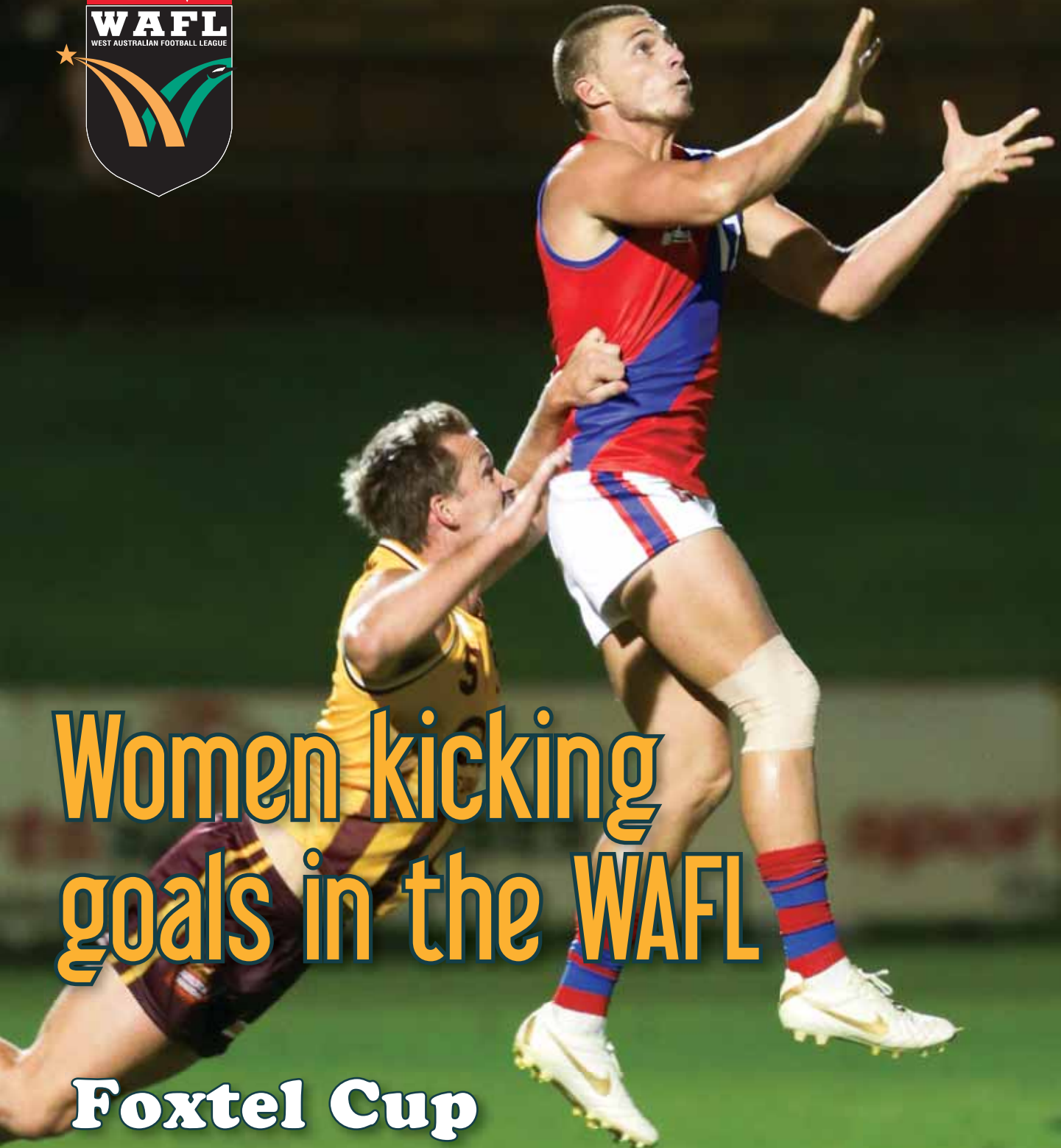

Women kicking goals

So much has changed in football over a generation.

The drop kick has been forgotten, interchange players get a vest rather than a dressing gown and full forwards no longer kick 100 goals in a season.

The game has also enjoyed an influx of women. The fairer sex isn't just featuring in ladies competitions or cheering the boys from the other side of the fence, which they do in increasing numbers.

In the modern sporting environment females are mixing it in what was predominately a male dominated domain in the WAFL. Indeed, the sisters are doing it for themselves.

Apart from wearing a guernsey at league level there are very few facets of the premier State competition that doesn't experience a women's touch – from the boardroom to the umpiring panel.

For Rebecca Daniels, football has been a strong part of her life.

A former member of the West Perth administration team, Daniels has this year joined the Falcons board.

"After I left the club and my work at the WA Football Commission I found I really missed the footy environment," Daniels said.

"I'm so passionate about my football and I felt by joining the board I could make a difference, especially at grass roots level."

Daniels admitted there was still a strong male influence in the game but more women were being encouraged to be a part of football because of the skills they can bring to clubs.

"It is still a bit of a man's world but it is getting a lot better," Daniels said.

"And there are so many women now getting involved that the clubs are appreciating the different perspective."

The Falcons have a strong contingent of female contributors.

Julie Carpenter is the colts team manager. Karly Hoar is a reserves runner and Jess Hayes is the club's head trainer.



The Trainer

Hayes spends six days a week working with all West Perth's grades as well as holding down a full-time job.

Falcons president Brett Raponi said the club welcomed the influx not just because they're women but because they were all highly capable in their roles.

"Women are one half of the world's population. Football has always been seen as a man's domain but at West Perth we see men and women as all-encompassing and with a role to play," Raponi said.

"Like all WAFL clubs we have many more ladies assisting with match day, sandwiches and raffles but for our club to continue grow we recognise the need to get more women and want them involved and holding senior positions within the club.

"It is refreshing to speak to the young ladies who have a common interest like me, that being West Perth. All are bright and have new ideas and are doing a great job in their respective positions."

Rising Star

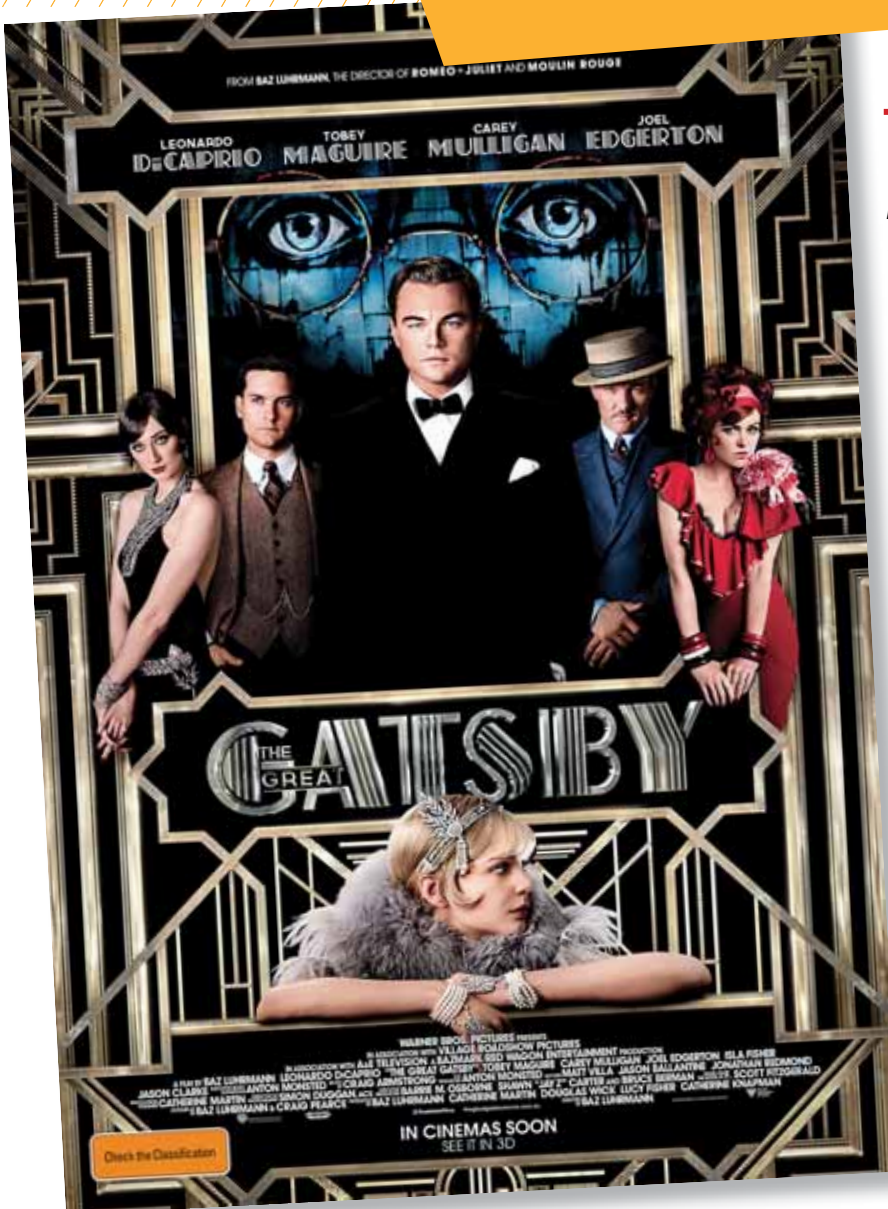

During 2013, the Football Budget will again feature a section on WAFL memorabilia and invites you to write or email if you want more information about the football collectables you have tucked away at home.

Latest find stirs the pot

While not every mass-produced WAFL collectable has yet made its way into this column, it's not often that I'm shown something that I have never so much as heard of before.

And this is especially so when the item in question is a piece of pottery because pottery collectors have been documenting their collectables for years.

Of course, the two pieces of WAFL pottery I have previously featured have both been made by famous WA makers Darbyshire (which made the Rigby's urchins) and Wembley Ware (which made footballer figurines).

But a collector recently came to me with a piece of earthenware made by Sydney-based potters Diana sometime between 1941 and 1966.



And the design is unmistakably WAFL.

Standing about 24cm tall, this earthenware decanter features a footballer in a red and white uniform on one side and the imprints of a football's laces on the other.

The footballer is wearing a West Perth long-sleeved jumper, while the six small goblets also have rings of red-and-blue.

My research found a record of just one of these decanters held elsewhere – in the Powerhouse Museum in Sydney.

The Powerhouse's version, though, is described as bearing a footballer in a red and white uniform. I can only assume it's a South Fremantle jumper, because their website doesn't include a photograph and it's not currently on display.

But the question must be asked; why would a Sydney-based pottery be producing something featuring a WAFL club?

The decanter and goblets sold for \$625. And, now the hunt is on for photos of the other seven. Can anyone help? Given how often clubs change their jumper, the photographs might help us to date the Diana ware more accurately.

There have been some interesting items come up for sale in recent weeks.

The first has always had me a bit perplexed, because I've never been able to confirm whether it relates to Claremont or Richmond

Obviously both are known as the Tigers and collectors from both clubs have previously claimed this Jim Beam decanter, made in 1977, was made for their club.

Who knows where the truth lies?

The decanter only bears the words "BEAM 100 months old, 4/5 QUART 80 PROOF, Genuine REGAL CHINA Handcrafted, Kentucky Straight Bourbon Whiskey, Bottled by JAMES B. BEAM CO, CLEMONT. BEAM KENTUCKY."

One fetched \$56 at auction recently. And I wouldn't mind one in my own collection – provided I was sure it was for Claremont and not Richmond.

Meanwhile, an East Fremantle collector was able to pick up a fantastic 1957 Old Easts annual report for the reasonable price of about \$54.

The yearbook was East Fremantle's 60th and carried some wonderful photographs.

A 1980 Swan Districts membership badge fetched \$20, while a South Fremantle pint glass went for the rather disappointing price of \$38.

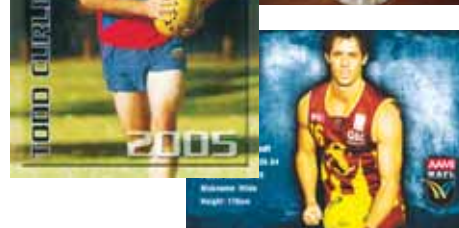
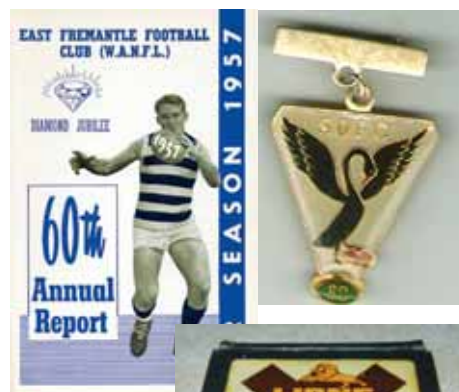
And there was a bit of a coincidence when Frank, of Mt Hawthorn, emailed me with the hopes of finding out what two WAFL transistor radios were worth.

Frank's radios date to the late 1970s or early 1980s and feature West Perth and Subiaco. But, having not seen one sell before, I wasn't quite sure what they would go for.

That question was quickly answered when another seller got just over \$50 for his Subiaco radio.

Finally for this week, I have the usual requests from collectors looking for help and a few requests from myself.

The first request comes from Paul, who would love an East Fremantle pennant like that which Rod recently photographed.



These were most likely produced by the Daily News in the early-mid 1960s and are quite difficult to find. I have only seen West Perth and South Fremantle previously.

Jeff, meanwhile, is looking for some of the recent WAFL cards and stickers, which were issued in 2001 and again between 2004-2010.

And I'm wondering if anyone can help with a couple of items.

First, I would love to hear from someone with some Peel Thunder annual reports to help fill out my collection.

And second, does anyone have any big collections of badges for any club which they might photograph for me? I'm trying to get a list together of the years in which clubs issued badges, as opposed to plastic cards.

Sharks sink teeth in Foxtel Cup

Conditions were perfect for ducks – or even Sharks – at AAMI Stadium last Tuesday.

Although it has been a while since a WAFL round was held in consistently wet weather, East Fremantle showed great tenacity on the slippery surface to win their opening Foxtel Cup clash with Norwood.

Despite a slow start, Steve Malaxos' team never stopped fighting and recorded a 6.6 (41) to 4.11 (35) victory, just four days after their WAFL round nine loss to Claremont.

East Fremantle made a slow start against the 2012 SANFL premier as it adjusted to the environment and didn't kick its first goal until time-on in the first term.

However, inspired by Rory O'Brien, who relished the at-ground style of play, the Sharks' defence restricted the Redlegs to just one goal after quarter-time.

Cam Symonds worked tirelessly in the ruck, Mark McGough enjoyed the close-checking approach and Mitchell Boyle proved to be a livewire across half-forward.

Boyle's two goals were crucial for the Sharks.

Norwood was well served by 16-year-old Peter Bampton, who would have impressed AFL talent scouts with his work.

It took a brilliant set-shot goal on a tight angle by Ryan Lester-Smith to seal the win for the WA side in the final quarter.

East Fremantle's coaching staff was also pleased with the input of rookie Louis Cronan, who had a hand in two goals.

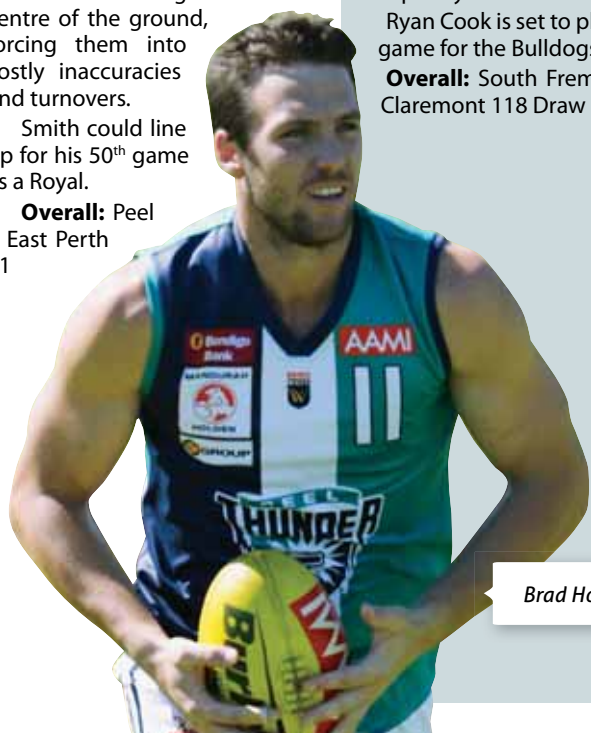
The earlier season match-up between the teams went the Royals' way on the back of the Thunder's inability to contain Josh Smith, Aaron Sweet and Craig Wulff.

Swans will also seek another strong performance by ruckman Wes Lammie, who has carried the team's following duties on his shoulders for much of the season.

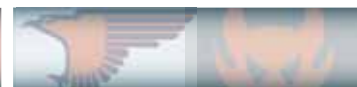
The Lions will need to be aware and combat Swans' potency up forward and use the gaps they create to push through their own attack.

Rafferty's rules in amateur umpiring

There are many characters in footy across all levels of the game including at amateur level. One such person is umpire Seamus Rafferty.

An umpiring stalwart in WA, Rafferty has experienced success as an official whilst managing a busy life outside of umpiring.

He started umpiring in 1988 following an approach by then Claremont junior umpiring coach Bob Lee.

Rafferty, known for his sense of humour including at his own expense, commented: "Bob must have seen me playing juniors and realised I would make a better umpire than player!"

Rafferty's natural talent for umpiring was identified and within two years he was umpiring WAFL colts as a young 16 year old.

WAFC manager's competitions umpiring Tim Priest, who umpired with Rafferty in the WAFL, recalled: "Seamus was the youngest umpire on the WAFL field umpire panel, but he certainly wasn't one for taking a backward step in the friendly banter amongst his fellow umpires, many of whom were twice his age."

Rafferty who was by his own admission was "a bit of a scallywag in his teenage years", decided in 1993 that after umpiring WAFL for four years the WAAFL would better suit.

With his distinctive red hair, Rafferty was soon equally well known amongst the Amateur competition for his firm but fair and highly competent umpiring skill. He was rewarded by field umpiring three consecutive A Grade grand finals. (2000, 2001, 2002)

The same characteristics displayed by Rafferty as an umpire have held him in equally good stead as a practising solicitor.

Rafferty, who since 2009 to the present has represented the accused in the criminal courts, commenced as a State Prosecutor at the DPP from 2001 to 2009. For much of that time umpiring largely took a back step.

But the busy family man, with two young children, decided in 2011 to rejoin the WAAFL umpire panel to regain some fitness.

Priest cited Rafferty as one of the great contributors to the WAAFL.

"The WAAFL is very fortunate to have someone of Seamus' experience still involved, as he offers terrific confidence to younger umpires. This experience at WAAFL level is critical as we develop umpires along the pathway to WAFL and AFL, coupled with the fact Amateur matches can at times be extremely challenging to officiate," Priest said.

"Seamus is a high quality mentor and person, and we rate highly his contribution on and off the field."

Rafferty holds additional responsibility as an official honorary investigator for the WAAFL, called upon to adjudicate complaints made by clubs for on and off field incidents that are not the subject of reports by umpires.

Beyond football, he is deputy chairman of the Liquor Commission and chairman of the Combat Sports Commission. The former role involves determining applications and disciplinary matters pursuant to the Liquor Control Act 1988, whilst the latter involves overseeing all combat sports in the state and ensuring compliance with the Act.

Rafferty cites his umpiring, solicitor and board roles as all requiring "the ability to make good decisions in situations where there are ramifications as to the decision that you make, to be mentally alert, to have an understanding of human nature and a good sense of humour."

WA women feature in first National Draft

ELEVEN WA women were selected in the inaugural AFL National Women's Draft last week to represent the Melbourne Football Club and Western Bulldogs at the MCG in June.

This ground breaking match will be the first time clubs have competed in an AFL sanctioned women's match, with the game to be held on Saturday June 29 as part of AFL women's round.

Showcasing the immense talent in Western Australia, nine women were drafted to the Demons and two to the Bulldogs. The third draft pick overall was Swan Districts midfielder Chelsea Randall, who will don the Melbourne colours.

Randall expressed her great honour in being selected to represent Melbourne in the first AFL women's match.

"This is truly a dream come true. I'm delighted to play for Melbourne, which is one of the most historic teams in football," she said.

"I play the game because I'm passionate about football. Being able to play and compete at this level is incredible. I hope this game is the start of a national competition that young women can aspire to be part of.

"I can't wait to get out on the MCG in a Demons guernsey and play some footy."

Michelle Cowan, the only woman assistant coach at a professional league level in WA, was selected to coach the Melbourne team. Cowan is the assistant coach with South Fremantle Football Club and believes this is a huge step forward in women's footy.

"I'm so thrilled to be a part of this and the support from the AFL, West Australian Football Commission and the state clubs. To put women's footy at a national level is incredible," Cowan said.

"The talent coming through women's footy is outstanding. I'm really excited to see what the future holds. It won't be long till we see a national competition."

WA Football Commission Director of Pathways and Competition, Grant Dorrington, said the national draft is a result of the huge investment by the WAFC, the AFL and clubs into women's football over the past 25 years.

"The national draft and upcoming match has been a long time coming. There will be a national women's competition in the future and I expect to see a WA team participating that will be very strong and competitive," he said.

The National Women's Draft attracted the cream of the crop from around Australia with over 320 nominations put forward and 50 players selected in total.

Fremantle CBC Integrated players take on Melbourne

IF you're heading to the West Coast-Richmond game in round 10, you'll be inspired by what happens on the oval before the main game.

Players from each of the WAAFL's Integrated teams will head to Patersons Stadium on Monday, 3 June and compete in a curtain-raiser to the AFL game.

Integrated Football, a program now in its fifth year, was born out of a desire to provide football opportunities to people with an intellectual disability.

Traditionally, they could only experience the game via

spectating and were never given the chance to play competitively. The WAAFL Integrated Football program has allowed them the opportunity to get on the other side of the white line and become football players.

One club involved in the WAAFL's program, Fremantle CBC Football Club, prides itself on giving their Integrated players an equal football experience.

The players are well and truly entrenched as part of the Fremantle CBC Football Club. Along with this equality, brings equal hopes and expectations.

They are expected to train hard, hope they win and expected to represent their club with appropriate conduct.

As players move through the stages of their football life, many strive to be selected in the highest level their capabilities and circumstances can take them. Integrated football players are no different. With this in mind, the Fremantle CBC FC decided a football trip to Melbourne would allow their Integrated players this same experience, and allow them to play "representative" football.

On July 10, Fremantle CBC's travelling party, inclusive of 26 Integrated players all of whom have an intellectual disability, will be taking the opportunity to represent their club on a football tour of Melbourne. The tour will incorporate all the typical aspects of a footy trip to the AFL Mecca of Australia, including watching AFL games at the MCG and Eithad Stadium, and tours of the MCG and other sporting icons of the city.

Most importantly, the tour includes two big games against two Melbourne based Integrated Football sides.

On Saturday July 13 the touring team play against Mazedon Panthers and following that, will take on the Willamstown Seagulls. The two games against the FIDA (Football Integration Development Association) players will be a huge challenge for the players.

The Integrated Football Program in Victoria is well established, with over 22 clubs involved in a program established more than 20 years ago.

The Victorian program is big enough to divide players into ability based divisions, where as the Integrated program in WA is in its infancy with players of all abilities play in the same side.

The touring team will be pitted against sides that are well trained and potentially much bigger players. Add the challenge of a bitterly cold Melbourne winter and the players will well and truly know what it's like play in tough, representative games of football.

The Fremantle CBC All Abilities Melbourne trip would not be possible without the support of generous sponsors and a load of fundraising effort. 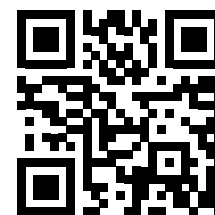
