition in 1997 they had too few concessions, which limited their capacity to be competitive.

But Peel captain Brendon Jones said working with the Dockers could help lift the Mandurah team up the ladder.

"It was a bit of a surprise but where we have been in the previous years we probably have needed (the alignment) more than any other club," Jones said.

Shepherd spent considerable time during the off-season putting systems in place to improve the communication between AFL and WAFL clubs.

"We've been working closely with Fremantle. Our list of Fremantle aligned players is probably younger than at East Perth," Shepherd said.

"So we have had to work pretty closely with Simon Lloyd and Ash Prescott in the way they do things and we've taken a fair bit of that to the table.

"It is not about me or our alignment with Fremantle, but more importantly it is about Peel maintaining its integrity. It is really an important point that we will remain focused that Peel Football Club stands alone.

"We did lose a lot of fringe league and reserves players because of the perceived opportunities due to the alignment but the Peel playing group has a strong bond. The side will be selected in consultation with Fremantle but on merit."

Dawson has had a strong relationship with the Eagles for more than 20 years, having worked for the club as a fitness and conditioning expert. He still consults to the club.

But he believes East Perth will have more autonomy on what it can do with its AFL talent.

"We'll take some of their style and elements on board, there is no doubt about that," Dawson said. "It would be silly not to accommodate some of the things they do.

"But there is no direction that we must play exactly the way they would like us to play. We have good licence over that.

"We have a fair bit of contact. I know the people there well and they know me pretty well so it works pretty well in that sense."

Leading goalkicker award

Matthew Johnson produced one of the best WAFL debuts in recent seasons by helping to kick West Perth to victory in their clash with East Perth at Arena Joondalup.

Johnson kicked six goals to be an early leader in the chase for the 2013 Bernie Naylor Medal.

Swan Tim Geappen also started the new campaign with a bang by notching a super six haul in attack.

But there was bad news for last year's WAFL leading goalkicker, Ben Saunders, from South Fremantle.

Saunders was injured in the Bulldogs' loss to Claremont and will miss more action in coming weeks.

Perth recruit Kyle Reimers made a strong return to the State league with three goals.

Rising Star

It took just 10 minutes for West Perth's Matthew Johnson to herald his arrival into the WAFL competition.

The 19-year-old from Whitfords kicked a goal early in his league debut and never looked back.

By the end of the West Perth-East Perth clash at Arena Joondalup, Johnson had six goals and the Falcons had a victory.

The Falcons also got solid service from defender Nic Rodda, another 19-year-old who advanced to

league ranks via the same junior club as Johnson.

Rodda and Johnson got early votes in the WAFL Combined Past Players and Officials Association rising star award.

To be eligible players must have notched eight games or less at the start of the 2013 season and be aged 21 years or under at the end of the season.

Votes do not need to be awarded.

Subiaco will have a tough task to stop a West Perth team full of momentum at the Falcons' spiritual home.

On the back of an undefeated pre-season the Falcons got their season proper off to a strong start with a 75-point hammering of the Royals, set up by an 11-goal to one second half, and impressed with a high level of stamina and energy.

Their fitness levels will be a key to their success this year, though against Subiaco, the Falcons will have to be wary of spreading the ground too much and allow the Lions' clear paths to goal.

Subiaco have had significant player turnover in the off season they will particularly miss their leading goal kicker Blake Broadhurst, and will need recruits Ryan Herring and Jarrod Kayler-Thomson to help keep the scoreboard ticking over.

Both Subiaco and West Perth have the ability to score big through the production of their midfield, with the game likely to come down to the ruck contest between Callum Sinclair and Chris Keunen.

The Lions have had the benefit of a bye in the first round. The break gave them the opportunity to closely scrutinise the Falcons' game plan.

This battle will also mark Jarrod Schofield's debut as a league coach.

Pat Travers, Jayden Pitt and Viv Michie will need to get more of the ball through the centre to force gaps in the Royals' game plan.

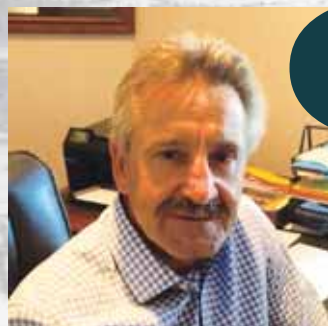
The Thunder will also rely on Matt Orzel's experience.

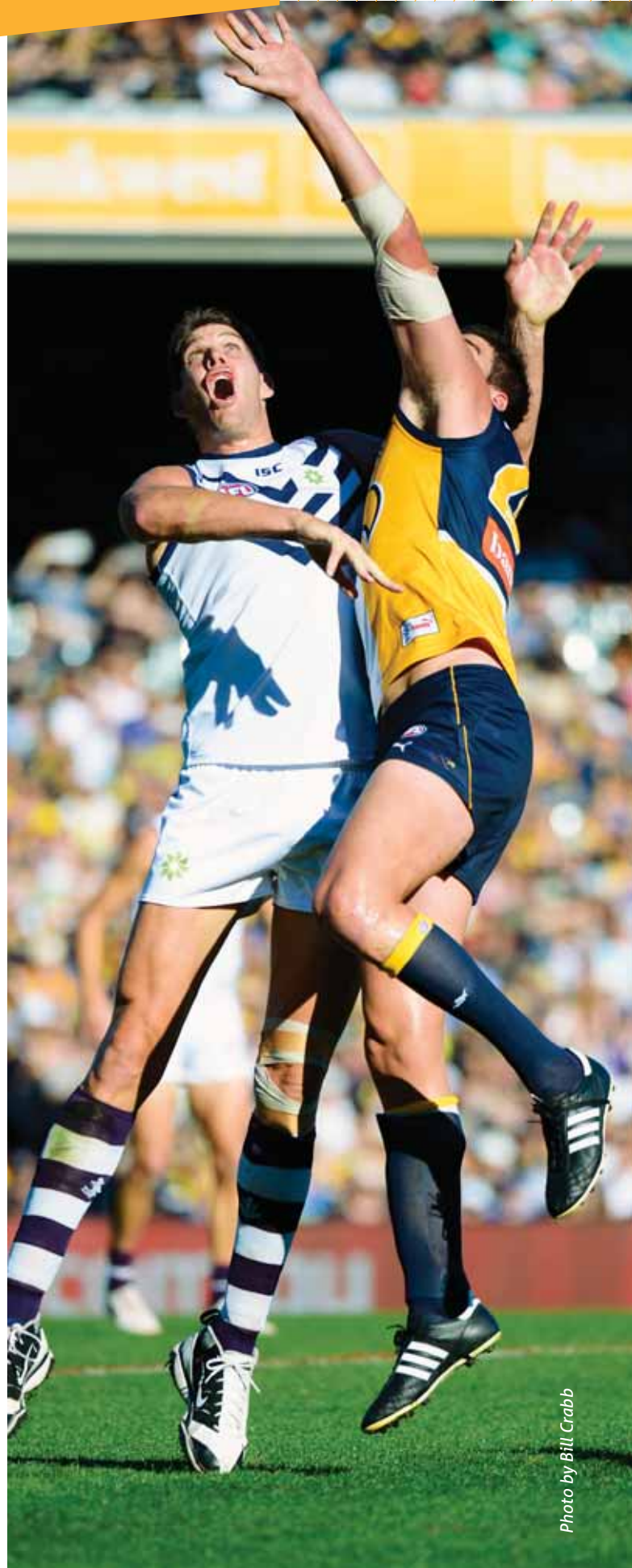

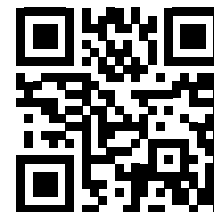

Andrew Wisken (East Perth 1989, 2 games) – ex Echuca, Vic

WAFL's busy trading period

Well, as promised last week, I'm going to start this column by highlighting a few more of the WAFL collectables which sold over summer.

Along with the usual pile of Registers, Budgets and cards, there were also quite a few interesting and rarely-seen items, some of which were featured last week.

First for this week, I did promise to report the auction price on one of the Darbyshire urchins, based on Paul Rigby's famous character, which I had been unable to obtain by the time last week's Budget went to print.

The Perth urchin reached only \$880 at auction, perhaps indicating that the days of attaining prices of up to \$1500 for them are over. A South Fremantle urchin, though damaged, fetched only \$1000 in October.

Among the other more kitsch items to sell was a boot-shaped port bottle, in the style which featured in this column last year.

These were part of the WAFL's early 80s mass marketing push and the South Fremantle version which appeared at auction sold for \$118. I can't remember one of these going higher. An East Fremantle version sold last year for \$70, while a Subiaco version went even cheaper.



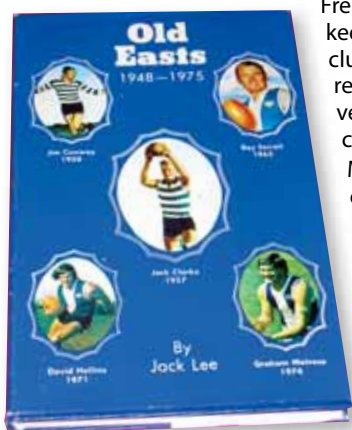
There were also quite a few club history books available over the summer period. Each traditional club has produced at least one history book over the years and many have produced more than one.

East Fremantle was the first to bring one out. It was written by turn-of-the-century star Dolph Heinrichs in 1947 and a copy recently sold for \$90. Journalist Jack Lee wrote a later history of the Sharks, which covered the period 1948-1976. A copy sold for \$29.

And, a Swan Districts history book, produced in 1974, sold for \$23.

Further on history books, South Fremantle supporters might like to keep their eyes peeled for a new club history, which is due to be released late this year. Their last version was done in 1976 and clearly needs updating.

Meanwhile, I'm looking for a copy of *The Royals 1906-1976*, written by Matthew Glossop, to complete my collection of club history books. If anyone is willing to part with one, please get in touch.



But, back to the summer sales.

The ever-popular membership badges popped up a few times and reached some interesting prices.

An undated East Perth badge sold for \$52, a 1959 Royals badge for \$94, a 1967 South Fremantle badge for \$108, a 1964 East Fremantle badge for \$132 and a 1961 Swan Districts badge for the ridiculous price of \$202.

Before you frantically dig out your badges and send them to market, you should always keep in mind that the WAFL collectables scene is hugely volatile.

Removing the bidders who won those particular badges from any future auction of the same badges could see the price drop massively.
