Cultural shift sparks Demons resurrection

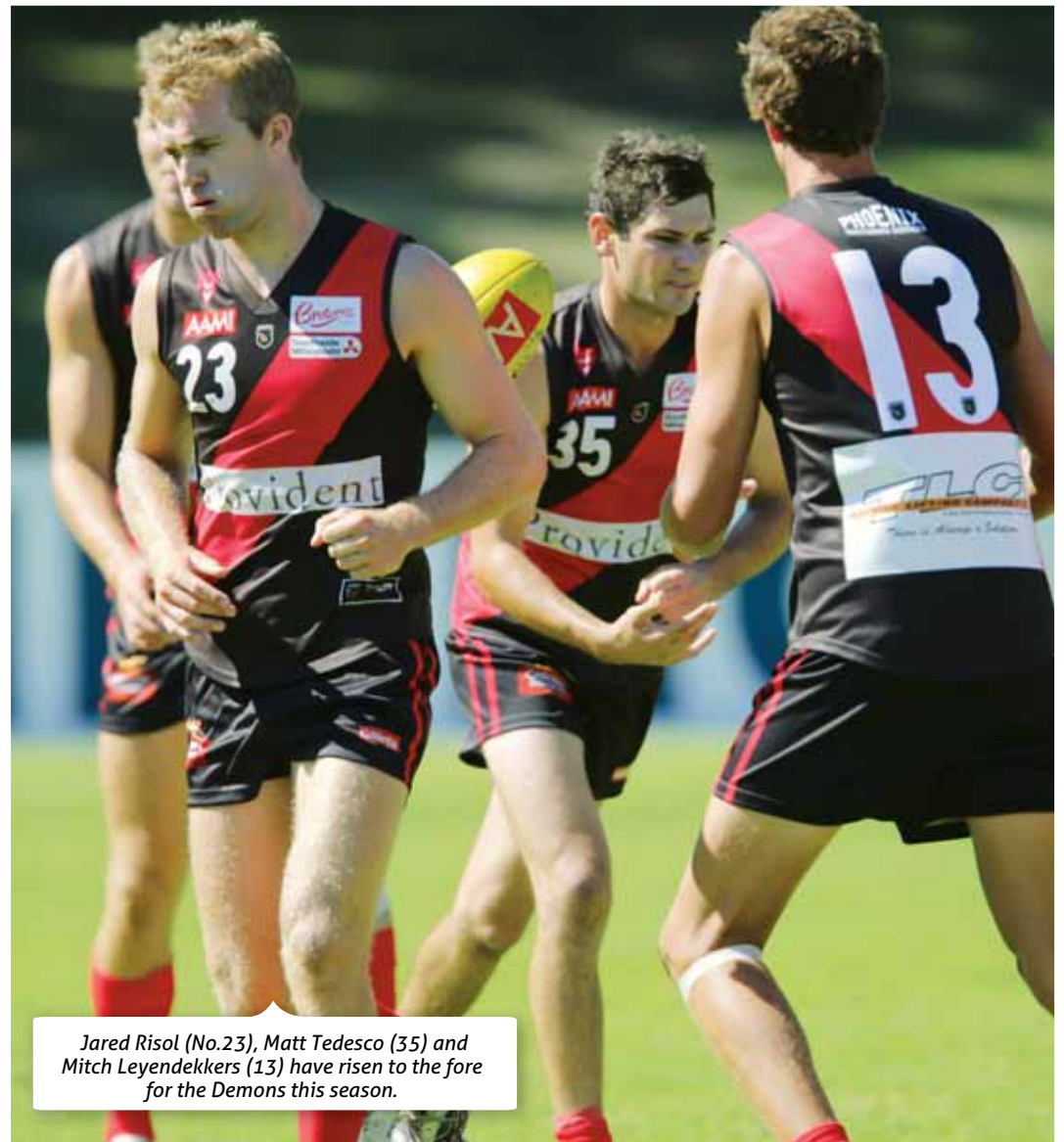
The line in the sand was clearly evident during a pre-season WAFL fixtures meeting.

Perth's brains trust had made a vow that no longer would they have the beach kicked in their face. More than 30 years of being bullied were over. And if the situation was to change on the field, then it had to start in the boardroom.

When recently-appointed chief executive Marty Atkins forthrightly pointed out an injustice for the Demons to a 2013 scheduling panel, he set the tone for what has been a remarkable turnaround for a club that has been the league whipping boy for too long.

Atkins pointed out that Perth should be entitled to some of the blockbuster timeslots that had been hogged by rivals in previous seasons. The former South Fremantle stalwart advised the group if the Demons were to lift their game they had to be given the opportunities long afforded other so-called power clubs.

The stance has underlined the change in culture Atkins has helped bring to Perth this season. The new attitude has worked wonders. The Demons' league team is two points off an undefeated record, the reserves are on top of the ladder and even the much-feared supporters' can bar, long full of

criticism, has begun cheering their players off the ground.

There is a new feel at Brownes Stadium. Pessimism has been replaced by optimism and it has provided the WAFL with arguably the early highlight of its year.

"When the job came up at Perth, Vince Pental, the president, certainly knew something had to be done on the football side of things," Atkins said.

"From a finance point of view, and you can ask (WAFC director of finance) Michael Hnatojko about this, but Perth is about the third most financial club at the moment, even after many years of no success.

"But I noticed little things that weren't right on the football side. And as people who have been around good football cultures know, all those little things can add up to bad things. For instance, football jumpers shouldn't just be thrown in the middle of the room after matches and there shouldn't be laughter and smiles in the rooms after losses.

"There were too many players just happy to turn up, play, get their money and not be worried about whether we won or lost. That culture had to change."

Coach Damian McMahon also got some assistance from people who had enjoyed success elsewhere.

Trevor Williams, a premiership-winning colts coach, came on board to help develop the younger Demons, Adam Pickering brought along his experiences from AFL level at Carlton as well as East Perth and Michael Broadbridge, with the knowledge of West Coast's inner sanctum, helped boost Perth's match committee.

Even the fitness and conditioning of the league squad was lifted with the arrival of Jackson Dennis, who had spent two years working under Eagles guru Glen Stewart.

However, it was the words of a champion home-grown product that resonated around

the old Lathlain ground.

"Chance Bateman, like our skipper Paul Bevan with Sydney, played in a premiership with Hawthorn and he was really keen to return to our club to play WAFL," Atkins said.

"Chance stood before our playing group and said while he was very thankful to get his chance in the AFL he knew that when he left Perth it was pretty ordinary. He said it had obviously been pretty ordinary ever since.

"But he wanted to come back and change that situation. You can imagine what effect that had on the whole playing group's point of view."

Bateman, Bevan and former Essendon player Kyle Reimers have had their impact on the Demons but it has been the improvement in others such as Jared Risol, Daniel O'Sullivan, Mitch Leyendekkers, Brett Hodge and Matthew Boyle that have underpinned Perth's graduation to the top four.

Also, 29 players have left the club in the past 12 months. Some were seen as part of the problem, not the solution.

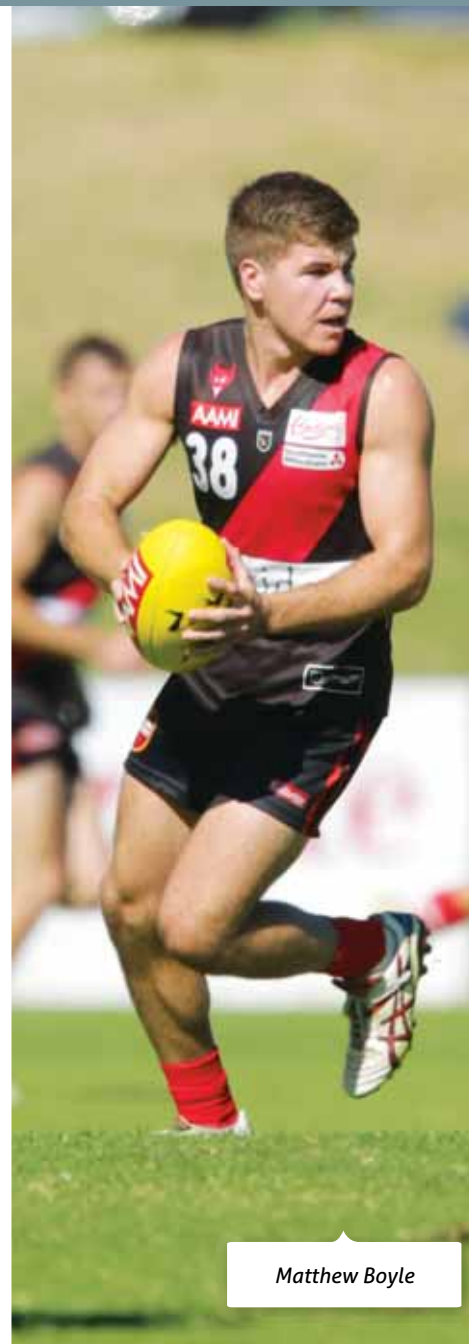
Replacing the departed are products from Perth's victorious under-age development squad and graduates from the colts that featured in last year's semi-finals.

It will be those youngsters that drive the Demons' push for their first league finals appearance since 1997 and only their fourth since the club's most recent premiership in 1977.

"So the players coming up know about winning," Atkins said. "They aren't tainted by the league team's lack of success because they have had their own and know what it takes to get it.

"Strangely enough we are one kick from being unbeaten but because of the fixtures we are still only fourth.

"I guess that gives us all the incentive to work that little bit harder."

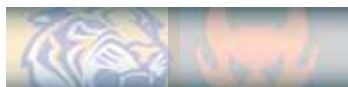

CLAREMONT V PERTH

Claremont Oval

After surviving its biggest test of the season Claremont will play host to a Perth side keen to prove its true standing in the 2013 competition.

The Demons are brimming with confidence after their remarkable turnaround this season. They are only one kick off an unbeaten record.

But the team that has dominated the WAFL over three seasons is the yardstick by which Perth can measure its improvement.

The Tigers have injuries to key players but their tall timber remains a major obstacle for any side.

Mark Seaby is an early Sandover Medal favourite through his ruck work but his ability to play up forward was arguably the deciding factor in the win over Peel last weekend.

With Seaby used elsewhere, occasionally in tandem with key forward Chad Jones, Mitch Andrews has proven a more than capable replacement on the ball.

But it won't all be one way.

The Tigers will need to shut down Paul Bevan, Kyle Reimers and Brennan Stack up forward with the Demons trio at the forefront of their renewed attacking strength.

In spite of some up and down form at times this season, East Fremantle is just seven percentage points behind on the premiership table.

The Falcons allowed an average of 63 points in their four wins but in the past two weeks have given up 93 points per game. Against a Sharks team that has a wealth of potential scorers West Perth will need to strengthen their defence.

But the best way to stop a team adding to their total is win the ball via midfield and that is where Mark Hutchings, Ray Bartholomew and Matt Guadganin come into the equation for the visitors.

While Brad Cooper, Mark McGough and Rory O'Brien could prove to be game changers in the middle, the Falcons will also need to be aware of the Sharks' emerging ruckmen in Cam Symonds and Fraser McDougall, and limit their impact at the start of play.

O'Brien is set to play his 50th game for the Sharks.

And although South Fremantle has struggled in 2013 and are without a win from six outings, East Perth cannot continue to rely on the old firm to get their third win of this campaign.

Although the Bulldogs are 0-6, they have at times played attractive football to suggest the breakthrough win isn't far away.

Last week the South Fremantle board gave its support to besieged coach Paul Hasleby and now it is time for the players to follow suit on the field.

Sean Tighe will have his hands full in containing Johnson in the ruck but with the Royal's tendency to move up the ground later in games means the Bulldogs big man will need to be able to cover his rival across Medibank Stadium.

Though the Lions have lost just five times to the Thunder, two of those losses came last season when the Lions allowed the Thunder free reign on the scoreboard.

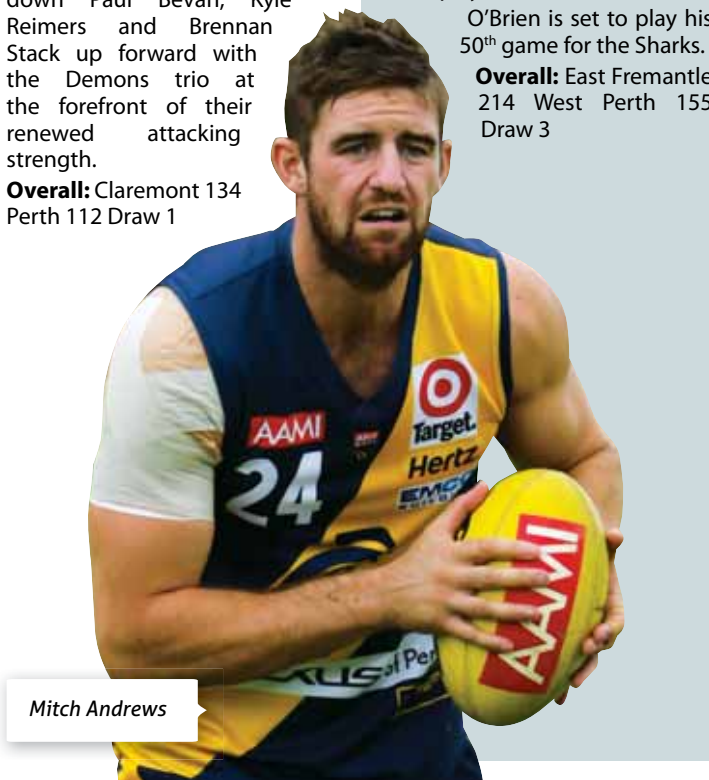

PEEL THUNDER V SUBIACO

During 2013, the Football Budget will again feature a section on WAFL memorabilia and invites you to write or email if you want more information about the football collectables you have tucked away at home.

Opener brings some WAFL cheers

Before last week, WAFL Collectables had a two-week hiatus. And it seems the couple of weeks away might have allowed some Budget readers to dig things out of the deepest, darkest recesses of their cupboards and storage boxes.

It even prompted Ron, of Forrestfield, to send me some snail mail about a couple of items he had picked up over the past two years.

The first was something I had not seen before – a WAFL bottle opener which featured the old W-style logos from the 70s and early 80s. In fact, he had three of them.

Ron bought the Perth and Claremont bottle openers, which were in the shape of bottles, for \$12 each at an antique fair in 2012. The East Fremantle version was a gift from his brother.

At \$12 apiece, I'm confident Ron could at least double his money should he ever decide to sell the bottle openers.

His other query was about an ashtray he found at a Guildford antique shop for \$25 last year.

Regular readers of this column might remember that I have mentioned this set of eight WAFL ashtrays on a couple of occasions since I first saw one in the middle of last year.

They are made of plain glass but a club decal has been stuck to the bottom of each. The decals are from a sought-after set, which

was released by Artcolour in the mid-60s.

Again, I reckon Ron would double his money if he ever decided to sell the West Perth version. A Subiaco ashtray from the same set fetched \$60 last year.

You can see photographs of the four ashtrays I have now seen from that set, along with a whole lot of other WAFL memorabilia, at my website www.waflcollectables.webs.com

Meanwhile, another Budget reader emailed a photograph of a cushion her husband Alan still uses at the footy.

The West Perth cushion features a Cardinals logo on it, clearly dating it to the period before 1983.

As always, I had wondered whether it was a one-off cushion produced by the club. But that question was soon answered when I spotted an East Fremantle cushion in a friend's home just a few days later. It's clearly from the same set.

Alan's wife, who said she preferred her husband was named in this column because she was an East Perth supporter, wondered whether the cushion might be worth anything.

Based on the recent auction price of a 1970s Perth cushion for \$26, I suspect these might fetch up to about \$50 apiece.



Another item which could be purchased in the colours of each of the eight traditional WAFL clubs was the BP Footy Flags, which were released back in 1982.

I asked last month whether anyone could help with photographs because I had only ever seen Subiaco and Claremont.

East Fremantle's Maureen was able to provide a photograph of the Old Easts flag, so we're now looking for another five. In case you missed the details last time around, the Subiaco and Claremont versions sold for about \$50 each.

Finally for this week, Stephen sent in a heap of photographs over the summer of his interesting collection.

One of the more unique items was an East Perth bag, which appears to date to the 1970s.

It reminds me of the West Perth and South Fremantle bags which have previously appeared in this column.

Unfortunately, none of those have ever been sold at auction so it's very difficult to put a price on them. Having said that, I didn't get the impression Stephen was interested in selling off his East Perth bag.

More of his items will feature in this column in the coming weeks.

State 16s get set for nationals

Western Australia will be aiming to defend national titles across two divisions when the 2013 NAB AFL national 16s championships are played at Blacktown, NSW from July 6-13.

The North West squad, which was formed last year by the West Australian Football Commission with the support of the AFL, in partnership with V-Swans and Garnduwa, will again be coached by former WAFL and AFL player Phil Narkle.

WAFC state talent academy manager Raff Guadagnino said he expected this year's 16s to be WA's strongest ever group.

"The state selectors and I believe the WAFL development programs have taken player development to a new level, which has produce such promising talent." Guadagnino said.

In addition to the umpire handshake initiative that has AFL coaches shake hands with each umpire in the middle of the ground prior to a game, there are a number of promotions going on to encourage this at a community level around different competitions.

At each AFL match the opportunity will be given to four young up-and-coming umpires to walk onto the ground at the start of the match with the AFL umpiring team and for one of them to hold the ball aloft for the entry siren.

The umpires will also be able to complete the warm-up, assist with the tossing of the coin, and visit the AFL umpires in their change rooms both before and after the match.

There is also numerous radio and TV campaigns being run across the country, as well as local newspaper articles and interviews with umpires at all different levels.

The AFL and WA Football Commission provide significant investment into umpiring and game day environments, specifically the "Green Shirt Mentor Program" which is a program aimed at providing a mentor, safe environment and support to any new umpires.

So this weekend when you're at the footy, take a moment to reflect on the role you can play in ensuring that umpires are treated with respect, accept that they are going to make mistakes but most of all, that they are an important part of our game and that Umpiring is Everyone's Business.

Quartet added to list of greats

THE WA Amateur Football League inducted four new members into its Hall of Champions in front of more than 140 guests at the City West Reception Centre on Wednesday, May 1.

The WAAFL Hall of Champions was introduced in 2010 as a way to recognise the outstanding contribution to amateur football by players, coaches, umpires and administrators, as well as those who began their careers at an amateur level before going on to higher tiers.

Speaking to guests, President of the WA Amateur Football League John Davies said that the hall was a unique way of honouring significant people for their unselfish contribution to amateur football over many years.

"Tonight we reflect back on the people who set the firm foundation for amateur football in Western Australia and look forward for the roles these men played, and the role in progressing the work of those who have gone before us," he said.

"We are all here to honour them, to welcome or remember them, to embrace them for their efforts and to add their names to the already prestigious list of people currently in our Hall of Champions."

Two inductees were recognised in the High Achiever category, while Brian Lambert and Charles Veryard were both inducted as Champions for their extensive contribution to amateur football.

Lambert began his football career with North Fremantle in 1963. He was selected to represent Western Australia three times in 1962, 64, 67 and played in the All Australian side in 1962, 65 and 68. Lambert was the A Grade fairest and best player in 1962, 67 and 68.

Charles Veryard was a player and an official of significance. He played football for both West Perth and Subiaco before taking on the Presidential Role at Subiaco from 1939 – 1941. At the same time Veryard headed the WA Amateur Football Association as President, and again in 1946 for

a further 16 years to ensure the success of football in WA.

Another two former WAAFL greats were recognised in the High Achievers category, as players who began their career at an amateur level before going on to higher tiers.

Six-time WAFL Premiership player Bernie Naylor and two-time West Australian Football Association fairest and best Richard Roe were both recognised as High Achievers.

Also recognised at this year's Hall of Champions were Lionel McQueen and Gerry Stokes, who were both awarded Life Memberships through their substantial dedication to amateur football in Perth.

Both McQueen and Stokes have extensive history with the WAAFL, with their commitment to the League obvious through their many achievements, highlights and roles within the League.

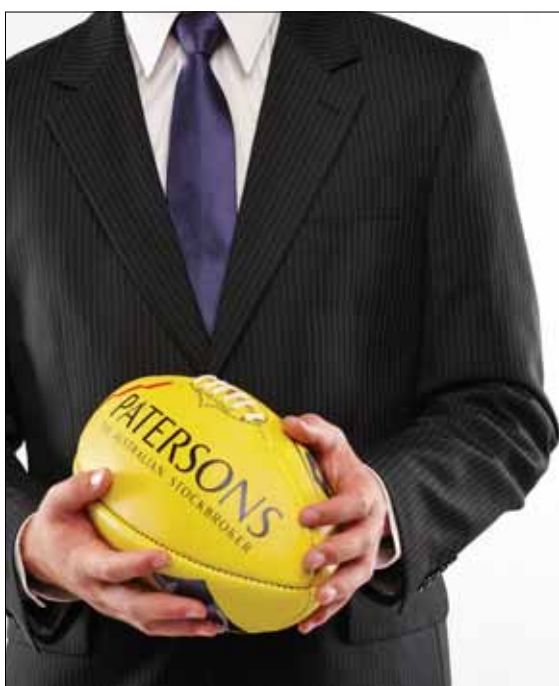

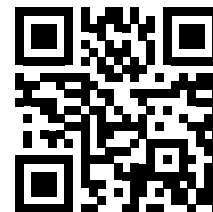
