Farewell to footy's loyal servant

Five decades of dedication to Australian Football will soon come to an end.

Grant Dorrington has been asscoaited with the great Australian game his entire adult life, serving as player, coach, selector, commentator and administrator.

But next month Dorrington will retire, leaving the sport in much better condition than when he started at East Perth in the 1960s.

Before he packed up his desk as the Competition and Pathways director at WA Football Commission, Ross Lewis put Dorrington in the hot seat one last time to get his reflections on the code in WA.

Why are you so passionate about football?

When you grow up in a family (literally from birth) that has a strong cultural connection to our great Aussie game and then you play, coach and move

into administration for over 30 years, it is part of your DNA.

The wonderful people, especially the passionate volunteers who you interact with along this footy life journey make it extra special. How can you not have passion when that's what the game is about?

Of which achievements in your roles are you most

Being part of various management teams that have dared to take on the challenges of CHANGE that, that at times, footy clubs at every level don't want. These changes have included the formation of an independent WA Football Commission, our two outstanding AFL clubs, the Football Development Trust, introduction of Peel Thunder and obtaining a football home for our game's financial engine.

Other highlights include building the best talent pathway system in the nation, and the "never say die" attitude of the WAFL in continually striving to make this wonderful competition have a quality place in today's football family. They are all changes that have made our State's football system the envy of our nation.

What have been some of your toughest decisions?

Implementing the need for CHANGE in sport overall and in particular football is always extremely difficult as the game's outstanding heritage over 127 years has built a club culture of don't change, stay as it is.

If there wasn't an independent WA Football Commission to make these changes for the future, our game would not be where it is today. Engaging all passionate WAFL club supporters to see that vision and be part of its exciting outcomes has seen many critics of the WAFC and me in my management roles. But I always have the belief that leadership is not about popularity.

Funniest characters to work/play alongside?

The beauty of our game is the many different people you come across. Club land is built upon the different characters that make a footy club. Every club has its own characters and hence stories. Some you can publish and some you can't.

There are so many great characters in my time that it would not do every one of them justice to mention just a few. But if I had to pick one standout the legendary JK Watts is most probably the funniest footy person I have come across. He has humour but never personally denigrates anyone.

He is a genuinely defined in footy as a "good bloke".



Best players you have seen?

How do you compare our game's earlier eras where players didn't have the dollars, training knowledge, full time commitment, today's sports science, video analysis and so on?

What I do know is that some of those earlier times champions Polly Farmer, Denis Marshall , Barry Cable, Stephen Michael, Bill Walker, Graham Moss, John Todd and many others, would still be first picked in any of today's AFL teams.

In the modern era players such as Adam Goodes, Wayne Carey, Darren Glass, Paul Kelly, Buddy Franklin and others are outstanding.

Our State has a record of producing many players of the highest levels of skill over countless years. Our WAFL pathway system will continue to do this in the future.

Is the game better now than when you started playing?

The game is different today than yesterday.

The game will always be better with the ever increasing technology, full time players/coaches, sports science and TV coverage. Life is about continual improvement so football must also be improving its product.

From time to time there will be rule amendments and with the number of full time media in the AFL, they will promote debate about every aspect of the game today.

That's great publicity.

In your time in football who have been the key figures that kept the game running on and off the field?

In approximately three decades of management there have been different key leaders for each of those eras, with each era having different challenges.

The Peter Tannock/Brian Cook and Jeff Ovens period was fundamental in saving the WAFL and the game from financial ruin. It obtained a footy home, Subiaco Oval with a 100-year lease, it established West Coast and then Fremantle, created the FDT, introduced Peel Thunder and overall got our game's future funding and structure in place.

The McKinnon/Fong, Bradshaw era reestablished the new position of the WAFL competition as our State's premier community competition. They were involved in building the integrated district footy model, investing strongly in game development, establishing the Hall of Fame and overseeing our game's participation growth from approximately 70,000 to 150,000 this year. This growth is again the biggest in the nation.

Biggest challenge ahead for WA football?

Without doubt the financial security of our game. This security is today underpinned by football's ownership of Patersons Stadium. It is the financial engine of the game in WA along with the two AFL clubs playing at our football home. Our game has a 100 year lease and therefore any new stadium cannot in any way compromise tomorrow's financial security. A new stadium is great but without our game's guaranteed financial benefits, better than what we have today, then the question our game's earlier leaders would ask is why move?

The current commission and football leaders have the challenge in front of them to obtain this financial security.

Can the WAFL thrive in the future? Was the alignment the best deal for the league?

The WAFL has been one of the great survival and ongoing growth stories of our game since the introduction of a national football competition. It has been the custodian of WA football from day one in 1885 when it was formed. In all that time it has never stopped moving with the modern changing world and hence today it is still our State's

peak community competition, as it was in its inception. It has continually strived to improve. In different eras different clubs have success which "triggers "all other clubs to catch them and in doing so the competition improves. Maintaining and continually building each club's district connections is pivotal as that's where tomorrow's WAFL followers live.

The partnering club concept to start in 2014 will only continue this constant desire to "be better "and in doing this, the WAFL's future is as exciting as any other part of our game in WA.

Any regrets?

I have no regrets only appreciation for this great Australian game. It is a national icon that displays all the characteristics of our country i.e. loyalty to your club, strive to reach the top, new multicultural family members welcome, recognition of our wonderful Aboriginal players and their culture, supporters thinking they are able to umpire better than the umpires, close relationships with your teammates, never give up attitude and many others.

When you have grown up in this unique footy culture how could you have any regrets? *Will you still go to the footy?*

Having grandchildren and most of my lifelong friends along with the quality footy people I have met and interacted with over my life journey, the game will never be far away from my daily life. I will still have my opinions about the game's future and will no doubt (perhaps under a pseudonym) continually challenge tomorrow's football leaders about our game in WA (and the nation).

To remain the best as we are today we must never become lazy in our ongoing need for change.

That's what today's world is all about.

An invitation for WAFL fans

I sometimes wonder how some WAFL items survive through the decades.

Books I can understand. They sit on a shelf and take up little room. And when people are finished with them, they usually pass them on to someone else.

Unfortunately, magazines (and Football Budgets) are kept less often. In fact, many of them are left at the ground, and many others are thrown out a few weeks later. Perhaps that's why it's so difficult to find anything before the mid-1950s.



But, what are the chances of an invitation surviving almost 100 years? Don't people throw those away once the event has been held?

Well, not all the time.

Last week, a 1922 invitation to Fremantle businessman Amos Staton to attend a complimentary dinner and social in honour of the visiting Fitzroy team found its way on to the market.

Strangely, it was sold in two halves. The front half sold at auction for \$57 and the back half for \$88.

I have an invitation to an un-named person to attend the 1927 West Perth annual general meeting. Has anyone got anything older? Or perhaps just as interesting?

First, and perhaps most importantly, a sale price completely floored me. While sale prices are occasionally so high or so low that I find them surprising, it's extremely rare that my pre-auction estimate isn't even in the ballpark.

When Budget reader Steve contacted me a few weeks back to ask my advice on selling a set of 1971 Mobil cards (glued in the album) and an original 1961 Swan Districts premiership team photograph, I wasn't hugely excited about the prospects for either item.

I didn't give him an estimate on the 1961 photo, but I was thinking in the range of \$50-\$150. It also had a bit of a stain on it, so I expected it to sell for something near the lower end of that range.

Well, somehow, the photograph ended up selling for \$1003 at auction. That is, simply put, an amazing price. WAFL club photographs have not been great sellers in the past. I remember a 1905 West Perth premiership photograph selling for \$50 a few years back and a 1941 Claremont photograph has done the rounds at \$165 recently without any bites.

It just goes to show how willing some buyers are to pay well over the odds to secure the item they really want.

One item I was able to more accurately price was a 1924 Perth membership badge, which went to auction last weekend. The final price of \$212.50 was only slightly more than my estimate of \$200.

An undated Old Easts badge sold for the disappointing price of \$12 at auction, while a single lot of four South Fremantle membership badges (1986, 1987, 1988 and 1994) sold for











programme from the game between Collingwood and South Fremantle, played in Melbourne in 1954, sold for \$72. Finally for this week, I have the usual requests and some more thanks to give.

First, I'd like to thank collector Gary, who called me after reading about my request for information about a Jim Beam decanter from 1977, which recently sold for \$56 at auction.

Bearing a Tiger's head and a football, I had never been sure whether these well-known decanters related to Claremont or Richmond. Well, it turned out to be neither.

It was actually made for the Balmain Tigers rugby league team and another, in the same series, was made for a New Zealand team and featured a magpie.

I guess I won't have either of those on my WAFL collectables website in future.

Meanwhile, I have had some more luck with my request for information about the membership badges and cards for the WAFL clubs

My aim is to produce a list that details what the clubs produced each year.

I now have a good idea on where to find the Claremont information thanks to John, who emailed last week. But I could still do with some help for East Perth, Swans and West Perth. Does anyone have a big pile of badges from those clubs, which they might photograph?

And, finally, I'm still chasing a single West Perth glass to finish my collection of 1982 WAFL glasses, if anyone can help?

East Fremantle will want to regain its place in the top four while Peel can continue its challenge for a finals berth in what looms as an intriguing contest at the port.


The Sharks are licking some deep wounds following the shock loss to South Fremantle in the derby and confront a Thunder lineup buoyed by a string of solid performances before their bye.



Zanich said the accountability of umpires had certainly increased recently with umpire coaches being able to analyse all the skills and performances via modern technology.

fundamental movement skills

The WA Football Commission and West Perth Football District will launch a new program on June 11 using football to build fundamental movement skills in children aged 18 months to 4.5 years.

Football is an Australian way of life, a lifestyle for many parents and a sense of joy for children growing up in local back yards across Perth.

Footy Fundamentals will trial as a 4 week program at Arena Joondalup on Monday 11 June for three age groups, 8 months-2.5 years, 2.5 years – 3.5 years and 3.5 – 4.5 years where kids can progress on to the hugely popular Auskick model.

The program will be run on the football oval and within the West Perth Football Club change rooms.

"This is an exciting concept for football," said West Perth Emerging Markets Officer Scott Minchin.

"We have developed a program with the aid of local educators and physical education specialists that aims to prepare our kids for the

"Fundamental Movement Skills are patterns of movement that involve different body parts such as the legs, arms, trunk and head and include skills such as running, hopping, catching, throwing, striking and balancing. These skills are the foundation movements to more specialised, complex skills used in kids games, sports, dance and every day activities."

The program will emphasise fun in a structured environment that involves the parents utilising balls and football games to aid the child's development. During the period from 15 months to 3 years old, a child develops physical capabilities which progress from being able to "toddle" around unsteadily - having only recently taken first steps into confident mastery of a broad range of complex child development physical skills, such as throwing, catching, running, balancing and kicking.

The program is open to both boys and girls with only 45 places are available - 15 in each age group class. The program will expand into a 7 week program in term 3.
