Port veteran

For Kris Miller, life revolves around gameday.

It has been that way for 15 years. And it has been a successful strategy for the blond ball magnet.

At times the policy of looking after his battered body hasn't pleased everyone around him. But it has enabled the 32-year-old to be one of the most consistent servants of the WAFL.

When Miller runs on to Fremantle Oval with South Fremantle in round seven for the first derby of the season he will climb another rung of league history.

The South Fremantle-East Fremantle clash will be his 284th match and will elevate him to equal seventh on the all-time list of most WAFL appearances. By season's end, with fingers crossed, he should be sixth with only some of the competition's greatest names – Mel Whinnen, Bill Dempsey, Jack Sheedy, Brian Peake and Bill Walker – ahead of him.

Some deem the WAFL not to be what it was in the 1960s and 1970s. Yet it is still damn difficult to get a kick. And the commitment, training and loyalty needed to endure in the State's premier competition are the same.

Miller doesn't have a magic drink or superstition that has allowed him to enjoy such longevity. He puts his ability to rest his sore body in the six days between fixtures as the key to his long-term success.

However, some at times have misconstrued his approach with suspicion. But it isn't a case of Miller putting his feet up at training and reading the Football Budget while his teammates pound the track.

He has just been careful with his workload.

"It is all about the Saturday," Miller said. "Getting myself right for the match on the Saturday has been the priority.

"That has meant that if I'm a bit sore in a hamstring then I won't kick at training. I suppose in some ways it might be seen as a selfish point of view but I've never done anything to the detriment of the team.

"In a lot of ways Saturdays are the easy bit. It is all the other things like the commitment to training, expanding a business and raising a family that make it tough. And it has become tougher as I've got older.

"Team success is what drives me. I have pride in my personal performance but I'd accept a lower performance if it meant the team was successful."

There were times when Miller, who ironically made his debut in a derby in 1999 albeit in an East Fremantle guernsey, was close to making an early exit from the game.

Like a few players at East Fremantle at the time he had a falling out with the Sharks coaching staff in 2006. South Fremantle threw him a lifeline and he made his first appearance for the Bulldogs in a derby.

He has gone on to win South's fairest and best award three times (2007, 2009, 2012) adding to the Lynn Medal he claimed at the Sharks in 2005 to become the only player to earn club champion honours with both port teams. Add in the 2009

premiership with the Bulldogs and he rightly deserves his place among the WAFL greats.

Then last year he and fellow stalwart Toby McGrath were called into the Bulldogs' coaching office of Paul Hasleby a few weeks before season's end.

Hasleby and Miller have been mates since they traded forehands in country week tennis as 12-year-olds. Miller represented Mingenew and Hasleby played for Northampton. They have since been groomsmen at each other's weddings.

In his chat Hasleby wanted to know whether Miller and McGrath wanted to go around in 2013. If not, in recognition of their great service they deserved a send-off.

Miller wasn't done. Despite the burden of commitment he still loved the game. And he was still able to make a positive contribution to a league squad undergoing a major reconstruction.

"I started training a few weeks after the season and decided I would go until Christmas and see how I felt," Miller said. "At least I was in shape to take on another season."

It has now led to the almost eerie situation where he celebrates another milestone in a derby – the 42nd time he has appeared in a South Fremantle-East Fremantle battle.

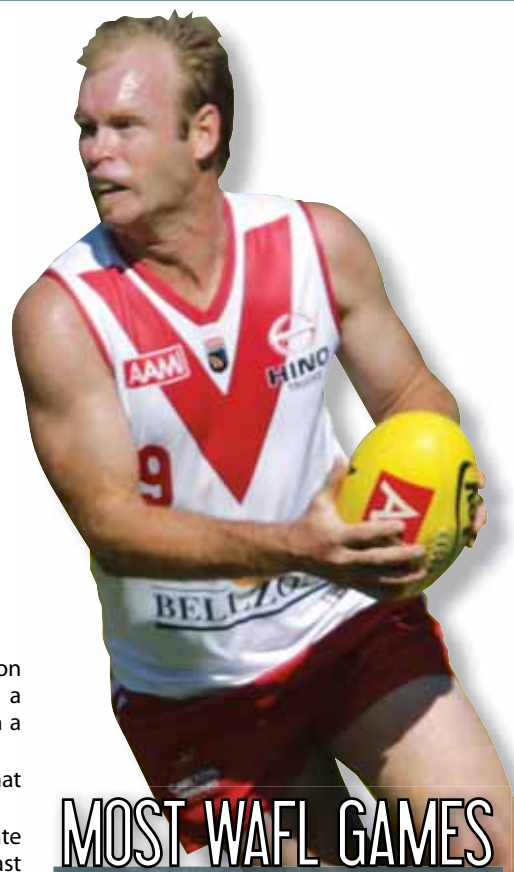
And he loves the sense of occasion that comes with the port duel.

"South Fremantle people are passionate about beating East Fremantle and East Fremantle people are passionate about beating South Fremantle," Miller said.

"The crowds are bigger, it's louder, there is a lot more abuse, and everyone is right into the game a lot more. The atmosphere is not like any other WAFL match.

"I've got no dramas about playing East Fremantle. I never left there on bad terms with any players. I don't get as much abuse now. I enjoy beating them.

"But I have no problems with East Fremantle doing well. I was happy they got to a grand final last year and even though they lost I thought they did very well. I would have been more than happy if they'd won. I don't begrudge them winning, except when I'm playing against them."

New look for derby foes

SOUTH Fremantle and East Fremantle will wear one-off Navy and Air Force jumpers this ANZAC Day featuring the names of servicemen from each club that have been killed in action.

The tribute to Australian servicemen and women has been arranged in partnership with Legacy in WA as part of the WAFL's ANZAC Round for Legacy in WA. The match will also feature a pre-game ANZAC service commencing at 4pm sharp at Fremantle Oval.

The Bulldogs (Navy) and Sharks (Air Force) will play for the Sir Hughie Edwards Cup, named in honour of the air force hero who played for the Bulldogs and later became Governor of Western Australia.

Entry to the game is free for all servicemen and veterans and will include fundraising for Legacy in WA, which



formed a new partnership with the WA Football Commission this season to increase awareness and fundraising opportunities among footy fans.

The new partnership will see Legacy in WA promoted throughout the season, with a special focus on ANZAC Day. Promotions will also tie in with Legacy Week, which runs from August 31 to September 7, 2013.

Rising Star

He looks like his dad and after a few matches in the 2013 he has proven he possesses a few of his father's other characteristics.

Ryan Lester-Smith has shot to the lead in the WAFL Combined Past Players and Officials rising star award by showing some of the goal-kicking skills his parent, Neil Lester-Smith, showed during his career with the Sharks.

Another with a strong forward line presence, Swan Districts' Kirk Ugle, has also issued his challenge for the award in recent weeks.

To be eligible players must have notched eight games or less at the start of the 2013 season and be aged 21 years or under at the end of the season.

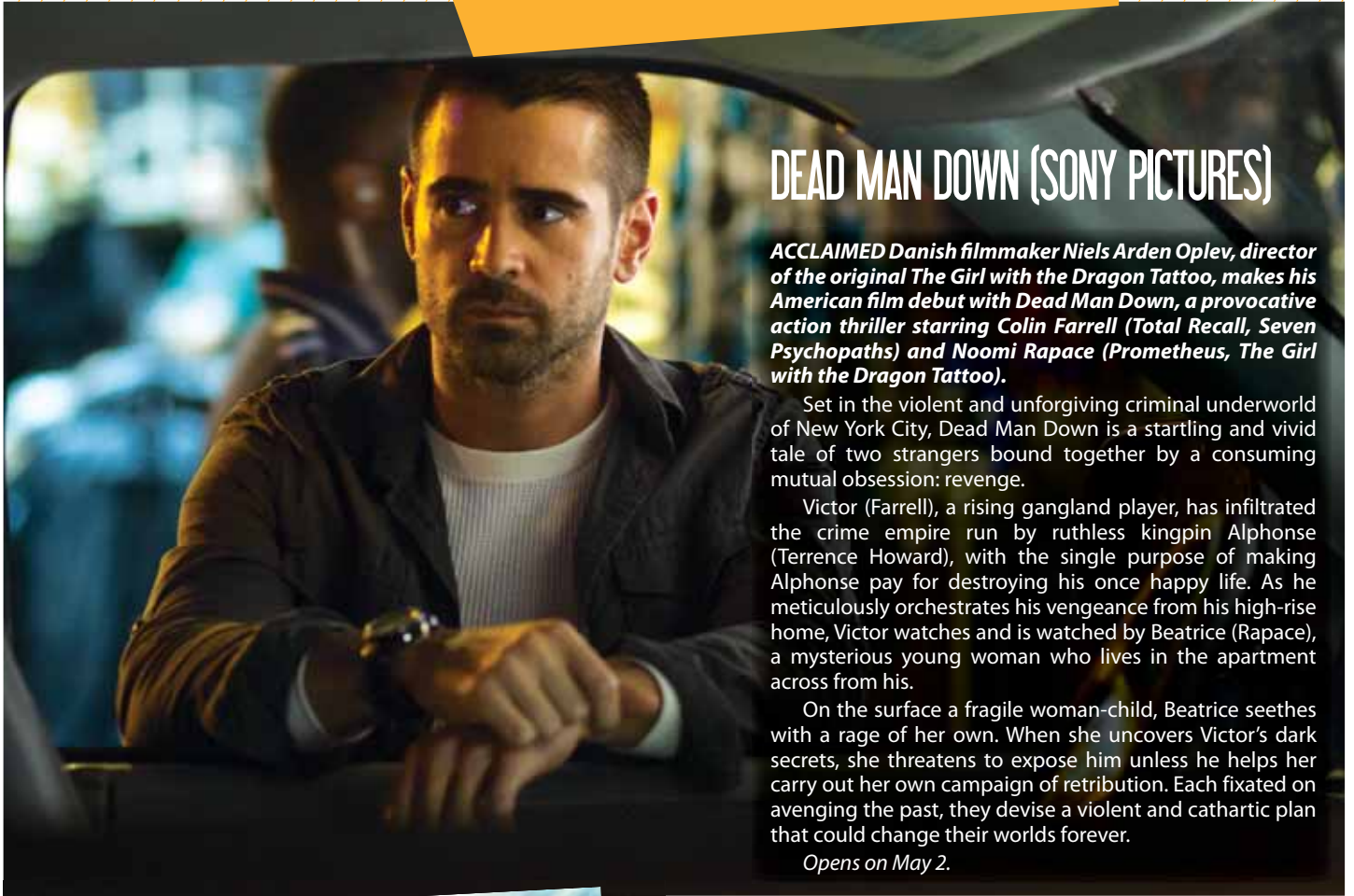

DEAD MAN DOWN (SONY PICTURES)

ACCLAIMED Danish filmmaker Niels Arden Oplev, director of the original *The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo*, makes his American film debut with *Dead Man Down*, a provocative action thriller starring Colin Farrell (*Total Recall*, *Seven Psychopaths*) and Noomi Rapace (*Prometheus*, *The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo*).

Set in the violent and unforgiving criminal underworld of New York City, *Dead Man Down* is a startling and vivid tale of two strangers bound together by a consuming mutual obsession: revenge.

DRIFT (HOPSCOTCH)

IT IS the early 1960's. To escape her brutal husband Kat Kelly travels across the country to start a new life in an isolated WA coastal town. For Andy and Jimmy Kelly the town has one big asset: perfect waves.

Twelve years on and the family is struggling. Jimmy has become a brilliant surfer but leads an aimless life. Andy works in a soul-destroying job and Kate is slipping behind on her repayments. In order to save his home and his family, Andy quits his job and launches Kelly Brothers Surf Gear.

The boys gain allies when itinerant hippy surf photographer JB and his Hawaiian friend Lani arrive in town. JB's radical philosophy and freewheeling life inspires Jimmy but almost destroys the fledgling business.

When an aggressive competitor attempts to steal his market, Andy realises that if he is going to survive he must expand Kelly Brothers. With the support of an old friend, he opens a shop and factory and Drift is born. But someone is bringing hard drugs into the community and the cops suspect the Kelly boys. Perth has held on to its place in the top four despite having last week's bye and will look to sure up its standing but East Perth won its second game of the year on the back of solid fourth quarter play against East Fremantle at the port.

The Royals have relied on the usual suspects - Brendan Lee, Craig Wulff, Freddie Clutterbuck and Aaron Sweet - to lift their rating in recent weeks.

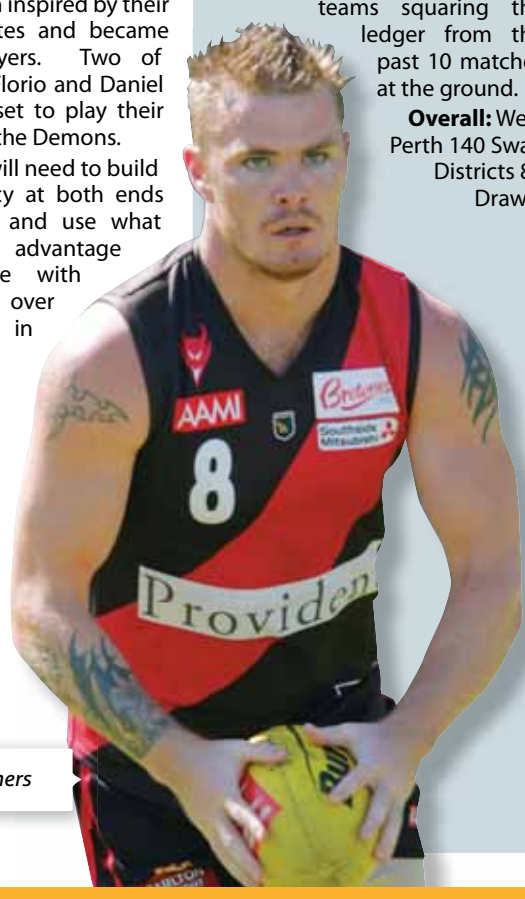
But they run into a Demons outfit that is just two points off having an unbeaten record in 2013. Their spike in form has surprised many in the league.

Rare medals sold off

It's not often items come up for sale from the early years of the last century.

But some very rare medals which once belonged to a WA football Hall of Fame member were recently sold off by the player's descendants.

Regular readers of this column may remember that medals belonging to early player and umpire John Orr came up for sale last year.



But, without wishing to denigrate the late Mr Orr, I think the medals won by East Fremantle champion Charles "Dick" Sweetman are probably worth quite a bit more.

The first, inscribed "HFC Pres'd to C Sweetman Most Improved Player" is possibly the oldest, but investigations are yet to identify which club "HFC" refers to.

The next was awarded to Sweetman in 1903, when he was East Fremantle's leading goalkicker. The impressive medal is 15-carat gold.

In 1910, he was awarded another 15-carat gold medal, this time for being a member of East Fremantle's team which defeated Boulder City in a battle-of-the-premiers to claim the mantle of being WA's best football team.

Finally, in 1911, he received another 15-carat gold medal, this time for becoming a life member at Old Easts.

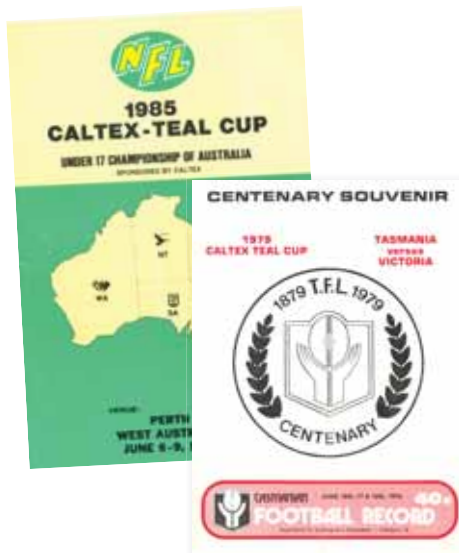
Sadly, Dick Sweetman became the first WA player to die as a result of his football injuries shortly after he was awarded life membership.

In 1911, he announced his decision to retire at the end of the season, but he made himself available for a State selection trial match.

During the game, he received a spinal injury and never recovered. He died in late 1912.

Dick Sweetman's important collection of medals was bought by a Perth collector.

The new owner hopes they will one day take pride of place in a WA football museum.



Over summer, I was interested to watch a couple of collectors snap up some of the more unusual programs on offer.

At least two collectors were interested in old Teal Cup programs (now known as the AFL Under 18s Championships). Another was picking up WA Country Carnival programs.

I'm not sure there would be much of a market for either, but some of the more important carnivals (the 1985 Teal Cup carnival, for instance) might appeal to WA football collectors, especially.

The only price that was public was the \$10.50 paid for the 1992 Teal Cup program.

And I'm still looking for some help in finding programs covering games between any of the WAFL clubs and visiting VFL or SANFL clubs.

WAFL country games finalised for 2013

West Australian Football League games have been confirmed for Kununurra and Moora in June and August under the State Government's Country Sport Enrichment Scheme.

Claremont and Perth will host the games in their respective country zones – the Tigers in Kununurra against East Fremantle on Saturday, June 29, and the Demons against West Perth in Moora on August 10.

WAFL Competition Director Grant Dorrington said the League was delighted the State Government had committed to supporting both games, with the 4500km return journey to Kununurra requiring funds above and beyond the prescribed CSES allocation.

"The WAFL is committed to taking games to regional areas as part of the CSES and thanks the State Government and Sports Minister Terry Waldron for their outstanding support. Playing these games simply wouldn't be possible without them, especially in a location more than 2000km away," Mr Dorrington said.

"Thanks must also go to the football leagues in each community for their efforts in organising these games at a local level. Country football has a long and envious record as a breeding ground for top football

talent and it is satisfying to reward this passion by taking WAFL contests to regional WA."

The game at Kununurra's Town Oval will be the first WAFL game in the town since 2000 when Swan Districts defeated Subiaco in Round 14.

The game at Moora's Recreation Sports Ground will be the first in the town since the inaugural CSES game in 1999 that was arranged as part of flood relief efforts in the area. Perth defeated Swan Districts in that contest.

Players from the host clubs, along with umpires and other development staff will spend time at surrounding communities and schools in the days before and after each game to deliver additional benefits to the region.

Next month's WAFL v VFL State game in Northam is also being funded under the CSES program, which is aimed at bringing major sporting events to country WA and encouraging sports development in regional communities.

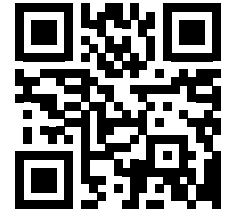
