WAFL shines on national stage

There is only one time a year you can cheer for another WAFL team.

When East Fremantle and Claremont run onto the Foxtel Cup stage over the next two months they aren't just representing the jumper. They are representing the whole cast of WAFL clubs.

It has provided long-time Tigers chief executive Todd Shimmon with that rare good luck message from a local league rival.

"Even at the WAFL CEOs meetings the other clubs say all the best for the Foxtel Cup because they know whichever club plays in the series is representing our competition," Shimmon said.

"If we're playing and we do well it augurs well for the league."

And the spin-off for that exposure could be worth more than the \$60,000 Claremont collected for being last year's champions in the interstate series featuring the best teams from Australia's State leagues.

Since such a windfall can't be budgeted in the finances and because the players lined up for virtually nothing, the Tigers decided the prize could be shared amongst the league squad and used for end-of-season trips.

That might change in 2013 with the winner's prizemoney jumping to \$100,000.

However, Shimmon has identified other benefits, too, since his club's appearance in the past two Foxtel Cup grand finals

"It isn't about the money," Shimmon said.

"There are more people seeing the Claremont brand on TV and that can only be good in other areas.

"It takes our club right across the country."

The means potential recruits might be keener to head to a successful club such as the one at Tigerland. Or sponsors are happier with their increased exposure on a national scale.

Also, players have the chance to impress at a higher level. Tom Lee's six-goal haul in last year's Foxtel Cup final boosted his claims of a second chance at AFL level. He was recruited by St Kilda for 2013.

To cater for the increase workload – the Tigers played 26 matches across two competitions last year – Claremont has worked on developing a deeper playing list.

That has enabled coach Marc Webb to blood youngsters while resting workhorses. And it has reaped rewards with Sam Fong and Matthew Davies rising to regular league representation after a taste via the Foxtel Cup.

This season there is a new twist to player management for teams in the series.

To help ease the burden on fixtures and to work into a better TV timeslot, Foxtel Cup matches will be played on Tuesday nights.

The Tigers and Sharks had a bye in round one with Queanbeyan-NT Thunder and Southport-Burnie fighting out a qualifying series.

Queanbeyan, from ACT, and Southport on the Gold Coast graduated to the main draw.

East Fremantle gets to travel for their round one battle against Norwood. The Sharks will experience AAMI Stadium on Tuesday May 21.

Claremont takes on Southport at Patersons Stadium on June 18.

This year's Foxtel Cup grand final will be staged on August 6.

Should Claremont advance from the first round it sets up the possibility of a semi-final battle with Port Melbourne.

And that means another showdown for Marc Webb, who coached the WA team to victory last week, and Boroughs mentor Gary Ayres, the man in charge of Victoria in the match in Northam.

Black Swans get the big V

The AFL has hinted at the WAFL's improvement in recent years.

An increase in mature-age players drafted from this side of the country suggests the level of performance had risen.

The proof was provided last Saturday. WA's thrilling win over Victoria in Northam let the rest of the nation know the WAFL was again a football force.

Twenty-two years of disappointment ended with the Black Swans' 17.16 (118) to 15.11 (101) triumph.

But the result also showed the WAFL had found its true place in the Australian football food chain.

Victory was set up by two players who are on the other side of AFL careers and several others whose opportunity at the top had passed them.

Paul Johnson and Wayde Twomey are tough customers. Both got a taste of the national competition and have returned to Perth to have a strong physical presence in the WAFL.

That imposing quality was crucial to the Black Swans' come-from-behind triumph as the local line-up kicked 10 of the final 13 goals in the match.

The home team was chasing the Big V for much of the fixture.

At one point in the third quarter the WAFL team was five goals down and it appeared that the 1991 State of Origin win would remain the most recent success against the arch-enemy.

However, Johnson stood tall as WA's only recognised ruckman and Twomey's vigour up forward resulted in five goals that enabled the black and gold guernseys to celebrate success on their home turf.

Steven Dodd and Tallan Ames were outstanding in defence while Rory O'Brien continued his prolific ball-winning season in the middle of the ground.

O'Brien had 31 touches, Marlon Motlop had 27 while youngster Aaron Black kicked two goals among his 21 disposals.

Victoria's cause wasn't helped by an injury to big man Michael Sikora.

Twomey won the Simpson Medal for best afield for WA while Chris Cain was awarded the Frank Johnson Medal for Victoria's leading contributor. Cain had 32 possessions.

Ironically, Twomey had spent much of his WAFL career with Swan Districts playing as a defender.

The win erased some of the bitter memories from the Black Swans' clash with Victoria at Port Melbourne in 2007, when the visitors were humbled by 119 points.

WA coach Marc Webb played in that match. Now he basks in the glory of leading his adopted State to an elusive triumph as well as premierships in the WAFL and Foxtel Cup competitions.

It is likely to be a while before WAFL fans can see first-hand their State team in action.

The Black Swans have drawn to play the NEAFL, comprising New South Wales and Queensland, next year and will travel east for the fixture.

Q&A with Brett Raponi

Name: Brett Raponi. President of West Perth Football Club

What drew you to want to become the President of a WAFL club:

I am a State Manager for a leading international hand tool manufacturer - Apex Tool Group. Our Australian head office is in Albury Wodonga (the home of Darren Harris and Dustin Burns).

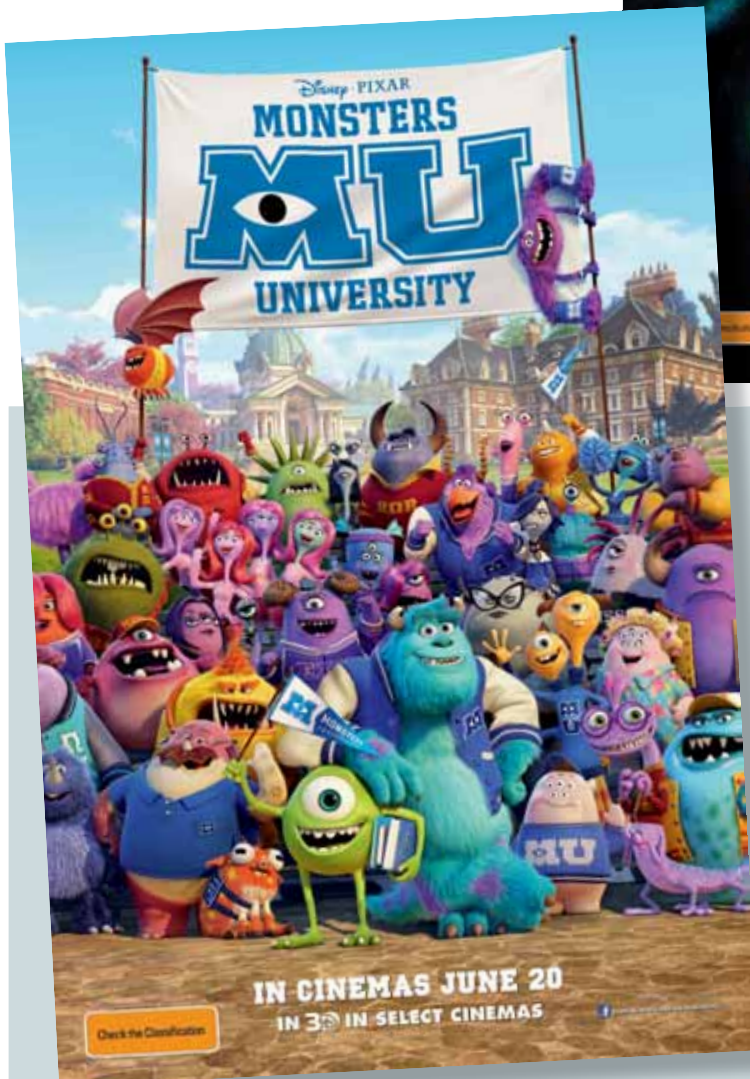
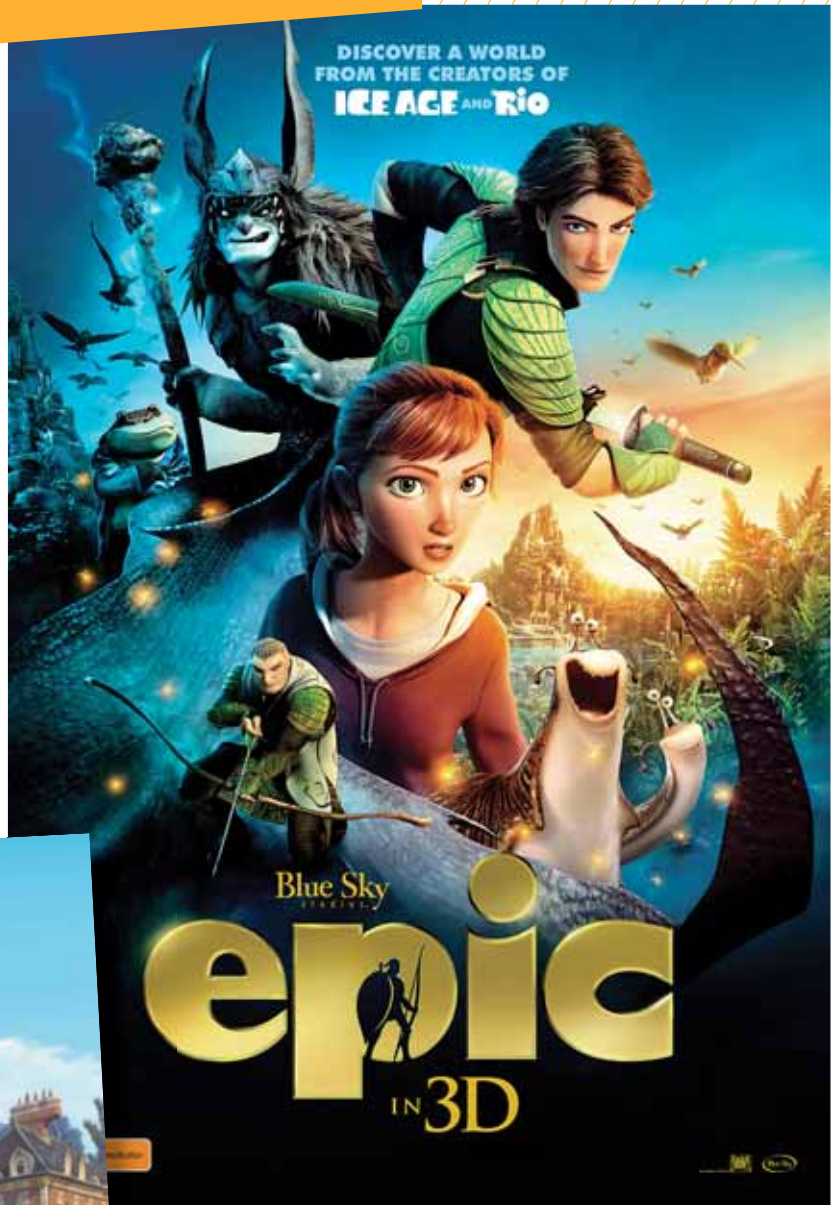

During 2013, the Football Budget will again feature a section on WAFL memorabilia and invites you to write or email if you want more information about the football collectables you have tucked away at home.

Rare card image

This is the only known image of any card from what is almost certainly the rarest set of football cards issued in Western Australia.

The story goes that a well-known West Australian collector, who has since passed away, had what he thought to be a full set of nine of these cards back in the 1980s.

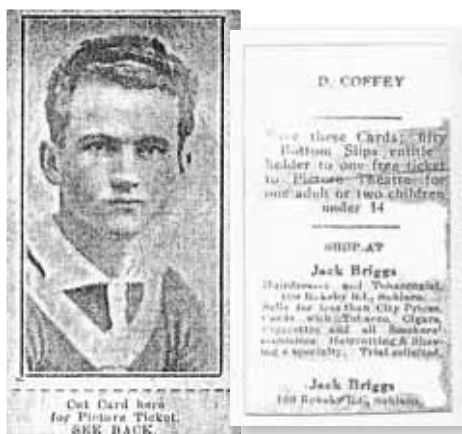
And, when a UK-based collector decided to produce a catalogue of all Australian cards, the West Australian collector popped the rare WA set in a package bound for England so they could be photographed for inclusion in the catalogue.

But they never arrived.

It's been at least 20 years since those cards disappeared. And I have never met another collector who has even seen a card from this set.

But I recently met someone who had a photocopy of one, which had been made by the WA collector before he sent the cards overseas.

This single card depicts East Fremantle champion Denis "Dinny" Coffey, who played from 1923-1929, in a photo which I've seen in several publications of the 1920s.



The other eight cards sent to England featured Reginald "Nashy" Brentnall (East Perth 1918-1927), William Hilton (East Perth 1919-1925), Henry Grigg (Perth 1923-1936), Wilfred Brophy (Subiaco 1922-1933 & 1939-1940), George Blundell (West Perth 1915 & 1920-1924), Harold Boyd (West Perth 1919-1925), Jack Clark (West Perth 1916-1918 & 1920-1924) and Ted Fleming (West Perth 1922-1938).

The career spans of those players allow us to narrow down the date of production of these cards to 1923-1924.

But we really have no idea whether there were more cards in the set.



What we do know is that the series was almost identical to one of the most sought-after VFL card sets, known as Suburban Premium Issues.

In Victoria, the cards were issued by various retailers across Melbourne from about 1921-1925, including butchers and grocers. They were given out with purchases.

The buyer was supposed to cut a token off the bottom of the card. The tokens could be used to get into the picture theatre, once the buyer had enough of them. But the rest of the card was supposed to be collected.

We only know of two WA retailers who issued the cards – the first was Subiaco hairdresser Jack Briggs, while the other was big WA grocer Munyard & Kenworthy.

It is suspected that the photos used in the photographs were the photos used in the WA Footballer (the forerunner to the Football Budget), which was where the Coffey photograph was first published.

So take a good look at some of the other photographs on this page (from the WA Footballer). And if you ever see a card featuring the same photo or the same player, please get in touch.

Meanwhile, the photocopy of the WA Suburban Premium card wasn't the only recent discovery of note.

As regular readers of this column would know, the WAFL decals issued in the 1960s by various service stations are some of the toughest footy collectables to find.

And it's rare that any are found in good nick.

So, it came as something of a surprise when a big collection of 38 decals in pristine condition was recently donated to the WA Football Commission.

They come from five different sets, all of which were manufactured around the same time by BP, Shell, Neptune, Esso and Golden Fleece respectively. The sets were complete, except for the Esso set.

The previous owner would certainly have been able to sell them for at least \$1000, but his donation means we can all have a look at these blasts from the past.

The originals will be kept by the WAFC for possible future display.

Finally for this week, I would like to thank East Fremantle supporter Maxine, who gave me a bag of Old Easts memorabilia at the game between West Perth and East Fremantle two weeks ago.

The bag included an old jumper (which I'm still trying to identify), a beanie, some cards and a badge, which will feature in this column in the coming weeks.

A collector always appreciates such generosity.

CLAREMONT V EAST FREM

Claremont Oval

Claremont will take its unbeaten streak to East Fremantle this week though the Tigers will need to take care not to get complacent.

For the third year the Tigers have started the year undefeated, however, the previous streaks were ended comfortably by the Sharks.

While the Tigers have been challenged in recent weeks they have been able to remain composed in the crucial stages, something the Sharks must look to upset.

Central to this game will be the performances of the teams' midfield units with each having the ability to take over and set the match tone, the Tigers favouring a slower building pace.

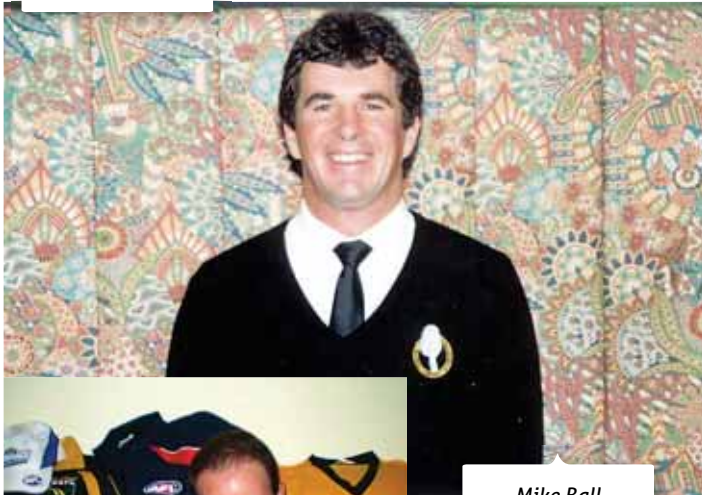

Margetts joins 300 club



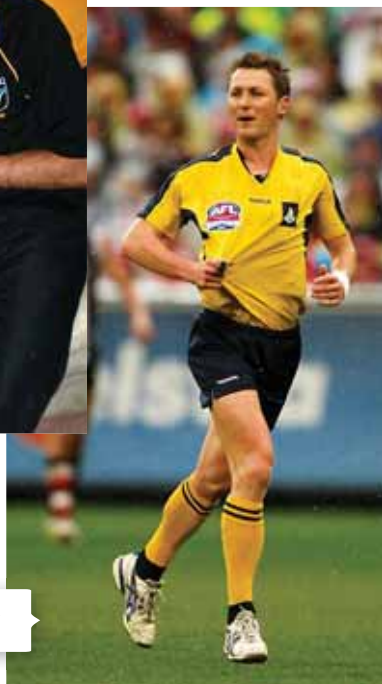

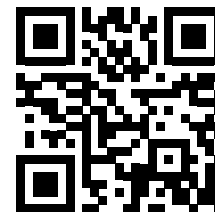

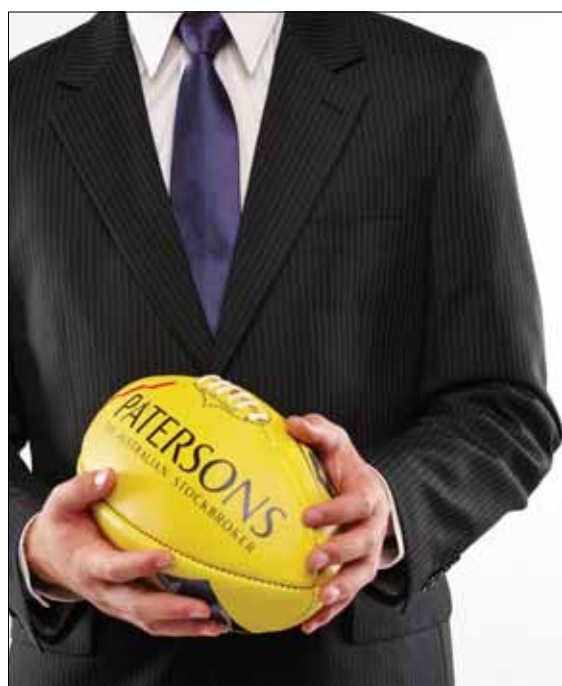
